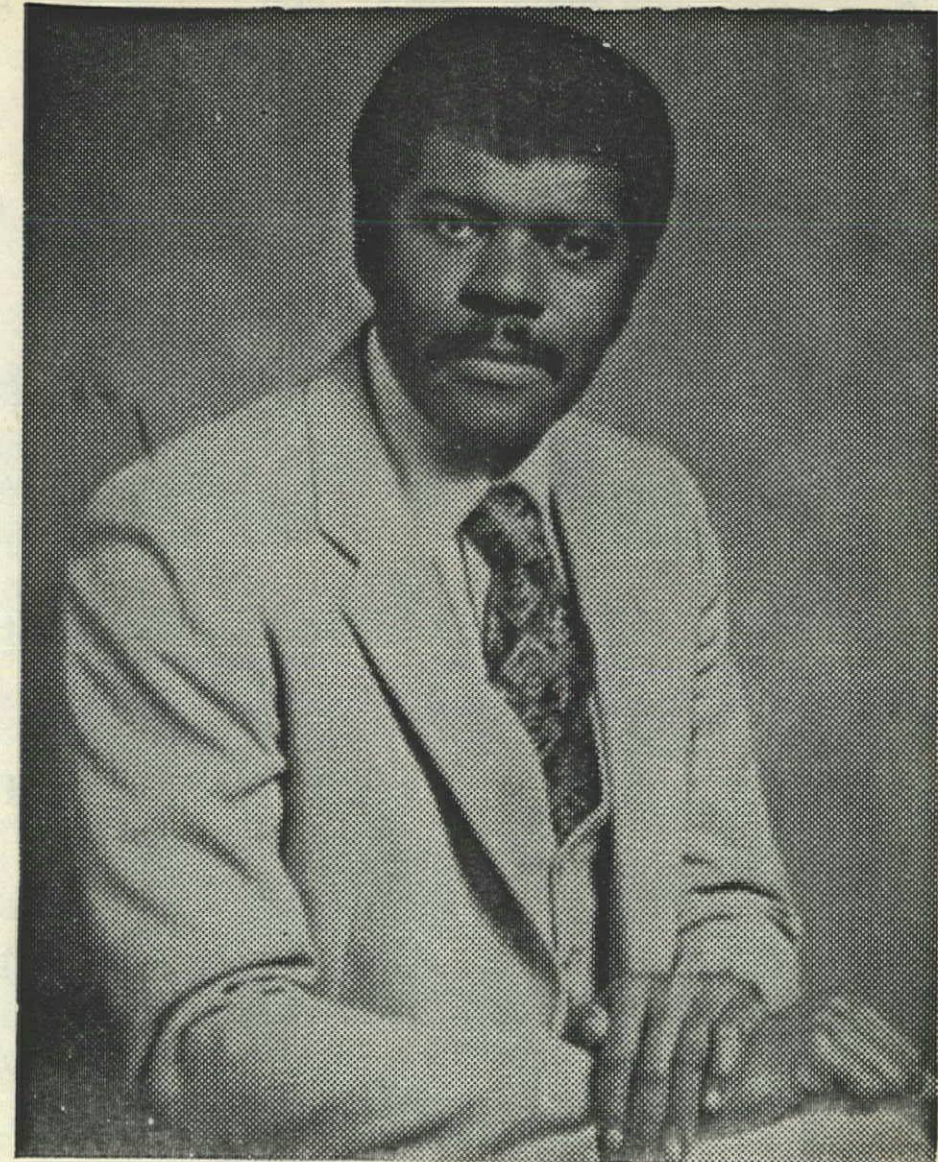

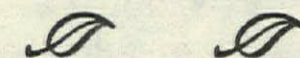

Obituary



DR. LARRY FULLER PAIGE, area educator and civic activist, died suddenly November 3, 1986, following a cardiac arrest at his home. He was forty-three.

A resident of Temple Hills, Md. Dr. Paige was the principal of Garrison Elementary School at the time of his death.

A graduate of North Carolina Central University. Dr. Paige has a MA Degree and PHD Degree from Michigan State University. He has attended Edward Waters College, Howard University, and Northern Illinois University.

Dr. Paige's initial career interest was to become a medical doctor, prompting him to complete the free-medical undergraduate curriculum. In pursuit of this goal, he held numerous medical positions: Doctor's Assistant, Research Assist in Micro-Biology, and Research Biologist.

Dr. Paige has held teaching and administrative positions in the public schools of Michigan and the District of Columbia. He was the First Principal of Friendship Educational Center. He taught at Michigan State University and held positions at the Urban Adult Education Institute of the Detroit Board of Education, the Michigan Department of Elementary Science Project, and Howard University 1963-1967.

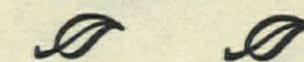
Active for several years in the international struggle for Religious Liberty Worldwide, Dr. Paige was secretary-treasurer of the World Council on Religious Liberty, a position held since September, 1985.

He has published widely, as a contributor to the Physical Science Study Guide, published by Little, Brown and Company, and the Physical Sciences published by Van Nostran and Co. (revision of Gray's and Coat Book with his brother, Dr. Joseph C. Paige).

Dr. Paige was a member of the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, the Urban League, NAACP, National Association of Elementary School Principals, and the National Association of Secondary School Principals. He was a member of Phi Delta Kappa and Maryland Notary.

Survivors, in addition to his two children, Tonya and Anthony, are: two sisters: Christine Ray, Southfield, Michigan, Shirley Kearney, Greensboro, N.C.; six brothers: Dr. Joseph C. Paige, Raleigh, N.C., Otha and Henry Paige, Boston, Mass., Harold, Graphel, Bennie Jr., and Alcane, Siler City, N.C.; a host of aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
