

Mr. Harrington was retired from Durham Public Schools as the athletic coach/teacher, he was mutual ob-


server for Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference, referee/judge, and deacon of West Durham







She was honored by Rho Chapter (Durham) of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority, and honored as "Woman of the Year" and was in "Who's Who for Women". As an Educator she was honored in 1973 by President Richard M. Nixon for achievement in Education.

Mrs. Harris leaves to mourn cousins and friends.



Dr. Harris, Durham College Founder

The funeral for Dr. Lucinda McCauley Harris, 76, founder of Durham College, will be held at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday in St. Mark's AME Zion Church. Burial will be in Glennview Memorial Park.

She died Sunday.

Dr. Harris was a leader of the predominantly black two-year business college for 33 years, first

as president and later as a trustee.

Dr. Harris was a native of Durham. She graduated from Hillside High School and received a bachelor's degree in commerce from N.C. Central University. She did further study at Northwestern University and New York University.

She taught in Durham schools for several years before 1946, when she started McCauley's Business School with five students in a five-room frame house on Pine Street (now Roxboro Street). It moved to Fayetteville Street in 1965 and was reorganized into Durham Business College. A more diversified curriculum was introducted in 1970. when its name changed to Durham College.

Enrollment at the two-year college increased to 500 students and 110 employees. In 1977, it boasted status as a "\$2.5 million complex."

Financial problems plagued the school for the next few years. It closed in January 1980 and filed

for bankruptcy two months later.

Dr. Harris was slowed by a stroke in 1982, but before that she was a member of Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, the Durham Committee on the Affairs of Black People, the N.C. Business School Administration and the Durham Business and Professional Chain.

She was included in Who's Who Among U.S. Women.

In 1973 she was honored by former president Richard Nixon for achievement in education.

Dr. Harris' only survivors are cousins.

The family will receive visitors from 8:15 to 9:15 p.m today at Scarborough & Hargett Funeral Home.

ABSTRACT

The health care system in the United States is undergoing a critical phase. The crisis is reflected by a large segment of the population which sustains limited or inadequate health care by average standards. The cost of health care services, the location of health care facilities and the unequal distribution of health manpower are major causative factors associated with this problem of health care delivery. The present study investigated specific social characteristics of 1368 families in relation to their use of selected health care services.

Subject families were chosen at random from a four-county area in the Southern Tier Region of New York State. Data for this study were selected from a larger study undertaken by researchers at Cornell University. Independent variables under investigation include socio-economic status as measured by the total family income before taxes, family employment status by the working or non-working status of family members, family composition as determined by age distribution of family members in the household, and residency based on rural and non-rural location of families. Dependent variables were the family's use of a family doctor, dentist, emergency room, pediatrician and ambulance services.

Among all families included in the study, regardless of social characteristics, the greatest proportion (81.2%) report using the services

of a family doctor; a lower proportion (73.1%) have used dental services; still fewer (42.4%) have used the emergency room; 19.4 percent have used a pediatrician; and only 12.3 percent report using ambulance service. In general, high income families are more apt to use all services than lower income groups, with the exception of ambulance service. Families with young children and persons over 60 are more frequent users of health services, although the pattern of services is more likely to include ambulance service for the elderly and pediatrician for the young. More families in which at least one person was employed used health services than families in which no person was employed. Differences in use between rural and non-rural families were not significant. More important were the differences in kinds of services used by families in the categories of each independent variable.

Results suggest the need for planners to consider the accessibility of health services to the total population.

Mrs. Eula Wade Perry Harris, of 512 Umstead Street, died Sunday, March 13, 1988, at her home.

Daughter of the late Blunt and Lizzie Wade, Mrs. Harris was a native of Red Lick, Mississippi. She completed high school in Fayette, Mississippi and earned a Commercial Course degree at Campbell College, Jackson, Mississippi.

Mrs. Harris began her career with North Carolina Mutual Life Insurance Company in 1922 as a Clerk-Stenographer in the Mississippi State Office. She worked as a Volunteer leader for Women-in-Action since its organization in 1968, chaired the committee that named the group, and served as President from 1977-78 and Chairman of the Board from 1979-80. She also served Women-in-Action as Secretary and as Membership Chairman, instituted (with WRAL-TV) the Call for Action Program, and began the Women-in-Action Clearing House service. She was Secretary of the Durham-Orange Chapter of the American Association of Retired Persons and of the Umstead Street Community Club. Mrs. Harris also served as President of Iota Phi Lambda Sorority and enjoyed membership in the Queen Highs and the Gourmets Bridge Clubs. A faithful member of St. Joseph's A.M.E. Church, she was Secretary of the Church Improvement Club, Secretary of the Board of Christian Education, and President of the Ladies Aid Society.

