




From The President

Why Opera?

An editor knows good copy when he sees it, and the following - to a musician's ears - is good copy. It comes via Joe Queenan, writing in the April 1994 issue of GQ. Bravo, Joe! You wrote a mouth full. - ed.

Mostly what I like about opera is that it is an art form that still has standards, something that is no longer true of painting, sculpture, architecture or modern music. Unlike jazz vocalists, who can camouflage a shipwrecked voice with clever phrasing or a battalion of resourceful accompanists, opera singers have to be able to hit the notes. When they do not hit the notes, they get booed lustily. Even Pavarotti.

People who do not like opera do not like it because they think it's weird.


I am prepared to argue that opera is the


strangest activity of which human beings are capable, far more bizarre than stuffing ferrets down one's pants or marrying Don Johnson twice. But that's what makes the opera work: the fact that you, the listener, often cannot believe what you are hearing.


I am entertained when Mick Jagger sings "Brown Sugar" or "Satisfaction," but there is nothing in his delivery that astonishes me in any way. I am perhaps more in awe when I listen to Aretha or Sinatra or, for that matter, Elvis. But there's very little that they do with their voices that leaves me shaking my head, wondering "Where did that come from?"

The way I see it, Mick Jagger is like Whitey Ford, while Aretha, Frank and Elvis are like Seaver. Pavarotti, Callas and Caruso are like Koufax.







Three years later the deserted Butterfly sits in the living room of her house, asking Suzuki how many pennies are left them. Full of faith that Pinkerton will return, Butterfly tries to convince her maid in the opera's most well known aria, "One Fine Day." She is visited by Sharpless who tries vainly to persuade her to accept a wealthy suitor, Yamodori. The consul starts to read her the Lieutenant's letter. When she tells him she has borne Pinkerton a child, he cannot bear to tell her that Pinkerton has married again, and leaves. A cannon in the harbor announces the return of Pinkerton's ship and Butterfly and Suzuki adorn the house with flowers preparing to watch for his coming at the window.

The sun rises on the same scene where **Butterfly** is sleeplessly awaiting **Pinkerton**. She takes the child away to rest. The fickle Lieutenant arrives with his wife to take the child; he is full of remorse at Butterfly's faithfulness. With great anguish **Butterfly** bids her child farewell and takes her life with her father's sacramental sword.


Gina's advice to students:

THE MAGIC FLUTE

For all its richness and profundity, "The Magic Flute" is based on a very simple fairy-tale plot. Tamino, a young prince, sets out to rescue the young princess Pamina and to win her hand. Pamina is the daughter of Astrafiammante, the Queen of the Night, and has been abducted by Sarastro, the High Priest of a mysterious Brotherhood and the archenemy of her mother. In the first scene, Tamino is sent on his quest by Astrafiammante and her three Ladies. who have rescued him from a terrible monster. Papageno, a simple birdcatcher, goes along as his companion. The Ladies give them musical instruments to protect them--a magic flute for Tamino and magic chimes for Papageno; they also appoint three Spirits as guides and advisors.

Tamino and Pamina find each other, of course, and all ends happily-but not until something very surprising has happened. In the finale to the first act, both Tamino and Pamina experience an awakening with the realization that what they have been told by Astrafiammante about Sarastro's wickedness is all lies, and that Sarastro is devoted to the pursuit of a higher Truth. They, too, determine on seeking admittance to Sarastro's Brotherhood, and in the second act undergo a series of trials to test their constancy and courage. It is only when they accept the possibility of death as the outcome of their quest that they can join together to face the final ordeals by fire and by water. Emerging triumphant, they are admitted to the innermost temple of the Order, where they will reign together in Sarastro's stead.

Papageno also undergoes a series of trials, so that he may win the girl of his dreams, Papagena. He, however, is quite unheroic, and lacks more than the normal share of courage, or the ability to be silent. What he does have in abundance, though, is love and compassion, and these qualities see him through to a happy ending.

