

A Celebration of Life

In life every now and then, if we are lucky, we meet special people or individuals who make us think broader, climb higher, and reach farther. Alease Burnette was such a person. Alease, the twelfth child of the late Abraham and Wescott Burnette, was born on November 17, 1917 in Chatham County. She was educated in Chatham and Orange County public schools.

"A," as she was affectionately called, established a relationship with Christ early in life, becoming a member of Hamlet Chapel C.M.E. Church. Her Christian and personal lives intertwined when she was joined in holy matrimony on October 20, 1937 to Ezekiel Isaiah Burnette. To this union, two daughters, Annie and Barbara, were born.

"A"'s family life enhanced her Christian stewardship as she continued to serve faithfully in her church. She was a dutiful church worker, serving unstintingly as President of the Willing Workers Club and a member of the Usher Board. She was the life and breath of the Stewardess Board, serving as President for seventeen consecutive years. Her fellow church members were accustomed to seeing her in place and working for the Lord until her health declined. Still, her thoughts turned frequently to the church, to her love of God, and to thoughts of her fellow Christians.
