

1936 - 1981

Educational institutions often define their mission as a Search for Excellence. The Brevard Music Center began its quest forty-five years ago.

The Center was born in 1936, the idea having been conceived seven years earlier by James Christian Pfohl, who inaugurated the plan for a summer music camp while he was Director of Music at Davidson College. At the outset, Transylvania Music Camp was known as the Davidson College Music Camp for Boys, and was held on the campus of the North Carolina college. During World War II, the camp became coeducational and was operated for a time on the campus of Queens College in Charlotte, North Carolina.

The present site was selected after the war, and the Transylvania Music Camp evolved as a business enterprise controlled by a corporation of four men. Later it became a non-profit educational institution under the guidance of a Board of Trustees, and was chartered by the State of North Carolina. Thus, Brevard Music Center came into existence.

Like most other institutions, the Music Center has grown in many new areas, developed innovative programs and techniques, and built a constituency and a reputation. It has matured as an honored and effective instrument in the young musician's quest to "dream the impossible dream."

Over forty years of continuous promotion of the artist, and

constant encouragement and guidance of artistic talent give the Brevard Music Center justifiable satisfaction.

Thousands of young musicians have received an indispensable part of their training at the Center. For many other students, music has become an important part of their lives as an avocation. And hundreds of thousands have enjoyed the music-making as audiences.

The Search for Excellence cannot be compromised. There is no "passing grade of 70" in a musical performance since the other thirty percent which is incorrect will in fact make the composition quite different or even unrecognizable. The Brevard Music Center continues to fulfill basic needs: the needs for artists to express themselves, and the need for all humanity to find fulfillment through the creation and re-creation of man's highest dreams as expressed in music.







After forty years of achievement the Brevard Music Center is into its fifth decade with "Great Expectations." HENRY JANIEC, Artistic Director

Henry Janiec, Artistic Director of the Brevard Music Center since December of 1964, has served through the years as principal conductor of the Brevard Music Center Orchestra and the Opera Workshop, and has done "guest" appearances with all of the other performing groups of the Center.

In addition to his duties as Artistic Director in which he is charged with the direction of the educational and performance programs of the Center, he also serves as principal administrative officer of the institution.

A native of New Jersey and trained at the Oberlin Conservatory, Janiec joined the faculty of the School of Music at Converse College in 1952, and was appointed Dean in 1967.

Janiec has been principal conductor or music director of the Spartanburg Symphony Orchestra, the Charlotte Symphony, the Charlotte Opera Association, the Converse College Opera Workshop, and a number of community theatre groups, chamber orchestras, and school groups. For eight years he was principal opera conductor at the famed Chautauqua Institution, and for three years conducted the Chautauqua Student Symphony in national broadcasts. For two years he studied and conducted at Tanglewood.

Janiec has had wide experience as pianist, accompanist, and guest 000

conductor. In his work with young musicians, he has conducted All-State orchestras in most of the southeastern states. He has also worked as performer, commentator, and writer on radio and television, including the national radio series Music From Brevard, Voice of America, Radio Free Europe, and other network and local shows.



Janiec is a member of Pi Kappa Lambda, national patron of Delta Omicron, life member of the National Federation of Music Clubs, and holds membership in many professional societies in music. He has served on the South Carolina Arts Commission, its Music Advisory Panel, and the South Carolina Arts Foundation. In 1969, he received the honorary degree of Doctor of Humane Letters from Wofford College, and in 1971 a Presidential Citation from the National Federation of Music Clubs. He has been Program Director of the Music Foundation of Spartanburg since 1967 and has been honored by many groups for his activities as a musician and teacher.

TO OUR AUDIENCES

Dr. Lewis Thomas, President of the Sloan-Kettering Cancer Center, and winner of the National Book Award for his collection of essays, *The Lives of a Cell* (The Viking Press), said in one of those essays (*The Music of THIS Sphere*), "The need to make music, and to listen to it, is universally expressed by human beings. I cannot imagine, even in our most primitive times, the emergence of talented painters to make cave-paintings without there having been, near at hand, equally creative people making song. It is, like speech, a dominant aspect of human biology." In another essay, he suggests that our first communication with some other solar system, light years away, should be to send the music of Bach. "We would be bragging, of course, but it is surely excusable for us to put the best possible face on at the beginning of such an acquaintance."

