Centenarian enjoys the active life

At the age of 100, Sudie Gaither is ready to party.

Gaither's birthday was Thursday, but the party is Saturday at the Marriott Hotel on I-40.

"We're going to have a big family dinner and all my people are invited," she said. "There's nothing like the family ties."

One of her 14 grandchildren, Edward Pratt of Houston, Texas, organized the affair and greatgranddaughter Trina Johnson sent out a newsletter to invite family members.

"It's about 200 or more people expected," said Louise Jenkins, one of Gaither's three children who lives with her in Durham. Another daughter, Dolethia Pratt, died in January, while Gaither lost her father Hosea and son Joseph Hartman Jr., within six weeks of each other in 1945.

Gaither was born in Morganton, the 12th and youngest child of Maggie and Hosea Avery. She moved to Durham when she was 19 and joined the Mt. Vernon Baptist Church. She still attends church "if I'm feeling good," she said. "Thank the Lord I'm able to get out." Amazingly, she joins another centurion in the congregation, Ora Rich.

Delphine Taylor, a field rep for Social Security, keeps up with folks over 100 and visits them each year. She said there are 43 in her four-county (Durham, Orange, Person and southern Granville) area. That number is up from 26 two years ago.

"A few are in nursing homes, but so far most of the ones I have visited live with their children or other relatives," she said.

There are more than 45,000 people over 100 years old nationally, up from 27,000 two years ago. In North Carolina the number is 975, up from 631 in 1993.


Gaither has only been hospitalized twice in her life, at 85 for an ulcer and at 90 for hip replacement surgery.

She said the new joints are wonderful. Asked about arthritis, she replied, "Thank the Lord I am not bothered with that."

In her century, Gaither has lived through two husbands and two world wars, not to mention the invention of airplanes, space ships, penicillin and television.

"I remember everything that happened," she said, explaining that her first ride on a airplane was not until the '50s. And when men landed on the moon, "I didn't believe it," she said.

Gaither worked at Duke hospital

when it first opened. She was a domestic worker and stayed active until her late '80's. She has been a traveling woman in her day.

"I retired before she did," Jenkins said. "I retired at 62 and she retired two years later."

Taylor said many people don't realize that while Social Security limits how much a person can make between 62 and 70, after 70 "You can work and earn all the money you want and still get Social Security."

Gaither has stayed active in recent years, traveling around the country.

"She's been running and going so much, her grandchildren called her 'Highway Sudie,' " said Jenkins. "She's been to Canada, Hawaii, Washington and Texas. In May she attended a great-granddaughter's graduation in Maryland."

Jenkins said her mother retired from cooking, "when I retired." But Gaither said she did her share of "just old time cooking" over the years. "Everybody I ever cooked for said I was a good cook," she said.

One thing she never tried was driving a car.

"I don't want to get out there and kill somebody," she said with a laugh.

Today Gaither likes to read, "the paper and my Bible," and she is an optimist. She was asked if the world is a better place than when she was a child.

"Yes, I think so," she said.
