





her father owned and operated Perry's Barber Shop and where her mother owned and operated a dress-making business. Lillian was called "Ladybird" by family and friends, a nickname that lasted all her life. Her parents instilled in Lillian and her brother, Alfred, strong beliefs in education, leadership and religion. At an early age, Lillian became a member of St. Joseph C.M.E. Church, and one of its dedicated organists.

She was a dedicated wife, mother and grandmother, who tried to in-still in her family the same character, integrity and selfesteem, that her parents instil-

led in her.

Upon her retirement in 1983, Lillian became very active in the Durham Chapter of the Bennett College Alumnae Association, her neighborhood community association, and in political affairs. Lillian continued her dedication to Bennett College by serving as President of the Durham Chapter of the Bennett College Alumnae Association, from 1995 until 2001.
