

After his discharge he began to use his musical talents. He was a drummer, and played in several bands. His drums have been placed in Shiloh Baptist Church, Morrisville, where he was once a member.

J.A. as he is known to most, Jim to others, "Mr. C" to some, "Corn Bread" to one very close family, and POP to the family and staff of Scarborough & Hargett where he worked and mentored for more than 50 years. He nurtured this family, and to this day his methods still exist, and his voice echoes through the air. He holds a place of honor, respect, and pride in this establishment.

J.A. extended his knowledge of "First Aid" from the army to classes that he taught here in Durham.

As he went about his work professionally, he built a legacy in the Masonic family of more than 60 years. He constantly studied and has acquired more materials we believe than any other man in the Masonic family, and was always ready to share his knowledge through teaching, writing, and researching information for other brothers who have come through the ranks of masonry just as he had done.

As J.A. studied masonry, he became more in touch with God and the study of the Bible. He was a dynamic speaker, and probed deeply into the scriptures to make his messages understandable by all who heard him. He attended church and was elevated to Deacon. He later re-joined Morning Star Missionary Baptist Church in December 2004.

He was married to the former, Maria Blanch Santiazo and to this union 11 children were born. Ten of them preceded him in death. He later married Lena Fogg, and to this union one child was born, who preceded him in death along with both wives. He later met and married Shirley Hamilton Gatling.

On the wings of a snow white dove, whom God sent with His love, peace, comfort, and joy to receive him early on Monday morning. He left us, leaving his legacy to his wife Shirley, Michael Robert, Albert, Karl (Jennifer), Chawanda (Richard), and Tova; his grand children including Robert (Robin), Lisa, Monica, Jena, Michael, Jullie, Deitra, Vernon, Tyron, Shanna, Andrew, Nichole, Mela', Yolanda, Nichole, Timothy Michael, Piliar, and Franchia. Many great grandchildren; his niece, Muriel, great nieces, nephews, brothers-in-law, Levi (Grace), and LaMont; The entire Scarborough and Hargett family and staff; the staff at Rose Manor Health Facility, other relatives and friends.






