

# A Sentleman's Journey

February 17, 1917-May 25, 2004

Ernest Samuel Ramsey began his life on February 17, 1917 in Chatham County, NC, as the youngest of six children of Richard Ramsey and Addie Fikes Ramsey.

He joined Mt. Sinai at an early age and remained a faithful and active member until his health failed.

He graduated from Pittsboro Colored High School in Chatham County on May 12, 1936 under Principal B.J. Lee. He received his Bachelor of Science Degree from North Carolina College for Negroes in Durham, NC on the fourth of June, 1940. He later received his Master of Arts from North Carolina College at Durham on June 5, 1956. He received a Certificate of Administration and supervision from the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, NC.

He began his professional career as a history teacher at Chatham High School in Siler City, NC. He became the principal of Chatham High in 1959 and remained in this position until his retirement in 1982. During that 42 years he strived to cultivate the lives of all his children.

Ernest was joined in Holy Matrimony to Salome Marsh on June 6, 1948.

He leaves to cherish his memories: his wife, Salome; children, Helen B. Brooks (Vernon), Ferne R. Alston, Ernest R. Ramsey of Pittsboro, NC, Kathy J. Ramsey of Cary and Lorrie R.
