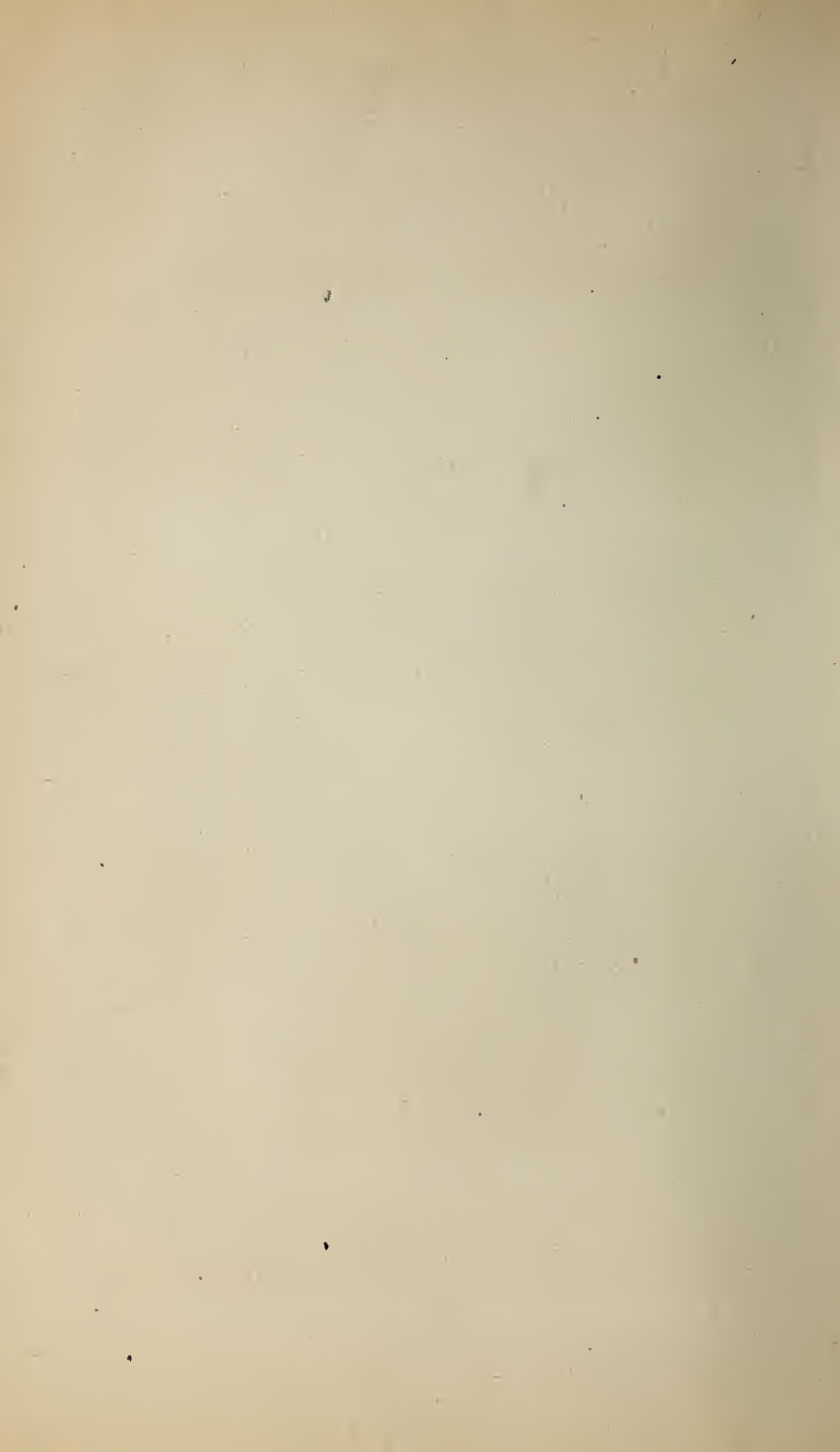

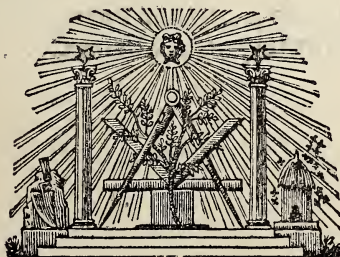

The Grand Master delivered the following Address and referred the same to a Committee composed of Bre. J. H. Mills, John Nichols, S. G. W., and Clinton A. Cilley, J. G. W.:

