She had four older siblings, Joseph W. Horry, Sr. (Alice) of New York, and Albert F. B. Horry, Jr., (Mary), Sarah (Rev. B. Milton) Jones and Evelyn (Samuel) Dudley of Durham. All have pre-deceased her.

Dr. Horry graduated from Stephens-Lee H.S. in Asheville, Tallega College (A.B.), Howard University (M.A.) and New York University (Ph.D.). She had post-doctoral studies and prestigious fellowships at a number of institutions in the U.S. and the Sorbonne in Paris, France. She began her teaching career in 1938, came to NCCU in 1949, and retired in 1975. She was a published author of books and articles, belonged to a number of organizations related to her profession, and was a consultant, panelist or speaker in a number of venues. She was listed in Who's Who of American Women.

Dr. Horry belonged to the YWCA (former Board of Directors) and Delta Sigma Theta, Inc. (Former VP Durham Alumnae Chapter), and Women in Action for the Prevention of Violence. She was a former Trustee at the St. Joseph's AME Church, and a member of the Satterfield-Davis Auxiliary. She is survived by a nephew, Joseph W. 
