

Obituary

GARLAND KEARNEY, son of the late Robert Kearney and Lucy Hicks Kearney, was born on August 21, 1934 in Raleigh, North Carolina. He was one of 14 children.

He departed this life in the Hospice Unit at Moses Cone Memorial Hospital, Greensboro, North Carolina early Sunday morning, August 4, 1996 at about 1:00 a.m., after a courageous battle with cancer.

He attended the Raleigh Public Schools. He also attended Wayne Community College and Federal City College, Washington, DC. He moved to New York City at an early age and was employed by the New York City Board of Education, where he worked for 15 years.

Garland married Shirley Jean Paige of Siler City on April 20, 1957 in Corona, Long Island, New York. He was a loving and caring husband, and made friends easily. People loved and respected him.

He, his wife, Shirley, and sister-in-law, Christine Raye, moved to Detroit, Michigan in 1968, and all became staff counselors at the Urban Adult Education Institute (UAEI), a special federally-funded project of the Detroit Board of Education, the Michigan Department of Education, and Wayne State University, founded and directed by Dr. Joseph C. Paige, his brother-in-law. He also worked at the General Motors Technical Center in Warren, Michigan.

Garland lived in Silver Spring, Maryland after moving from Detroit, and worked with the Washington Metropolitan Transit Authority. He returned to North Carolina in 1977, relocating to Greensboro. He was employed by Precision Fabric Group, Inc. (formerly Burlington Industries) until his retirement in November 1995.

He joined Oberlin Baptist Church, Raleigh, at an early age. Upon relocating to New York, he joined First Baptist Church, Corona, Long Island. He shared a great love for Shiloh Baptist Church, Greensboro, and the pastor, Dr. Gregory T. Headen. A major wish prior to his illness was to become associated with that church. His dying wish was to thank Pastor Headen and the Shiloh family for receiving him as a member during his last days.

He leaves to mourn: his loving wife, Shirley; two sisters, Ms. Mable Oakley of Garner, and Ms. Rebekka K. Warren of Raleigh; five brothers, Claude T., Howard L., and Franklin of Raleigh, Hubert of Portsmouth, VA, and Furman of Altadena, CA; one aunt, Ms. Francis Banks of Springfield, MA; five sisters-in -law, eight brothers-in-law, many loving nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