Music is a universal means of inspirational communication with you and with others everywhere.

Training in the disciplines of music and performance is an intense striving for a degree of perfection. It's team-work, making a stageful of instruments sound a unified voice. It's probing for fundamentals, seeking and finding or measuring real values (and not just the prices of things). Composer-in-Residence Program

ROBERT WARD Composer-In-Residence, 1981

America's Pulitzer Prize-winning composer, Dr. Robert Ward, has received international acclaim from both critics and the public. Also renowned as a Conductor and Music Educator, he currently holds the post of Composer-in-Residence at Duke University.

A native of Cleveland, Ohio, Dr. Ward graduated from the Eastman School of Music where he majored in Composition under Bernard Rogers and Howard Hanson. He attended the Juilliard Graduate School, studying composition with Frederick Jacobi and conducting with Albert Stoessel and Edgar Schenkman. During this period, he also worked under Aaron Copland at the Berkshire Music Center.

Dr. Ward has served on the faculty of many educational institutions, including Queens College, Columbia University, Juilliard School of Music, and as President of the North Carolina School of the Arts in Winston-Salem. He has held three Guggenheim Fellowships and a grant from the American Academy of Arts and Letters. Dr. Ward has also had broad experience in the publishing business, serving as Executive Vice President and Managing Editor of Galaxy Music Corporation and Highgate Press.

As guest conductor, Dr. Ward has appeared with many leading orchestras and opera companies, and has written commissioned works for numerous musical organizations throughout the United States and abroad. His opera "The Crucible" won him both the Pulitzer Prize and the Music Critics of New York Citation. He is currently working on an opera titled "Abelard and Heloise" for the Charlotte Opera Association. A working preview presentation of the opera is planned by BMC for this season.

Many of Dr. Ward's compositions will be heard during this summer's concerts, presented by the Center's orchestras and other BMC performing organizations. His talent, knowledge and wit can also be enjoyed in his presentation of a series of three lectures: What's New in Musical Theater; Claude Debussy, Rebel! and Does Musical Theory Improve Musical Performance? These lectures are open to the public without admission charge.

Dr. Ward is the fourth Composer-In-Residence at the Music Center, under a program supported by Mu Phi Epsilon. Previous composers are Elie Siegmeister, Ulysses Kay, and Leo Smit. The Center is indeed pleased and most privileged to have Dr. Robert Ward as Composer-In-Residence for the 1981 Season.



The Gina Bachauer Artist Chair

The Brevard Music Center has hosted scores of the world's greatest artists. Many of them have made a special mark on the institution and its students through their sincere concern for the education of music's coming generations. No artist had these qualities in fuller measure than the great Greek pianist, Gina Bachauer.

Gina Bachauer appeared at the Brevard Music Center soon after her arrival in this country and returned regularly through the years. Her performances were always inspired and consummate. Eager to perform with and for Brevard's "children," she would seek out ways to help them, counsel them, teach them. Perhaps the greatest lesson she taught, though she would have been the last person to admit it, was the true humility and generosity which must always accompany great artistry.

Soon after her sudden and untimely passing, Gina Bachauer was memorialized around the world by her thousands of friends and admirers. One of her closest personal friends, Mrs. Carlo Renzulli, better known to many of us as "Josie," envisioned such a memorial at Brevard Music Center. Mrs. Renzulli, currently a trustee of the Center, was in fact introduced to Brevard by Gina Bachauer and her devoted husband, Conductor Alec Sherman. It was soon decided that a particularly fitting tribute would be through a program which would directly benefit "the children" of the Music Center, and in 1980 the Gina Bachauer Artist Chair was established.