CAVELLERIA RUSTICANA

Soon after dawn a small Sicilian village comes to life as a cheerful crowd of villagers prepare for Easter mass. The young peasant, Santuzza, enters to ask the aged innkeeper, Lucia, for news of her son, the girl's former lover, Turridu. Alfio now enters singing of his beloved horses and his new wife, Lola. Turridu has been seen near the house. After the Easter hymn, Santuzza confesses to Lucia that Turridu has deserted her for Lola, whom he loved in his youth. Forbidden to enter the church with her friends, Santuzza accosts the returning Turridu and detains him while Lola minces in singing her famous ditty, throwing him a flower. Santuzza vainly begs Turridu to return: he hurls her to the ground and goes to join Lola.

After the Intermezzo the congregation assembles in the square and Turridu leads them in a toast to Lola. The infuriated Santuzza breaks in and challenges Turridu to fight him with daggers. The crowd disperses, leaving Turridu alone with his mother, Lucia, to whom he bids farewell and asks her to protect Santuzza should he be slain. Turridu runs off the stage to fight Alfio. A distant murmur is heard outside and a woman runs on stage with the news, "Neighbor Turridu has been

killed."

GIANNI SCHICCHI The grasping relatives of the wealthy Buoso Donati gather at his deathbed in 13th century Florence to mourn his loss and investigate his bequests. Young Rinuncio finds the will and exacts a promise from his aunt to let him marry his beloved Lauretta if there is money enough left to them. The will is read and Donati has left his money to the church. The relatives now weep in earnest. Rinuncio suggests that Lauretta's father, Gianni Schicchi, can help them get the will changed. Lauretta and Schicchi arrive and Gianni agrees to impersonate Donati and rewrite his will. The body of **Donati** is removed from the bed and **Dr**. Spinellocio, not knowing his patient is dead, arrives. Schicchi simulates the voice of the dead man and convinces the doctor that he should come back later. Then Schicchi puts on Donati's night cap and gown and sends for the notary to dictate a new will. The relatives beg and bribe Schicchi to leave them Donati's property, but when the notary arrives Schicchi dictates most of the property to himself. No sooner is the notary out of the house than the relatives begin to pillage all the property they can carry. The lovers are happy as Schicchi has provided them with a dowry. As the curtain falls Schicchi asks the audience to render a verdict of "Not Guilty."



Ralph has fallen in love with Josephine, the daughter of his commanding officer, Captain Corcoran. Likewise, Little Buttercup, a buxom peddler-woman, has fallen in love with the Captain himself. Class pride, however, stands in the way. The Captain has, in fact, been arranging a marriage between his daughter and Sir Joseph Porter, First Lord of the Admiralty, who is of the social class above even the Corcorans.

Act I. The sailors are preparing the ship for inspection. The atmosphere is marred only by Little Buttercup's hints of a dark secret, by the grumbling of Dick Deadeye, and by the love-lorn plaints of Ralph and Josephine. Sir Joseph appears attended by a trail of ladies (his relatives, who always follow him wherever he goes). Josephine finds him insufferable, and when Ralph again pleads his suit and finally threatens suicide, she agrees to elope.

Act II. The Captain is in despair at the demoralization of his crew and the coldness of his daughter towards Sir Joseph. Little Buttercup tries to comfort him, but Sir Joseph soon appears and tells the Captain that Josephine has thoroughly discouraged him and he wishes to call the match off. The Captain urges him to assure her that inequality of social rank should not be a barrier. This Sir Joseph does, not realizing that his words are as applicable to Josephine in relation to Ralph as they are to himself and Josephine.

Meanwhile, Dick Deadeye informs the Captain of the planned elopement of his daughter with Ralph. The Captain thereupon intercepts the elopers, so incensed that he cries "Damme!" Sir Joseph overhears him and sends him to his cabin in disgrace. When Sir Joseph learns from Ralph that Josephine too was eloping, he angrily orders Ralph put in irons.

