





She was a member of White Rock Baptsit Church where she was a member of the Deacon Board, the Susie V. Norfleet Bible Class, the Shepard-Williams-Womack Missionary Circle, and the College View District. She was also a member of Rosewood Street Neighborhood Club.

She was a dynamic and dedicated member of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. She served as the second president of the Durham Alumnae Chapter.


She willingly volunteered her services with Call for Action and Contact Services of Durham.