The Gina Bachauer Artist Chair is a restricted endowment fund, the earnings of which will permit the Music Center to invite internationally noted musicians to extend their stay at Brevard as guest artists, and conduct seminars and master classes for the enrolled students of the Center.

The official ceremonies establishing the Gina Bachauer Artist Chair were held at the Music Center July 13, 1980. Mr. Alec Sherman, Mr. and Mrs. Carlo Renzulli, and many distinguished friends and admirers participated, including the great Czech pianist, Rudolf Firkusny, who contributed his services as guest artist, in memory of his friend and fellow artist. The Music Center is most grateful to the renowned Spanish pianist, Alicia de Larrocha, who will be guest artist for the second Gina Bachauer Memorial Concert, Sunday, August 2, 1981, at 3:00 P.M.

The Endowment Fund for the Gina Bachauer Artist Chair has received numerous gifts, but the goal of at least \$100,000.00 has not yet been attained. The Music Center would indeed be grateful for your interest and participation in the support of this important program.



The first artists sponsored by the Gina Bachauer Artist Chair, to be in residence during the 1981 Season, will be Charles Rex, Associate Concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic Orchestra, and his brother, Christopher Rex, Principal Cellist of the Atlanta Symphony (July 11-14). Both of these artists are alumni of BMC. Theirs will be followed by a residency of the New York Philharmonic Brass Quintet (July 20-24).

ROGER BRUNYATE is a native of Northern Ireland and has been a permanent resident of the U.S. since 1978. He studied at Trinity College in England and did doctoral studies at the University of Texas. He is currently Artistic Director of the Opera Programs at Peabody Conservatory of Baltimore, Maryland. Mr. Brunyate has worked with the Edinburgh and Glyndebourne Festivals as well as taught at a number of institutions. He returns to the Music Center as a faculty member and stage director for two of the Opera Workshop productions.

JAMIE HAFNER is a native of Brunswick, Georgia, and did his undergraduate and graduate studies at the University of Cincinnati. Following a stint with the West Point Band, he directed bands in Georgia and is presently on the faculty of the University of Toledo where he directs the band. At Brevard, Mr. Hafner directs the Symphonic Band and serves as principal tubist with the Music Center Orchestra.







JOHN RICHARDS McCRAE has been producer-director of the Music Center's Opera Workshop since its founding in 1965. A native of South Carolina, he received his training at the University of South Carolina, the Institute of Musical Art, and the Juilliard Graduate School in New York. During his singing career, he appeared with many national companies. Since 1952, he has been Professor of Voice and founding director of the Opera Workshop at Converse College's School of Music. He was General Director of the Charlotte Opera Company for many years and guest director with numerous other companies.





DOUGLAS MEYER received training in orchestral conducting at the Mozarteum in Salzburg, the Musik Akademie der Stadt Basel in Switzerland and the College-Conservatory of Music in Cincinnati. where he earned his doctorate in orchestra and opera conducting. At Cincinnati, he was Assistant Conductor and taught in the conducting department, and served as Conductor-in-Residence at Arizona Western College. In 1975, Dr. Meyer was appointed Orchestra Conductor at Luther College where he presently conducts the Symphony Orchestra, the Chamber Orchestra, opera and oratorio productions. He is a frequent clinician and guest conductor at orchestra festivals throughout the Midwest. Dr. Meyer joins the Music Center as Conductor of the Youth Orchestra.

JACKSON PARKHURST, a native of Clemson, South Carolina, joins the Music Center as conductor of the Transylvania Symphony Orchestra and Coordinator of Educational Programs. He attended Duke University and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and received his master's degree in Orchestral Conducting in 1974 from the Manhattan School of Music in New York, where he studied with George Schick and Anton Coppola. In addition to conducting orchestra, Mr. Parkhurst is also an accomplished conductor of opera threater. In 1976, he founded the Brevard Chamber Orchestra and was its music director until 1980. At present, he is Assistant Conductor of the North Carolina Symphony and its Director of Education.

