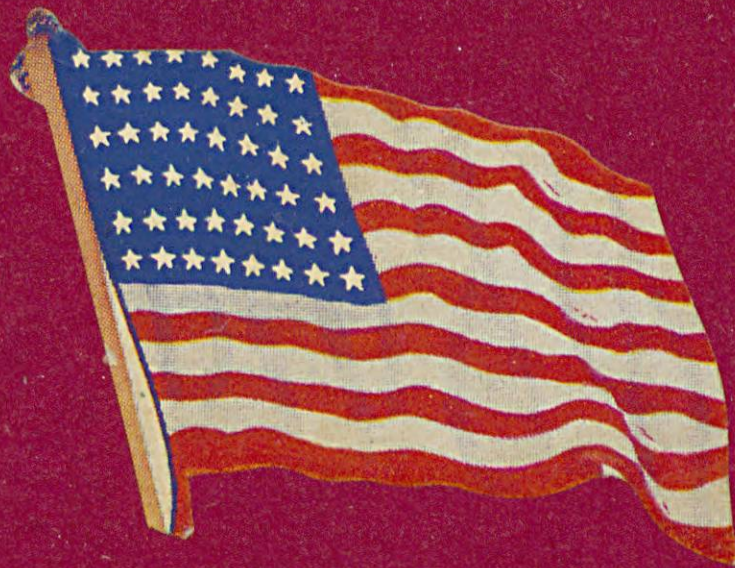

# CONSTITUTION

## Article I

The name of this club shall be Woman's Club.

## Article II

The objectives of this club shall be to carry on a program of diversified interests embracing the departments of literature, art, civics, music, welfare and gardens, designed to culminate in projects for our own satisfaction and for the good of the community.

## Article III

Membership in this club shall be composed of active members only. Each member shall pay such dues as are prescribed in the by-laws.

The membership of this club shall consist of the charter members in addition to:

1. Names submitted by membership committee at a regular meeting.
2. Prospective member approved and voted into club by members present.
3. Prospective member notified by corresponding secretary and invited to

become a regular member.

## Article IV

The officers of this club shall be a president, vice-president, recording secretary, corresponding secretary and treasurer. All Officers shall present yearly reports of work at the annual business meeting.

Committees shall be appointed by president as the necessity for them arises.

## Article V

The order of business shall be as follows:

### ORDER OF BUSINESS

1. Call to order - Club please come to order
2. Federation Hymn
3. Collect (Standing)
4. Roll Call - Secretaries will please call roll.
5. Secretary's report - You will please listen to the reading of the minutes of the last meeting.
  1. Additions.
  2. Corrections, approval of minutes.



6. Unfinished Business - Report of Officers
7. Old Business - Report of Committees.
8. New Business
9. Program
10. Adjournment - motion seconded -  
It has been moved and seconded to adjourn. All in favor, say Aye. Opposed, No. The Ayes have it; the motion is carried and the meeting stands adjourned.

#### Article VI

The dues shall be 50 cents annually, payable to the treasurer at the first regular meeting in the fall.

#### Article VII

The club shall meet each month on Wednesday after the Third Sunday at 3:00 P. M.

#### Article VIII

This constitution may be amended at any time by a two-thirds vote of the members present. Notice of amendments must be given at a preceding meeting.

#### Article IX

All officers shall be elected for a period of one year. Election to take

place in January.

All vacancies occurring during the year shall be filled by vote of the members upon report from nominating committee.

### BY-LAWS

1. The president of this club shall preside at all its meetings. She shall appoint all members of standing committees and such special committees and temporary committees as may be necessary.

2. The vice-president shall perform the duties of the president in her absence. It shall also be her duty to see that the program each month is complete with speakers.

3. The recording secretary shall keep the minutes of all the regular meetings and all the call meetings. She shall prepare the year book and have it printed as soon as possible after the program committee has submitted the program for the year.

4. The Treasurer shall collect



and hold all dues and moneys belonging to the club. She shall make an annual report of money received and disbursed.

5. The corresponding secretary shall conduct the general correspondence of the club.

6. The ways and means committee chairman shall prepare a budget for each year, providing, approximately, for the expenses of the club. This budget shall be submitted when the treasurer gives her annual report.

7. A member will be dropped from the roll if she fails to send a reasonable excuse to the Hostess for three consecutive meetings.

8. If it is impossible for a member to appear on the program as scheduled she must secure a substitute.

9. The hostess each month shall be chosen in the alphabetical order of the roll.
