

In the Wisdom and Providence of God, the Angel of Death came early Tuesday morning, October 22, 2002 and led Benjamin to God's Kingdom. Mr. Benjamin Franklin Haynes, son of the late Jasper and Annie Haynes, was born March 23, 1921 in Whiteville, North Carolina.

Benjamin joined the Mt. Olive Missionary Baptist Church at a very young age. He later served as Superintendent of Sunday School, senior choir member and in other auxiliaries as needed. He graduated from Mt. Olive High School as valedictorian of his class, and on October 24, 1943, he entered the active service of the United States Army during World War II, serving until December 15, 1945. He served in both Europe and the Pacific, earning numerous awards and accolades.

For thirty-five years, he was employed as a foreman at the Chadbourn Veneering Company and later at the Whiteville Supply Company, retiring in 1985. Ben was also an avid self-employed farmer.

After the death of his loving wife of forty-five years, Fannie Peacock Haynes, in 1992, he was taken to Connecticut, where he continued to receive convalescent care at Brookview Convalescent Healthcare Facility in West Hartford, CT. Upon arrival in Connecticut, he was embraced by the church family of his daughter, Revonnie, at Metropolitan AME Zion in Hartford, as an honorary member. With this special recognition, he also received prayer and the sacrament of Holy Communion regularly by the church's Ministerial Staff. The joy of his life was his family, which extended, not only from his immediate family, but also to his other relatives, church community, and friends.

He leaves memories in the hearts of those whose lives he touched: his three devoted children, Mr. Jasper L. Haynes (Mallie) of Charlottesville, VA, Ms. Revonnie Haynes and Mrs. Ravonnie Kitt (Doniel) both of Bloomfield, CT; sister, Gladys Mew of St. Albans, NY.



Two sisters-in-law, Melba Haynes and Addie Haynes of Whiteville, NC; one grandson, Jonathan; four granddaughters, Tracy, Taneshia, Jennifer and Brittany; and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, other relatives and friends.

The life of a loved one cannot be summarized simply in an obituary, for we must tell their story each day. So it was with Benjamin Franklin Haynes, the compassionate family man who, though quiet, had a great sense of humor and a perpetual smile on his face. The will of God has been ordered. We humbly submit to His will.