WILLIAM PHARRIS is a native of Columbus, Georgia and received his formal training at Florida State University. He has done graduate work at Auburn University and Columbus College. Mr. Pharris has taught in Alabama and Georgia schools, and in 1980 was appointed band director at the Hardaway High School in Columbus, Georgia, which continues to produce the top-notch bands that have been a tradition. He has served as adjudicator and clinician at contests and festivals in the Southest, and is a member of numerous professional organizations. At Brevard, Mr. Pharris is conductor of the Transylvania Wind Ensemble and Coordinator of the Teacher-Aide Program.

THE AUGUSTA BALLET, founded in 1962, has been guided by Mr. Ron Colton, Artistic Director since 1964. Colton, formerly with the New York City Ballet, has developed a truly fine ballet company of excellence and professionalism. The staff includes Zanne Beaufort and Ron Jones, Associate Directors and principal dancers. Audiences have responded with standing ovations to the company's combination of outstanding programming and dazzling performances. Director Colton currently serves on the advisory panel of the National Endowment for the Arts, the Performing Arts Panel of the Georgia Council for the Arts and Humanities, and was the 1980 recipient of the Governor's award in the Performing Arts.









MICHAEL SCHWARTZKOPF completed his undergraduate and master's programs at Indiana University, and is presently a D.M.A. Candidate in Choral Conducting at the University of Iowa where he also conducts the University of Iowa Singers. Mr. Schwartzkopf has had wide experience as conductor, choral clinician and adjudicator in the South and Midwest. He has sung tenor roles in musical productions, and has performed in the opera chorus at Indiana University, the Washington Opera Society, among others. He was Associate Instructor in the Graduate School at Indiana University where he taught conducting and assisted with the Chamber Singers and Women's Chorus. This year, Mr. Schwartzkopf becomes Director of Choral Activities at the Music Center.

WARD WOODBURY serves as conductor and chorus master for the Brevard Opera Workshop in addition to other special performances with orchestras at the Center. His formal musical training was done at Western State College of Colorado and the Eastman School of Music. Dr. Woodbury has wide experience as a conductor of choral, operatic, and symphonic music and is active in numerous regional and national professional organizations. In addition to his teaching at Rollins College, he is also conductor of the famed Bach Festival in Winter Park, Florida.

THE ROMEROS, Angel, Pepe and Celin, have enthralled audiences and won critical acclaim for their deft and masterly playing of the guitar. The brothers have performed as soloists, in duo concerts and, with their father, as the internationally celebrated Romero Quartet, also known as "The Royal Family" of the guitar. The Romeros have appeared with leading symphony orchestras, and have collaborated, in concert, with many eminent conductors. They were acclaimed in Spain long before their arrival in America from Malaga in 1959. All have recorded extensively the Classical, Spanish Romantic and other virtuoso works for the guitar.

PERRY DANIELS, a Brevard alumnus, has been a performer and teacher at the Music Center since 1966. He received his doctorate from the University of Michigan and has taught at a number of institutions. He has had wide experience in oratoria, opera and concert, and sang with the Amato Opera Theatre in New York and the Civic Opera in Dubuque, Iowa. He is presently on the faculty at Converse College where he also conducts the Spartanburg Symphony Chorus.

MAUREEN FORRESTER, the foremost contralto of the present day and a Metropolitan Opera star, has been heard by audiences on five continents and as distinguished soloist with virtually every major orchestra in the world. Equally renowned for her operatic and recital appearances, she sings numerous recitals throughout the United States and Canada each year to standing ovations. Brevard is honored to have Miss Forrester perform with the BMC Orchestra.

JANICE HARSANYI, soprano, in her varied and distinguished career as a singer of recital, oratorio, opera, and 20th Century music, has performed throughout the United States and Europe. Acclaimed unanimously by the public and the press, Mrs. Harsanyi has sung with many of this country's leading orchestras, and has performed at major festivals in the U.S. She has introduced and premiered many works of contemporary composers, including Babbitt, Krenek and Sessions, among others. In addition to her performance commitments, Mrs. Harsanyi is Professor and Coordinator of Voice at Florida State University, Tallahasee, Florida.













