For many years there had been a growing demand for a list of the principal officials who had served Harnstt County since its formation in 1855, and none had been available.

In the hope of supplying this void, the writer has through the years accumulated all the facts obtainable about the men and women who have filled the office of sheriff, clerk superior court, register of deeds, and members of the House of Representatives and the Sanate in the North Carolina General Assembly, since the creation of the County until the present.

In some of the offices, the exact years of service by the officer could not be found in the records in the courthouse for the reason that the courthouse was twice destroyed by fire and all records therein were burned in the offices of the clerk of superior court and register of deeds, except for a very small number of the books in the register of deeds' office which were saved, at the risk of his life, by Mr. H. T. Spears who was at that time the register of deeds. These two fires occurred on the mornings of October 15, 1892 and January 9, 1894, making it all but impossible to give accurate and correct account of the years of service by the said officials prior to these dates.

Many of the descendants and relatives of former officials were interviewed who graciously furnished such information as they had and were happy to give all assistance possible. Many older persons have likewise furnished information from their acquaintance with several of the former officials. A few letters and personal memoranda of some of the former officials were found which gave light to many of the dates, and from tombstones and markers in the Greenwood Cemetery at Dunn and the Summerville Cemetery at Lillington and from the family burial grounds other dates appeared.

And particularly helpful to the writer were the writings and notes of Mr. Allen M. Shaw, a former register of deeds, and of Mr. D. P. McDonald, a former county auditor, who through the years between about 1918 and 1930 had jotted down much information with a few dates which gave leads to the years of service by some of the officials in the 1860's, 1870's and 1880's which, except for such information, this almost perfect

list of the persons who filled the said offices, could not have been written. Both these fine gentlemen and former leaders of their day in the County passed on many years ago and their contribution is at this date irreplaceable.

The writer is under obligation especially to Mr. J. H. Withers, Jr., and his dister, Mrs. Jean-Withers Eipkin and benchusband E. J. Pipkin, the som, daughter and som-in-law of Dr. J. H.
