Tribute was paid to Hiliary H. "Hip" Holloway Wednesday, February, 16, at Mount Olivet Tabernacle Baptist Church, Philadelphia, Pa., Rev. Frank Johnson, pastor, gave the organ prelude and benediction. Eulogist was Rev. Richard A. Dent, pastor of First African Baptist Church, Sharon Hill, Pa., who is also a Kappa. The Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity memorial service was held Tuesday, February 15 at the church. Interment was in Westchester, Pa.

Holloway was a native of Durham County, attended Mill Grove Elementary School, Little River High School and graduated from North Carolina College at Durham with B.S. in business administration. He earned a master's degree in business and a law degree at Temple University in Philadelphia.

Holloway was the first executive director of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity and later was elected its Grand Polemarch. He was the first African American vice president in the Federal Reserve Banking system, taking on the additional role of general counsel in charge of the legal department. He had held membership on the Board of Trustees of Mount Olivet Tabernacle Baptist Church, the Board of Directors of the Philadelphia Urban League, the Greater Philadelphia Community Development Corporation, the Children's Aid Society, Mount Olivet Village Corporation, and the United Fund Allocations Committee and chaired the City Planning Commission. He had also chaired the Board of Trustees of his alma mater, North Carolina Central University. He had been a Grand Keeper of Records and Exchequer and member of the Board of Directors of Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity. He was a member of the Philadelphia, Federal, American and Pennsylvania Bar Associations.

He joined the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia as assistant counsel in 1968 and was promoted to counsel in 1972. He had retired from the Federal Reserve.

Surviving are his wife, Mrs. Beatrice Gwendolyn Larkin Holloway; a daughter, Jannis; and a son, Hiliary, Jr.

Mills" went on peacefully to be present with the Lord on Monday. November 6, 2000 after an extended illness. Mills, the sixth of ten children of

the late 1 Simeon an Zelma Slade Holloway, was born in Durham County, on November 17. 1924. He received his early education and diploma from Little River High School in Bahama, NC. He served the USA in World War II from 1943 to 1946 and received an Honorable Discharge as Sergeant from the Army. Reflecting upon his life, he recalls that "I've been fortunate in marrying the right person." He and Doris Moore Holloway have shared more than 47 years of a loving and productive life.

J. He served as Treasurer for the following political campaign committees to elect John Winters State Senate, John H. Baker Sheriff of Wake County, Arthur J. Calloway Raleigh City Council, Harriet B. Webster Wake County Board of Education, Ralph Campbell Raleigh City Council & State Auditor. While in the hospital, he made sure that he exercised his right to vote in the November 2000 General Election by using the "No Excuse One-Stop Absentee Voting" procedures.

ALTHEA HENRIETTA McADEN HOLMES was born in Reidsville, N.C. on February 21, 1914 to Mr. Charlie McAden and Mrs. Sallie Jefferson McAden. She attended public schools in Reidsville and graduated from Washington High School in 1932 with honors. She attended North Carolina College for Negroes in Durham, N.C. and in 1935 was graduated magna cum laude with a B.A. degree in English and Education. She was a life member of the NCCU Alumni Association, a life member of the Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Alpha Zeta Omega Chapter, and a life member of the NAACP.

After leaving college, Althea taught in the Gibson, North Carolina School System for three years. IN 1937, she married her college schoolmate, Irwin Richard "Bus" Holmes. They had two children, Irwin, Jr. and Carol Brenda. The family lived in Florida while "Bus" was a Recreation Director for Migratory Labor Centers for the War Food Administration.

In 1947, the family returned to Durham, N.C. where Althea taught art in the Durham County Schools. She became one of the first black teachers to teach in a formerly all white Durham County School. She later received her M.A. degree from North Carolina Central University in 1960 and she taught Special Education in Durham County. She retired in 1976.

Althea was beloved by many. In 1972, she was selected as a Mother of the Year by the Durham Morning Herald. And there were many who called her Mother. She volunteered many hours at the W. D. Hill Recreation Center where her husband, "Bus", was the Director. She taught countless children to crochet, to sew, and to do other crafts. Her unique hand made dolls were loved by family and friends across the country. She volunteered at the John Avery Boys Club, the Stanford L. Warren Library, and the White Rock Baptist Church Community Arts Program. Althea was a faithful member of White Rock Baptist Church where she attended the Philathea Sunday School Class and the College View District. She was a regular participant in White Rock's Senior Wellness and Fitness Program.

In 1948, Althea was a Charter Member of the Weaver McLean American Legion Auxiliary Unit 175. She enjoyed participating in the Model Mothers Club, the Silhouettes of Kappa Alpha Psi, and she was a member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority for over 50 years. She also had a special place in her heart for her garden. She kept a large vegetable garden and she loved flowers.




