hakespeare lives in North Carolina through the splendid work of the North Carolina Shakespeare Festival. To celebrate the Festival's 1987 season and the beginning of its second decade of great performances, NCSF has prepared an exciting series of programs titled, EXPERIENCING SHAKESPEARE. Overall, the purpose of the programs is to enhance your appreciation and understanding of the world and works of William Shakespeare and the NCSF plays. Individually, each program is designed to serve your level of interest and schedule.



This seminar program is a continuation of last year's highly successful program titled, SHAKESPEARE: THE LUNATIC, THE LOVER, THE POET AND THE PLAY. In this program you will examine the historical and cultural context in which Shakespeare wrote and gain a deeper appreciation of Elizabethan history and drama. Also, you will study the background and various interpretations of A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM, one of Shakespeare's most joyous comedies and a feature production in the Festival's 1987 Summer Season.

The seminars will be conducted by outstanding Shakespeare scholars and will be hosted at twelve public libraries throughout our state. The seminar consists of three two-hour sessions (one session per week for three consecutive weeks) plus a trip to High Point to see A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM at the beautiful and modern High Point Theatre, Saturday, August 1, at 2:00 pm. And because you will be attending the play as part of a group, you will receive a special group discount on your NCSF theatre ticket—only \$12.00 instead of the regular price of \$15.00.

The ENJOYING SHAKESPEARE seminars will be conducted during the month of July, but your registration must be postmarked no later than June 5, 1987 to take advantage of this special opportunity.

II. Elizabeth's Bard

Dr. David Bradshaw, Professor of English at Warren Wilson College, will share his renowned expertise as an Elizabethan scholar during this special two-day weekend seminar. The program will examine Shakespeare's plays and theatre within the social, political, philosophical, religious and artistic context of Queen Elizabeth's England.

Highlights of the seminar will be attendance at NCSF's productions of RICHARD II and A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM plus a dinner featuring Elizabethan fare.

The program will take place on Saturday and Sunday, August 15 and 16 at the new Radisson Hotel located in downtown High Point just around the corner from the High Point Theatre.

Total cost for the two-day program includes overnight accommodations at the Radisson Hotel (based on double occupancy), tickets to two NCSF productions (at special group rates), meals (lunch, dinner, and Sunday brunch) and materials. Cost for single participants is \$150.00—couples \$250.00 with overnight lodging. If you are interested in commuting, the cost is \$115.00/person and \$215.00/couple. Accommodations are available for Friday, August 14 for an additional \$38.00 (includes tax)/room. ALL REGISTRATIONS FOR THIS PROGRAM MUST BE POSTMARKED NO LATER THAN FRIDAY, JULY 24.

III. Pre Views and After Words

Throughout the 1987 season pre- and post-show discussions will be held at all NCSF performances. PRE VIEWS will be held one hour before curtain time and will provide background on the production to be seen. AFTER WORDS will be held immediately after the final curtain of each performance and will allow participants to meet directly with members of the cast. Sessions will be conducted in the theatre by scholars and/or actor-teachers. The sessions are free of charge to patrons attending that day's production.
