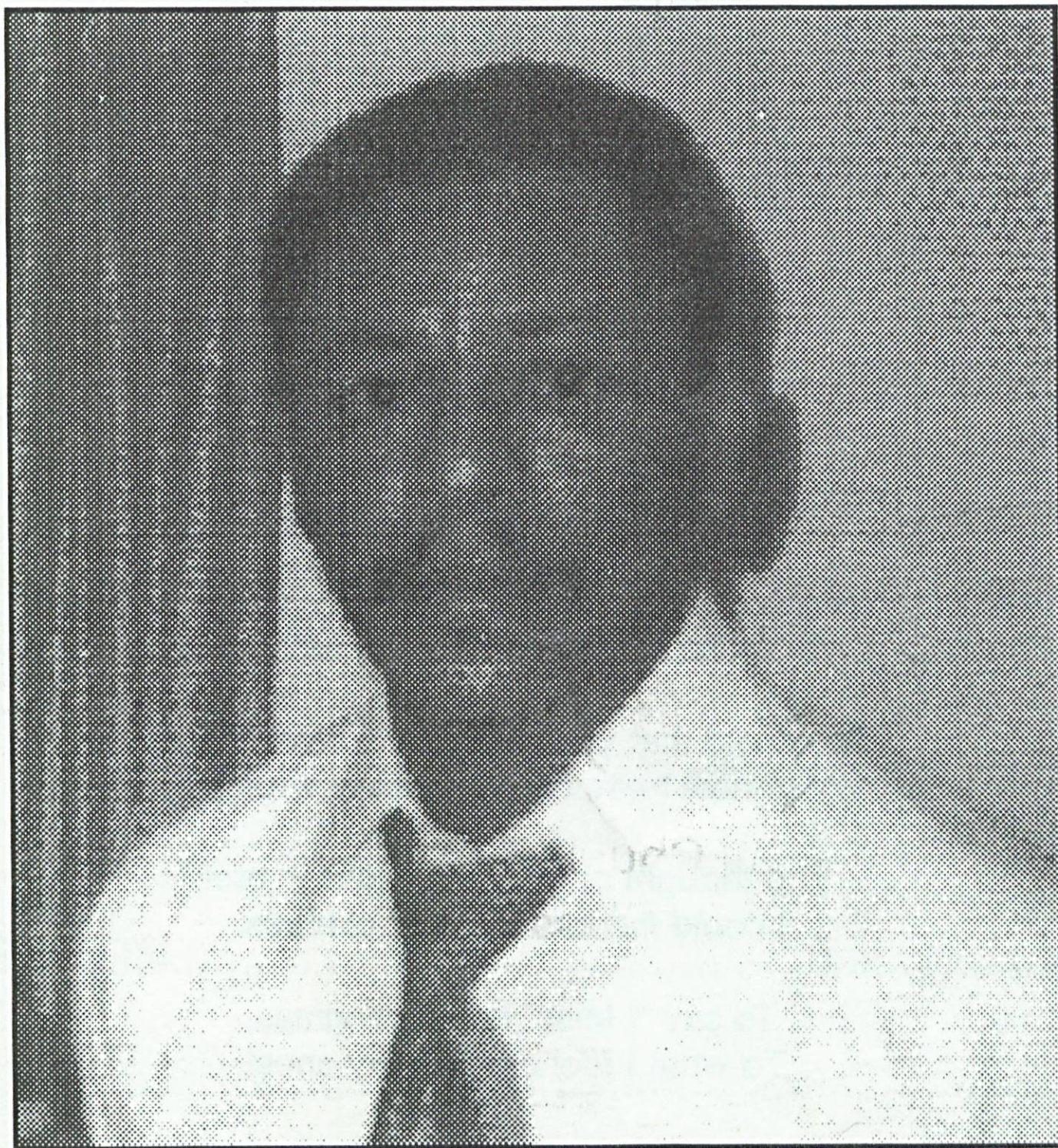

And when I can't I will to be.

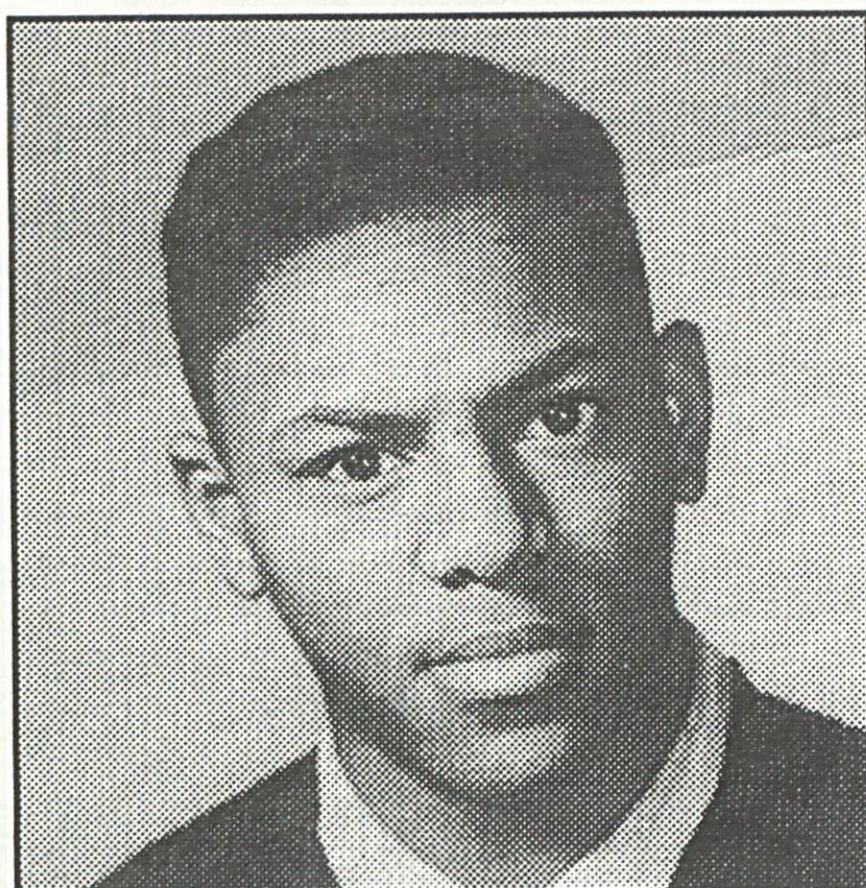
It was you who said Equal, men should be,
