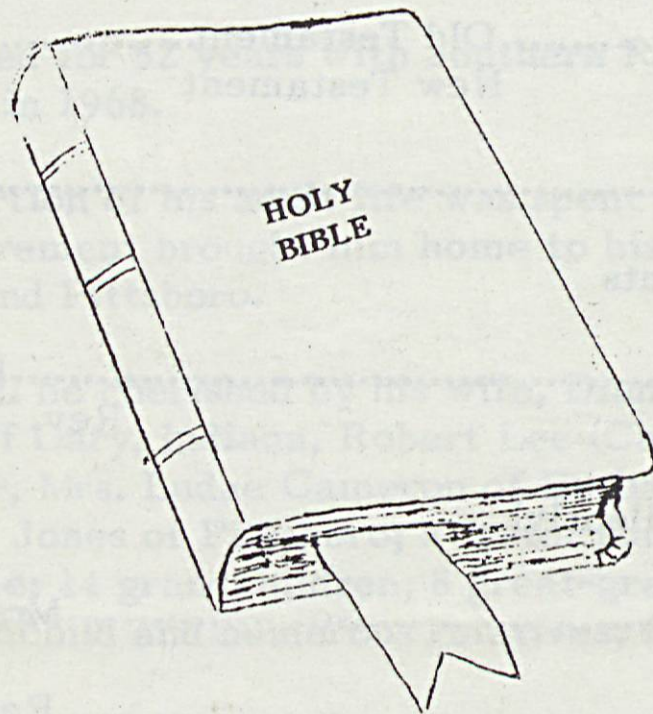

At 11:40 A. M. Thursday, October 11, 1989, the Farrar family was deeply saddened when its oldest member, Henry, was called to his final rest.