ALICIA DE LARROCHA embarked on a career, after her public debut in 1929, which has become in recent years one of fanatical devotion from concertgoers throughout the world, and uncommon praise from press, public and colleagues. She gives yearly recitals on the Great Performer Series at Lincoln Center, Kennedy Center in Washington, D.C., and appears regularly with major orchestras in their series and during summer festivals. Madame de Larrocha is one of the world's most recorded artists and has received prestigious awards for her many exclusive recordings. Further honors during her golden anniversary in 1979 included the designation as "Musician of the Year" from Musical America. Brevard welcomes this incomparable pianist after too long an absence!

ROSS MAGOULAS is a native of South Carolina and received his formal musical training at Converse College and Florida State University. He has been delighting Brevard audiences with his comic artistry and protrayals since 1966, during which time he has also served as voice teacher and registrar for the Music Center. Since 1956, Magoulas has taught voice at Berry College and has directed the Concert Choir and the Berry Singers.

INGE MANSKI-LUNDEEN returns for her second year as a member of the Artist-Faculty at the Music Center. An internationally acclaimed soprano, she was a member of the Metropolitan Opera in New York City for a number of years. Her mother, Dorothy Manski was also a noted singer with the Met. In more recent years, Mrs. Lundeen has been one of the most sought-after teachers in the greater Atlanta area and presently teaches voice and directs the opera workshop at West Georgia College in Carrollton. She will make her Brevard "debut" in the production of "Fiddler on the Roof."

ROBERT McDONALD, native of Council Bluffs, Iowa, graduated from Lawrence University, magna cum laude, and continued his piano studies at the Curtis Institute of Music with Rudolf Serkin, Seymour Lipkin and Mieczyslaw Horszowski. He holds a master's degree from the Juilliard School where he was a scholarship student of Beveridge Webster. Mr. McDonald earned many honors in competitions, including the National Federation of Music Clubs' "Young Artist Award." He was top prize winner in the 1980 University of Maryland International Piano Competition, and recently appeared as soloist with major orchestras. Mr. McDonald has served on the staff of the Curtis Institute and is currently a teaching fellow at the Juilliard School.

WILLIAM McDONALD returns as a member of the Artist-Faculty and leading tenor at the Music Center. Born and trained in this country, his magnificent tenor voice has been heard in numerous opera houses and concert halls around the world. A member of the New York City Opera and a recent affiliate artist with the Houston Opera Company, he has appeared with many noted artists in live performances and on national ETV. A versatile singer, his roles have encompassed musical comedy, oratorio, choral groups, and teaching.

PHILIP MYERS has been principal hornist with the New York Philharmonic since 1980 after having had the same post with the Minnesota Orchestra. He has also played with the Atlantic Symphony in Halifax, Nova Scotia and the Pittsburgh Symphony, and has appeared frequently as recitalist. Mr. Myers is a native of Elkhart, Indiana, and holds degrees from the Carnegie-Mellon University in Pittsburgh.













PATRICIA MILLER, internationallyacclaimed mezzo-soprano with a diversified opera repertoire, is a graduate of Boston University and the New England Conservatory. She received the Artists Diploma from the Academia di Santa Cecilia in Rome. A finalist in the Metropolitan Opera National Auditions in 1974, Miss Miller has been a recipient of many grants, including the Fulbright-Hayes Grant for graduate study in Rome. Equally at home on the recital and concert stage, Miss Miller has been guest soloist with major orchestras and festivals in the United States and abroad. She will sing the lead role of Dalila in the BMC Opera Workshop's production of "Samson et Dalila."

GELLERT MODOS, pianist, is a native of Budapest, Hungary and was trained at the outstanding conservatories of Europe. Since his arrival in this country in 1971, he has had a growing concert career and as artist-in-residence on the campuses of major universities. His many appearances in North Carolina have earned him an enthusiastic following, particularly for his performances of the works of Franz Liszt. Mr. Modos became a member of the Brevard Music Center Artist-Faculty in 1978.

