



Clifton Isaiah Stone was born in Chatham County North Carolina on February 6, 1927 to the late Mrs. Lucy Stone McKinney and departed this earthly scene on June 25, 2007 at his residence. He confessed Christ as his Saviour at Holland's Chapel A.M.E.Z. Church in his youth. He was preceded in death by three sisters: Ms. Phyllis McKinney, Mrs. Mozelle Wilson, and Reverend Laura Council.


His educational background includes graduating with honors from Horton High School, Pittsboro, NC, class of 1943. Following graduation he joined the U.S. Army in June 14, 1945 and served until November 8, 1946, with an honorable discharge. Clifton also graduated from Banneker Radio Institute, Inc, of Durham, December 17, 1948, a graduate of Union Christian Bible Institute, Durham, NC and Attended Livingstone College, Salisbury, NC and received a Certificate in Religion Education, in 1951. He did further studies at the Twentieth Century Bible Institute of New York.

His work history began at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, NC in the School of Pharmacy as a stock room manager, for 43+ years, worked part-time as a waiter at the Rathskeller for approximately 40 years.

In 1968, he became the President of the Interdenominational Usher's Association of NC, where he served in that capacity for over 30 years.
