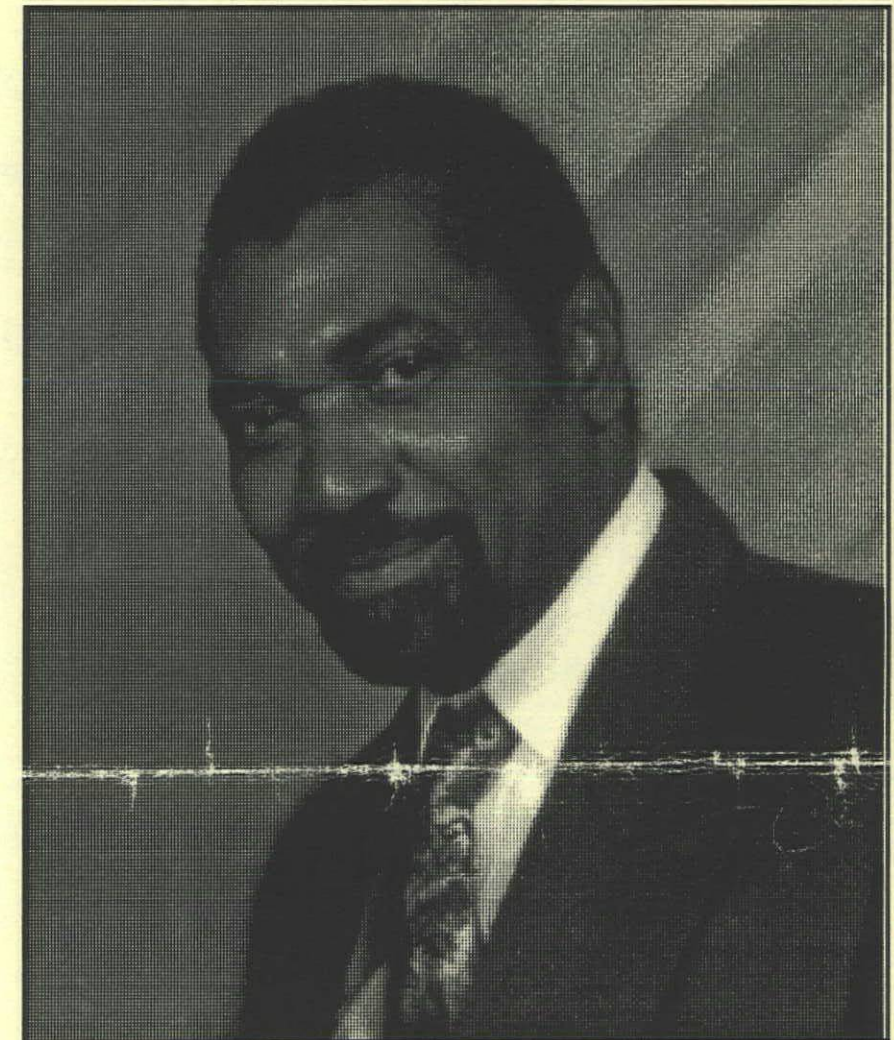
We Have Lost Someone Very Special
