The Obituary

Mansel Philip McCleave, son of the late Reverend (Dr) Allen F. and Annie Lewis McCleave was born August 7, 1926 in Rock Hill, South Carolina. He departed this life on November 25, 2010.

In 1927, he moved with his family to Liberty, North Carolina where his father became the pastor of the Edwards Grove Missionary Baptist church. Dr. McCleave professed hope in Christ and was saved in 1933 at the age of seven at Edwards Grove Missionary Baptist Church, Liberty, North Carolina. He chose to unite with the St. John Missionary Baptist church in Climax, North Carolina where his father was also the pastor. Later when his family moved to Siler City in 1936, he united with the First Missionary Baptist Church where his membership remained until he departed this life. After evading it for years, it was not until the year of 1956 while lying in the Moses Cone Hospital in Greensboro, North Carolina with a 50/50 chance to live that Mansel Philip McCleave surrendered and obeyed the call of God to the gospel ministry at the age of 29.

Dr. McCleave was a Preacher of the Gospel, an outstanding leader and spokesperson, an educator, a businessman, a writer (four publications), a mentor and a friend to many people. He made many unselfish contributions to humanity and leaves behind a vast legacy of achievements and accomplishments.

Mansel Philip McCleave's adult lifetime was spent in persecute and involvement in religious, educational, civic, business, community affairs, and publications.

He received his high school education in the public schools of Chatham County. He graduated from Chatham County Training School, Siler City, North Carolina. At the age of 16 year old, he enrolled at Hampton Institute, Hampton, Virginia. His college days at Hampton Institute were cut short at just one year due to the World War II Armed Forces Draft. He received an Honorable Discharge after a two-year tour of duty. He earned a Bachelor of Science Degree and Masters of Science Degree from North Carolina A & T State University, Greensboro, North Carolina. He was an Instructor of Plant Sciences at North Carolina A & T State University, Greensboro, North Carolina for 34 years teaching both Graduate and Undergraduate classes in Horticulture, Botany, Landscape Design and Greenhouse Management and was the Editor of the Department of Plant Science and Technology Newsletter. Further studies at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, Chapel Hill, North Carolina; North Carolina State University, Raleigh, North Carolina; and Special Summer Program Studies at Cornell University, Ithaca, New York. He was awarded the Doctor of Divinity (h) Degree from Friendship College, Rock Hill, South Carolina; Doctor of Humane Letters from Apex School of Theology, Durham, North Carolina

Dr. McCleave was former Pastor and Pastor Emeritus of Edwards Grove Missionary Baptist Church, Liberty, North Carolina after three tenures (totaling 30 years), Pastor and Pastor Emeritus of First Missionary Baptist Church, Siler City, North Carolina after three tenures (totaling 18 years). He was affiliated with over 20 organizations. He was Vice Chairman of the Council of Churches of Siler City and Vicinity; member of the Apex School of Theology Board of Trustees; past Moderator of the Deep River Missionary Baptist Association; Vice President and Instructor of the Interdenominational Bible Institute, Siler City, North Carolina; Chancellor of the Robert A. Siler Interdenominational Bible Institute, Siler City, North Carolina; Instructor for Shaw Divinity Extension Courses; Historian of the Deep River Missionary Baptist Association of North Carolina; past member, General Board of the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina; North Carolina Educational Association, International Black Writers Conference; National Society of Minority Writers and Artists; past member, Institutional Representative for Boy Scouts of America; President of the Liberty Ministerial Association; past member, Executive Board Chairman of Liberty Community Redevelopment Corporation; past member, West Chatham Ministers Association, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) – just to name a few.

Most importantly, Dr. McCleave was a man of God, an inspiration to all age groups and out of all his contributions and accomplishments, his main focus was to preach the word of God and to win souls to Christ.

He leaves to mourn his nephews, Charles A. (Suzette) Brown of Atlanta, Georgia, and Victor M. (Tahiera) Brown of Birmingham, Alabama; as well as many grand nieces and nephews and great grand nieces and nephews.

He was predeceased by his elder sister, Wilma Loree McCleave Brown; his younger sister, Lilly Bell; and his elder brother, Allen Lewis McCleave.
