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TANGIBLE AND INTANGIBLE PERSONAL PROPERTY

The discrimination against personal property, tangible and intangible, has been removed by the valuation of real property at its full cash value, and the tax rates to be paid this year, on real and personal property, under this revaluation, will be but a small fraction of the rates heretofore paid. A specific exemption of \$300.00 has been provided upon the certain items of personal property of most general ownership, set out in Questions 19 to 40 in this questionnaire. Cotton, tobacco, and other farm products held temporarily for market, or in the hands of original producers, may be listed under head of solvent credits, and any debts owing deducted fro their value, so that the State has provided every reason why the taxpayer should make a full and free disclosure of all his personal property, including solvent credits of all kinds, and has placed in the hands of the Supervisors adequate machinery to require that this shall be done, and to acquire the information if he has reason to believe that a full disclosure has not been made.
