The total increase in taxes cannot exceed ten per cent for the State, for the county, for any special tax district. A separate blank must be filled out for each separate piece of real property. The Supervisor must require that full answer be made to every question. If you cannot answer any question with absolute accuracy, give the answer that represents your best judgment as an estimate. The Board of Appraisers will not be bound by your answer as to the actual value of the property. Your answer should represent your best judgment of the value. The assessment will represent the best judgment of the County Board of Appraisers, which may be higher or lower than yours.
