



















Reflections of Life

As God in his infinite wisdom so preciously grants us the privilege of awakening to the beauty of a new day, so it was for our dear brother on the morning of Friday, March 30, 2007. He was always energetically and actively engaged in meaningful activities and projects. There was a purpose and a plan for each and every day of his life.

As dusk began to fall, His Heavenly Father summoned him home from his faithful labor to his reward. Mr. Alexander Graves, Jr. of 409 East Eleventh Street, Siler City, NC was born May 13, 1925 to the late Alexander and Bessie Graves of Waterbury, Connecticut.

He received his elementary and high school education in Waterbury graduating from Leavenworth High School in 1942. He later enrolled at N. C. A & T State University in Greensboro, North Carolina.

He was drafted and served two and a half years in the United States Army from 1943-1946. Upon his honorable discharge, he again enrolled at N. C. A & T State University. While a student there, he met and married the love of his life, the former Madeline Spruill of Creswell, North Carolina on December 18, 1948. They were blessed with a 58-year marriage. Born to Alexander were three sons, Dr. Alan Craig Graves; Larrie Jones and Alexander Graves, III who preceded him in death.

He received a B. S. degree in engineering and certification to teach mathematics and physics in 1950 and received his M. S. degree from N. C. A & T State University in 1958.

He taught in the Greene County Training School from 1950-1952 in Snow Hill, NC and at Washington High School from 1952-1957 in Shelby, NC.

In 1957, he and his family moved to Siler City, NC where he taught at Chatham High School until 1969. He served as assistant principal at Jordan-Matthews High School from 1969-1984 and retired in 1984 after 34 years of dedicated service.

His record of service as a statesman, scholar and humanitarian has provided immeasurable benefits to our church and community. He is a member of Corinth A. M. E. Zion Church where he served on the Senior Usher Board, Trustee Board, past Superintendent of the Sunday School and presently Superintendent Emeritus, past church secretary, and past chairman of the Finance Committee of the Durham District of the Central N. C. Conference.

He is past president of the Chatham County Schools Retired School Personnel, past Basileus of Tau Omega Chapter of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc. in Greensboro, NC, past potentate of El Jebel Temple # 97, Burlington, NC and past Commander-in-Chief of the James T. Diggs Consistory No. 308 in Burlington, NC; a thirty-third degree mason and past Master and secretary of the Light of the World Lodge # 711, Siler City, NC. He served 20 years as Grand Knight Director of the NC Council of the Knights of Pythagoras and Deputy Supreme Knight from 1995-2001.

He was past Scout Master from Troop 172 in Siler City from 1962-82, youth director of the American Legion Moffitt-Poole Post #277, Siler City, NC and youth director of the El Jebel Temple #97 Drill Team. He has served as past chairman of the Chatham County American Heart Association and has served on the following boards: Chatham County Education Foundation, Chatham County Hospice, Professional Development School in Chapel Hill, NC; and past member of the Chatham County Economic Development Commission.

Over the years he has served in many civic organizations: the Siler City Recreation Board, 1966; the Planning Board/Zoning Board, 1970; Siler City ABC Board, 1982-1988; Siler City Commissioner, 1988-2003; the Planter's National Bank Board; and as assistant coach in football, basketball, and baseball.

Brother Graves has received numerous honors and awards during his lifetime and is listed in Community Service of North Carolina, International Who's Who in Community Service, 1974, and Notable Americans of the Bi-Centennial Era, 1976.

Lovingly and faithfully, he leaves to cherish his memory, his wife, Madeline Spruill Graves; a son and daughter-in-law, Dr. Alan Craig Graves (Christina) Lanham, MD; two sons (Larrie Jones and Alexander Graves, III who preceded him in death); grandchildren, Edward R. Milliken, Jr., Raleigh, NC; Troy Johnson, Hartford, CT; Monica Jones, Waterbury, CT.; Larry "Scottie" Jones, Hawaii; Erika Graves, Alysha Graves, and Brianna Graves, Lanham, MD; Antoine Gordon, Bowie, MD; one sister and brother, Lucille Sanders Moore and Fletcher Graves, both of Waterbury, CT., who preceded him in death; a daughter, Ella Milliken, Siler City, NC and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, relatives, and friends.
