Obituary

DENNIS MOORE McCASKILL, son of the late Marvin and Janie McCaskill, was born in Scotland County, North Carolina. He departed his life October 29, 1979 after a period of illness. At an early age the family moved to Durham.

He was a graduate of Hillside High School, and North Carolina Central University where he earned the B.S. and M.S. Degrees. Advance studies were done at Duke University, Durham, North Carolina and New York University, New York.

During World War II, Mr. McCaskill attained the rank of First Sergeant and served in Special Services. During his tour of duty, he attended George Washington University, Washington, D. C. and the University of Minnesota, Minneapolis, Minnesota.

Mr. McCaskill was a Mathematics teacher in the Hertford County schools for five years before becoming Principal of Washington High School at Waco, North Carolina in Cleveland County. He held this post for twelve years. In 1959, he came to Durham County as Principal of the Wakeview Elementary School and later was named Principal of Merrick Moore School. He served from 1973 to 1977 as Principal of Carrington Junior High School. In 1977, he was appointed to the Central office Administrative Staff as Assistant Superintendent in charge of Pupil Personnel Services, Special Programs, and Staff Development, a position he held until his death.

His affiliations and organizations included, active membership in the Mt. Vernon Baptist Church, The T. L. Rowland Bible Class and a member of the Board of Trustees. His educational affiliations were numerous, including the National and the North Carolina Associations of School Administrators and the Durham County Association of Educators. He was a member of the Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity and the Masonic order.

He leaves to mourn, his wife, Mrs. Juanita Branch McCaskill and one son, Dennis M. McCaskill, Jr. of the home; two daughters, Miss Wanda Jean McCaskill of Louisburg, North Carolina and Miss Denise McCaskill of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania; two sisters, Mrs. Doris M. Long and Mrs. Johnola Thorpe of Washington, D. C.; two brothers, Marvin McCaskill, of Washington, D. C. and Booker T. McCaskill of Durham, North Carolina; and a host of other relatives and friends.

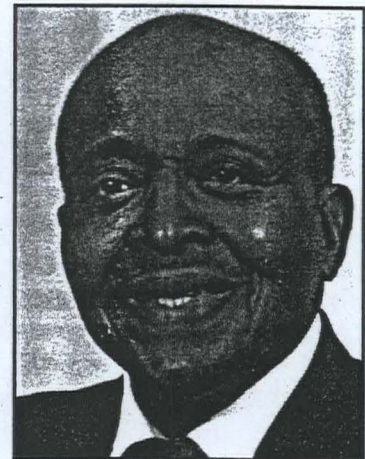


Even though you are not with us anymore, you will never die because your memory is so strong and your heart was so large and caring, that death can't shake you from our minds and hearts!
