

To express his love for his family and friends, Mr. Richardson requested that Mrs. Bartavia Richardson sing "Through It All".



According to God's plan and with unexpected swiftness, Mr. Henry Auburn Richardson silently closed the door of life and entered into the promised land of joy, peace and love on Friday, January 3, 1992 at his residence.

Seventy-nine years ago on June 25, 1912, the late Mr. Henry London Richardson and Mrs. Jeanette French Richardson were blessed with the birth of a loving son. He was nurtured and raised in Pittsboro and was a graduate of Dudley High School, Greensboro, North Carolina.

After finishing high school, he became a proud soldier in the U.S. Army and served in World War II. When the war was over, he returned to the community to explore his talents in brick masonry and carpentry. It was during this time that he met Ernestine Leak who late became his wife for 37 years. God filled this union with five devoted, loving children.

Even as a child, his parents insisted regularly Sunday School and Church attendance. This trend continued as he became a life-long dutiful member of St. Matthews, serving on the Trustee Board, Sunday School Teacher, Leader of Class Leaders and Treasurer for over 35 years.