In recognition of her community service she received a citation in 1976 from the State of North Carolina, the 1983 Governor's Volunteer Award, and the 1984 Senior Volunteer Award from the Retired Senior Volunteers' Program. She also received leadership awards from the National Council of Negro Women, Tau Gamma Delta Sorority, the Mary Moore Saunders Club, AARP, the YWCA, and St. Joseph's A.M.E. Church. In 1977, Mrs. Harris was honored as a Mother of the Year by the Durham Merchants' Association.

Mrs. Harris was twice married -- to the late Dr. G. Robert Perry, a New York Dentist, and to the late Joseph Waverly Harris, Chief Clerk of North Carolina Mutual's Agency Department.

Survivors include two sons, Wade Wayne and Gordon Robert Perry; two grand-children, Wade Wayne, Jr. and Tama A. Perry; one great grandson, Wade Wayne Perry, III; several cousins and a host of friends.







the everyday man and woman.

A little more than 10 years ago, he met his soul-mate, Eleanor Brown Witt. Through the lost art of letter writing; a friendship blossomed into love. Eleanor and John shared a love for music, travel and cultivating friendships. Her family became his. No two people could be more suitably matched. Eleanor's children's respect and love for John became evident when twin girls were bom to her daughter Bridget. One twin was named after his mother. Her name - Erin Eleta.

John spent his last yeas entertaining in the Prince of Wales Room at the Del

Coronado Hotel near San Diego.

The daughter of the late Waverly and Mary Wyatt, Mrs. Julia Wyatt Harris was born in Jarrett, Virginia on August 5, 1895. She departed this life on November 30, 1983 at Hillhaven Rehabilitation and Convalescent Center.

She was a Board Member of the Golden Age Council which was the forerunner of the Coordinating Council for Senior Citizens. At the time of her passing, she was an honorary member of said organization. She had also served as a member of the Board of Directors of Lincoln Community Health Center. Mrs. Harris was the founder of Beta Zeta Chapter of the National Sorority Phi Delta Kappa. In addition she held membership in several civic, social and cultural clubs.

She was a geniune lover of people and her aid to students never ended until her serious illness.

Surviving are two nieces, Mrs. Rachel Booth of Trenton, New Jersey and Mrs. Eleanor Young of Jamesburg, New Jersey; two nephews by marriage, Mr. Llewellyn Harris, III and Mr. Erdom H. Harris of Greensboro; one niece by marriage, Mrs. Ida Burghhardt of Lanham, Maryland; three great nieces; two great nephews; a host of relatives and friends.

Regulations keep 1996 business in line

Like his fellow conservatives, economist Walter Williams abhors regulations that have any impact on the business community, whether it's a mom-and-pop enterprise or an international corporation ("Regulations thwart entrepreneurship," Nov. 6).

Conservatives would have us believe that the business world is a socially responsible, benevolent community whose environmental concerns are paramount, that the concerns of the consumer are first and foremost in its conduct.

If that picture were so, regulations indeed would not be needed. Unfortunately, Williams and his fellow conservatives live in a dream world. The object of any for-profit business is to make money — all the money it can, as fast as it can, doing anything it can get away with.

The most obvious example of this is the HMO industry. It costs an HMO money to keep a patient in the hospital, so they gave us "drive-by deliveries" until an outraged public forced most state legislatures to enact regulations to deal with that abuse. HMOs often refuse to pay for expensive emergency room care, arguing that such visits are not necessary, regardless of the circumstances.

Now the federal government is forced to write regulations that would strengthen Medicare beneficiaries' rights to appeal. A current Associated Press article states that "death rates after a stroke were 36 percent lower for patients treated by neurologists rather than family practitioners...but the expenses were 34 percent higher." I wonder if conservatives really believe that HMOs will routinely call in neurologists for all their stroke patients.

As a stockholder, I expect the corporations I invest in to return the largest dividends possible. But as a citizen I have the right to expect our local, state and federal governments to protect me from corporate excesses.