Little Buttercup now comes out with her secret, solving the whole difficulty: she confesses that many years ago, as a nurse, she got Ralph and the Captain mixed up; so Ralph really should be the Captain and vice versa. The sudden reversal permits Josephine to marry Ralph, and her father to marry Buttercup. Sir Joseph resigns himslef to marrying his cousin, Hebe.

BREVARD INTERMISSION

Did you hear the one about the travelling hautbois player?

What's the difference between an oboe (originally in French, hauthois) and an onion? Nobody cries when you chop up an oboe.

While you might laugh at that one, you would have to be a musician (an oboist, or perhaps know an oboist personally) to fully appreciate the overtones and subtleties of orchestral one-liners. It's a kind of "in" humor that pre-supposes a little knowledge of the subject matter. It also requires a musician's sense of humor, which can be downright off the wall at times.

Musicians seem to take a perverse pleasure in their humor... and many of the jokes they tell are on themselves.

What's the difference between a viola and a violin? The violin burns longer (a violist told me that one). Viola jokes have been the rage lately, even showing up in Internet rooms.

How do you know if the viola section is at the door? No one knows when to come in.

What's the difference between a trampoline and a viola? You take off your shoes before jumping on a trampoline.

Brevard trombones are a special breed, and they know more slushpump funnies than anyone. What's the range of a trombone? About thirty feet if the wind's at your back.

What do you do with an unconscious trombonist? Put him on the third part: nobody will notice.

What's the difference between a dead trombonist in the road and a dead country singer in the road? The country singer may have been on the way to a gig.

After a while, a pattern emerges. But remember, it's all in fun and no single instrument is immune. Consider the following sampler.

How many lead trumpet players does it take to change a light bulb? 51. One to change the light bulb and fifty to stand around saying, "I can do it better... and higher!"

How do you get two piccolos to play

in unison? Shoot one.

How can you tell if there's a drummer at your door? The knocking keeps speeding up.

What's the difference between a french horn and a lawnmower? You can tune a lawnmower.

What's the difference between a clarinet and a lawnmower? Vibrato.

What did the bassoonist get on his IO test? Drool.



Then there are the hapless saxophonists. Everyone tees off on them... even W. C. Fields. "I sold my saxophone and bought a cow," he once said. "They both make the same noise, but the cow gives milk."

What's 500 saxophonists at the bottom of Lake Michigan? A good start.

What is the definition of a true gentleman? A man who owns a saxophone but refrains from playing it.

Sax jokes go on forever. They even get sick. There was once a young second trombone who knew six sick sax jokes and could tell them six times, fast.

Then there are the singers. Instrumentalists have teed off on the divas and bassos forever, it seems.

What do you call someone who hangs around a bunch of musicians? A singer.

Sopranos are particularly vulnerable, given their "diva" reputation.

How many sopranos does it take to change a light bulb? Only one. She hangs on to the bulb, and the world

revolves around her.

What's the difference between a pit bull and a soprano? The pit bull doesn't normally wear lipstick. (I have known at least two sopranos who didn't wear lipstick; both had spiked collars.)

What's the difference between a soprano and the PLO? You might be able to negotiate with the PLO.

What is a jailhouse soprano? She's behind a few bars and has lost the key.

But the last word, as every musician knows, is had by the conductor. Perhaps that's why baton humor seems slightly vicious.

Why are conductors' hearts in so much demand for transplants? They've had so little use.

If you drop a conductor and a watermelon off a tall building, which will hit the ground first? Who cares?

Musician calls the symphony office to speak with the conductor. Is told he is dead. Calls back 25 times. Receptionist says, "Why do you keep calling? He's dead, for pity's sake!" The reply: "I just like to hear you say it."

Then there's the one about the violist who comes home late at night to discover fire trucks, police cars and a smoking crater where his house used to be. The chief of police comes over. "While you were out, the conductor came to your house, killed your family, and burned your house down." The violist replies, "You're kidding! The conductor came to my house?!"

Like I said, they're endless. As long as there are musicians, they will tell musical jokes... and usually on themselves.






