February 1, 1920, in Cincinnati, OH. At an early age, he moved with his family to Bloomington, IN. He departed his earthly life on Sunday, April 16, 2006, in Goldsboro, NC.

He received his primary education in Bloomington and graduated from Henderson Institute, Henderson, NC, in 1938. He attended West Virginia State College at Institute, WV, where he majored in Chemistry. While there, he entered the Civilian Pilot Training Program and graduated in 1939. The following year, he returned home to Bloomington and entered Indiana University.

In January 1942, he enlisted in the United States Army at Fort Benjamin Harrison, Indianapolis, IN. He was then stationed at Camp Wolters, Minerals Wells, TX. After six months of basic training, he was transferred to Officer Training School at Fort Benning, GA. Before graduation, he was transferred to Tuskegee (Institute), AL, for primary flight training. Upon completion of this training, he was transferred to Tuskegee Army Airfield for basic and advanced flight training. In May of 1943, he graduated, was commissioned a Second Lieutenant, and received his pilot's wings. After graduation, he was assigned to Selfridge Field and Oscoda Army Air

Field, both outside Detroit, MI, for further training in combat aircraft.

In September of 1943, he received his overseas assignment. He joined the 99th Fighter Squadron in Sicily.

After flying combat in Sicily, he was transferred to Campo Dechino outside of Naples, Italy, where he flew close support for General Mark Clark's Fifth Army. During this time he flew 186 missions with the 12th Air Force and was credited with destroying two enemy aircraft

and possibly two others while flying P-40 aircraft. In July of 1944, he received a P-51 and was transferred to Ramitelli Air Base. Here he joined the 100th, 301st and the 302nd Fighter Squadrons which became the 332nd Fighter Goup and was attached to the 15th Air Force.

He affectionately named his first aircraft, the P-40 (Gerry I) and his second aircraft, the P-51 (Gerry II), in honor of his wife.

During his tenure with the 15th Air Force, he flew 178 missions providing bomber escort for B-17's and B-24's.

The 332nd Fighter Group, while flying over 2,000 combat escort missions and 15,000 sorties never lost an escorted bomber to the German Air Force. In April of 1945, he was transferred back to Tuskegee Army Airfield, where he served until the airfield was closed. At that time he was relieved from active duty.

After two years of civilian life, he enlisted in the United States Air Force and served for thirty years until his retirement in 1972. His military career included not only World War II, but the Korean War and the Vietnam Conflict. During his career, he was awarded the distinguished Flying Cross, two Purple Hearts, three Presidential Unit Citations, the Red Star of Yugoslavia, the Korean Service Medal, the Vietnam Service and Campaign Medals as well as numerous other awards and decorations.

Lt. Eagleson was an active member of the AARP and American Legion of Goldsboro, NC and a member of the Wilson V. Eagleson Chapter, Tuskegee Airmen, Inc., for which the chapter was named. Most of his time is spent speaking and sharing his experiences as a Tuskegee Airman, with schools, churches, civic groups, and other organizations throughout North Carolina and other parts of the country. The Tuskegee Airmen were warriors and guardians (Red Tail Angels). This was his passion!


