Obituary

Mr. Russell Evans Blunt, 95, of 1202 Rosewood Avenue died peacefully, surrounded by his loving family at Duke University Hospital after an extended illness on Wednesday, January 7, 2004.

"Coach" Blunt was born April 21, 1908 in Andover, Massachusetts to the late Frank Russell Blunt and the late Amanda Eliza Goodman Blunt Mitchell. He graduated from Punchard High School in Andover, Massachusetts in 1926 where he was the only African-American in his class, and one of 9 African-Americans in the school. He lettered in football, baseball and basketball and played semi-professional baseball every summer as a catcher.

Upon graduation from high school, he attended St. Paul's Polytechnical Institute, Lawrenceville, Virginia, from which he received a certificate in printing in 1930. He excelled in football, basketball, and baseball as a student there. He then attended Bluefield College in West Virginia playing football and baseball. In the summer of 1933, he played catcher for the Bluefield semi-pro baseball team and toured mining towns in West Virginia. He subsequently transferred to St. Augustine's College where he played basketball and served as a student coach in football. He received a BA degree in French and Social Studies in 1936. Subsequent to his tenure at St. Augustine, Coach Blunt coached semi-pro teams in Andover and Lawrence, Massachusetts. He continued his education at Boston University from which he received his Master's degree in education in 1944.

In 1938, "Coach" was recruited to Southern University (LA) where he served as an assistant coach in football, basketball, and track for four years. Prior to returning to his alma mater, St. Augustine's College in 1946, as Head basketball and track coach, Coach Blunt was the head coach at Florida Normal (Fla.) and McKinley High School (La). He was appointed Head Coach at St. Augustine's College from 1946-50, followed by head coaching positions at St. Paul's Polytechnic Institute, and at North Carolina Central University, assisting Coach LeRoy Walker and the late Herman Riddick.

After a short stint at Florida Memorial College, Coach Blunt was successfully recruited to the Durham Public Schools in 1955, where he taught and coached football, basketball and track at Hillside High School and for a short time at Southern High School, for a total of 42 years building football and track dynasties at Hillside and producing State and National champions, college recruits, professional athletes, and Olympic athletes. In addition to his coaching for Hillside and Southern High Schools, Coach Blunt coached track for the Durham Striders Track Club for more than 15 years in the summers.

Coach Blunt's teams were fabulously successful-extraordinarily disciplined, superiorly conditioned, and focused. At one point in Coach's career, his football and track teams won 10 consecutive state titles as part of the segregated NCHSAC. After integration when Hillside became part of the NCHSAA, Coach Blunt went on to win the first ever NCHSAA indoor high school track state championship in 1986 and subsequently, with that same team, went undefeated in outdoor track, dominating the outdoor state track championships with one of the most talented teams in the history of high school track. He won outdoor track titles in 1984, 1987, 1993, 1994, and indoor titles in 1986, 1987, and 1997. From these teams came some of the country's most talented football and track athletes who regularly set state and national records, some of which still stand. Many of Coach's athletes went on to successful college and professional sports careers. But most importantly to "Coach", all went on to be productive citizens in their respective communities and they all managed to maintain contact with him through the years.

Coach Blunt semi-retired from the Durham Public Schools in 1973, however, his prolific career and his love of teaching "youngsters" could not keep him away from coaching, and he returned to the Durham Public Schools on a part-time basis to coach from 1973-1997. During his return, his teams continued to excel at Hillside and Southern High Schools.

Coach Blunt's awards and honors were numerous. He was inducted into the Hall of Fame for the North Carolina High School Athletic Association, North Carolina Sports Hall of Fame, North Carolina Central University, North Carolina Athletic Directors Association, the National Federation of High School Sports, Punchard High School, and was recipient of the NCHSAA Legend Award. Governor James Hunt awarded North Carolina's Order of the Long Leaf Pine Award to Coach Blunt, the highest recognition presented to a citizen of the State of North Carolina. His awards and recognitions for his contributions to the community of Durham and the State of North Carolina were numerous, including awards named for him, including the country's most honored summer competitive track meet, the Russell E. Blunt East Coast Invitational.

Coach Blunt's life personified the love of children and his dedication to make their futures bright and productive. He used sports and the discipline, self-respect, and ambition inherent in success in sports, as a vehicle to inspire, motivate, and build character among all who took the time to listen to his wisdom and follow his sage advice. He was personally responsible for the character development and successful careers of thousands of young men and women. He was a tough "task person" who tempered toughness with an inexhaustible amount of love. He never met anyone, especially children, whom he did not like, and there were few who could resist his charismatic teachings and coaching. He led by exemplary service, dedication, sacrifice, and vision and all who were touched by this special man have been made better because of him. His success as a coach made him an icon in athletics; his humble, God-fearing, unassuming, unselfish personality endeared him to Durham, the State of North Carolina, the Nation, and the world.

Coach Blunt was a faithful and active member of St. Titus Episcopal Church, where he served on the Vestry and was a member of the Brotherhood of St. Titus. He belonged to many civic and community organizations including life membership in Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, the 43 Hornet Club, the St. Augustine's Falcon Foundation, to name a few.

Coach Blunt was preceded in death by his beloved wife, Cora Lee Duren, whom he met at St. Augustine's College in 1933 and married in 1940. To this union were born two devoted daughters, Frankie Blunt Graves of Charlotte, NC and Linda Blunt Dalley (John) of Durham. He leaves behind to cherish his memory two sisters, Evelyn Green and Myrna Brown of Lawrence, MA, one brother Stanley Mitchell of Jamaica, NY, one sister-in-law, Ellen Mitchell of Newark, DE, three grandchildren, Tyra Graves Richardson (William) of Charlotte, NC, John Russell Dalley and Douglas Barrington Dalley of Durham, NC, three great-grandchildren Kiara, Kameron and Timothy Richardson of Charlotte, NC, one goddaughter, Dr. Brenda Armstrong, two godsons, BradLee Alexander and Benjamin Russell Armstrong, numerous nieces and nephews, and thousands of special and faithful friends who mourn his passing. 