PHILIP SMITH has been co-principal trumpet with the New York Philharmonic since 1978, coming from the Chicago Symphony. Born in London, Mr. Smith emigrated to the United States with his parents in 1959. At the age of eight, he began his studies with his father, Derek Smith, the well-known English cornetist, and continued his education at the Juilliard School with Edward Treutel and William Vacchiano. Mr. Smith has had extensive solo and recital experience throughout the United States, Canada and abroad.

MARILYN NEELEY, native of California and internationallyacclaimed pianist, has concertized from coast to coast in the United States and throughout Europe, Mexico and Canada. A prize winner of the Van Cliburn International Competition, the Geneva International Competition and other coveted awards, Miss Neeley has been soloist with over one hundred symphony orchestras, and was chosen as soloist for the premiere performance of the Vaughan-Williams Piano Concerto at Carnegie Hall. Miss Neeley presently is Associate Professor at the University of Maryland. She joins the Music Center's Artist-Faculty, and will be a solosit with the BMC Orchestra this season.

VAL PATACCHI's career as a singer has included many years of touring with various opera companies after his formal training at the Academy of Vocal Arts in his native Philadelphia. He has appeared throughout the country as guest artist with numerous opera companies, festivals and theatres and is regarded as one of our most versatile and experienced singer/actors today. Mr. Patacchi has served as head of the voice and opera department at Stephens College for a number of years. He returns to Brevard this year as Associate Director for the Opera Workshop's production of "Barber of Seville," and to sing the role of Don Basilio.

MELVIN POLL, tenor, was educated at the University of Washington School of Law and admitted to the Washington State Bar. Following a long-time dream, Mr. Poll gave up law practice to seriously study opera. After intensive training, he received rave reviews when he debuted in West Germany. After a stint with the Israel National Opera where he sang many leading roles, Mr. Poll returned to the U.S. His American debut followed a successful audition for the New York City Opera. In addition to operatic work, Mr. Poll has appeared in concert with various orchestras. At Brevard, he will sing the lead role in "Samson et Dalila.'














CHARLES REX, native of Winter Park, Florida and an alumnus of Brevard Music Center, is presently the Associate Concertmaster of the New York Philharmonic. He started violin at the age of four and made his debut with the Florida Symphony in Orlando at thirteen. Mr. Rex won a full scholarship to Florida State University and studied with Richard Burgin, former concertmaster and Associate Conductor of the Boston Symphony. In 1969, he won the National Young Artists Competition and soloed with the Cincinnati Symphony under Max Rudolf. Mr. Rex was with the Philadelphia Orchestra for eight years before accepting his present position.

CHRISTOPHER REX was a 1979 Artist Winner of the National Federation of Music Clubs, the youngest cellist ever to win the coveted string prize. A native of Florida, he received his formal training at the New School of Music and the Curtis Institute, both in Philadelphia, and later at Juilliard. He is a former member of the Philadelphia Orchestra, the New Chamber Players of Philadelphia, and the Philadelphia Chamber Ensemble. He is currently solo cellist of the Atlanta Symphony orchestra. During the 1980-81 season, Mr. Rex performed Strauss's "Don Quixote," the Beethoven triple concerto, and the Schumann cello concerto with the Atlanta Symphony.

JOSÉ RAMOS-SANTANA, pianist, alumnus of Brevard Music Center and a graduate of the Juilliard School, returns to perform Rachmaninoff's Piano Concerto II. He has appeared as soloist with major orchestras and festivals in the United States and in Puerto Rico, his homeland. Mr. Ramos-Santana has received numerous honors and awards, including the Van Cliburn Piano Award at Interlochen and the National Arts Club Competition in New York; while at BMC as a student, he was winner of the Concerto Competition in piano. Brevard is indeed proud to welcome this young artist.
