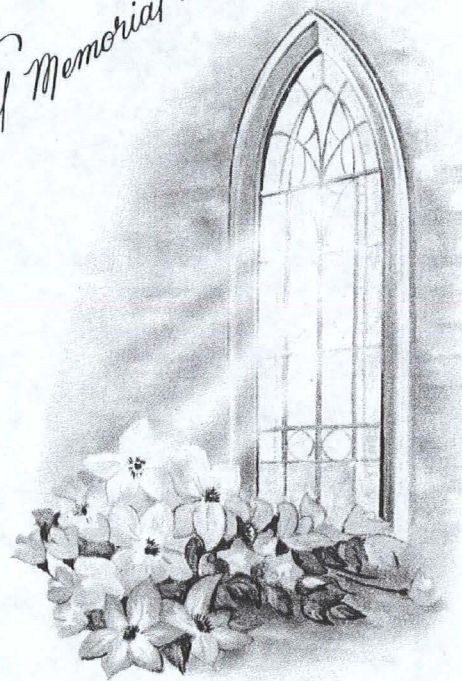

### *The Obituary*

Mr. Quincy "Bud" Barbee, departed this life on Friday, January 14, 2000, at the Duke University Medical Center. He was born to the late Bratcher and Easter Barbee on March 16, 1916 in Durham, North Carolina.

He received his education in the Durham City Schools and was a veteran of the U.S. Army.

Bud played professional baseball from 1943-1951. He played for several teams in the Negro, Canadian and Texas State leagues. He played locally for the semi-professional Durham Black Sox before playing for the Black Yankees, the Kansas City Monarchs and the Baltimore Elites. In 1998 the Herald-Sun ran a story about the Negro Baseball Leagues in which it stated that Bud hit one of the longest homeruns ever recorded at Yankee Stadium.

After his stint with baseball, he worked as a city supervisor until his retirement in 1977.

Left to cherish his memory are a sister, Mrs. Mary Barbee McClain; a brother-in-law, Joe McClain; a host of nieces, nephews, other relatives and friends.

# Durham baseball legend dies at 83

Quincy "Bud" Barbee, one of finest baseball players Durham ever produced, died at the Duke Medical Center on Friday afternoon. He was 83.

Barbee's funeral will be held in Durham on Saturday, Jan. 23.

Barbee played professional baseball for several teams in the Negro, Canadian and Texas State leagues from 1943-51.

He played locally for the semi-professional Durham Black Sox before going on to play for the Black Yankees (with his brother Lamb), the Kansas City Monarchs and the Baltimore Elites.

Barbee also batted .284 in the Canadian League, and finished his career with Texas City in the Texas State League from 1949-51.

"As far as black baseball in Durham, Bud was a legend," said Willie Bradshaw, who played for the Durham Rams, the successor of the Black Sox. "When I first saw him, he was a great player. I'm saddened to hear of his passing."

Barbee attended public schools in Durham and graduated from Whitted High School, the predecessor of Hillside High, in the early 1930s.

Bradshaw, who coached football and baseball at Hillside and served as the Durham Schools' athletics director, said Bud and Lamb Barbee were members of the first

great Durham Rams team, which often played against the Major Negro League teams.

Lamb, who died in 1987, lived in East Durham after his playing days.

"[Bud and Lamb] were a part of Durham's rich baseball tradition," Bradshaw said.

"You might say that the current success of the Durham Bulls started with the Durham Black Sox teams that Bud and Lamb played for. Back then, they often outdrew the Durham Bulls at the El Torro Park, and many white fans turned out to see those Black Sox teams play."