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina:

BRETHREN OF THE GRAND LODGE OF NORTH CAROLINA:—I am glad to meet you. Glad to meet you as men, because your companionship is both instructive and entertaining. Glad to meet you as Masons, because recognize the fact that we are bound together by an indissoluble chain of sincere affection. Your cheerful faces and elastic steps tell me that you have been dwelling in a land blessed with peace and plenty, and that a kind providence has protected and preserved you, and crowned your lives with many loving kindnesses and tender mercies. Let us bless His Holy name, and beseech Him for wisdom, and temperance, and fortitude, and prudence, and justice, and brotherly love, and faith in God, hope in immortality, and charity to all mankind, that we may honor Him, and advance the cause of virtue and morality, which is the cause of Masonry, that has again summoned us together.

I rejoice to know, brethren, that the remarks I had the honor to submit, at your last Communication, touching the prevalent Masonic crimes—profanity and drunkenness—have reached the ear, not only of the Fraternity in North Carolina, but of the entire country. The sentiments which I so earnestly, yet feebly, enunciated, and your prior action in declaring to the world that these vicious and destructive practices were among the highest Masonic crimes, have met with the profoundest sympathy, gushing forth from every Mason, whose intellect has been quickened, whose

heart has been animated, and whose soul has been inspired by the sublime moral teachings of our venerable Institution. It is true, brethren, that, occasionally, the voice of the raven, whose feathers are made glossy only by their sooty blackness, utters forth the vain croakings of its sombre race; yet, it is equally true, that that voice is only ominous, because it comes to us from the wizard stillness and inky darkness of a terrible moral night. Masonry, brethren, lives in the light; her deeds are deeds of light; her words are words of light; and to the light she brings all who kneel at her sacred altar. With her eye fixed on the great moral laws, as the setless sun of her firmament, which ever sheds refulgent beams of light on the pathway which leads to the fulfillment of her destiny, and the accomplishment of her humane purposes, she utterly abhors and contemns the traitor to her teachings, who skulks in the darkness, and amid the ebullitions of an unhallowed passion, or the jeers and jests of an unthoughted mirth, or the polluting demands of an insatiable appetite, makes a plaything of God's name, and wallows in the mud, which his own debauchery has made without the fit emblem of the baseness within.

Masonry, brethren, applauds the right and condemns the wrong. She adorns the palace and graces the hut. The politest sensibility of the most refined maidenly delicacy, is never shocked by the coarseness of her speech, nor the brutality of her acts. Masonry never plunges the dagger into the bosom of parental love. Masonry never holds her bacchanalian revels in the midst of the wife's heart-broken sobs, or the children's despairing cries. Masonry never looks up to Heaven, and with haughty defiance towards God, hisses insult at Him through teeth set on edge by her own chosen depravity, while she lives, day by day, on His goodness, and sleeps, night by night, on the pillow of His mercy. Oh! no! Masonry receives her light, and catches her inspiration from the moral law of God Himself: and, while truth is a divine attribute, and benevolence of universal obligation, and justice shall render to all their just dues without distinction, so long shall the Mason, who flies from the parlor to give vent to his heart-rending oaths, or turns his back upon all decent company to give loose reins to his debasing appetites, seek no shelter, and find no refuge, within the sacred precincts of the mystic temple.

I congratulate you again, Brethren of the Grand Lodge of North Carolina, after another year has established your wisdom, and confirmed you in the truth, that with you, in practice as well as in theory, Profanity and Drunkenness are among the highest Masonic crimes, and that you have determined, and are now determined, to vindicate the purity of Masonic morals and justify the integrity of Masonic law. Your resolution has reared a monument to your Masonic fidelity, more enduring than marble, more imperishable than brass; and though the sophistry of the scorner, and the ridicule of the witling, may seek to sap its foundation, and cause it to totter and fall, yet, they shall never be able even to dim the halo of glory, which encircles its loftiness, and which bears testimony to the truth, that Masonry shines only in the full noon-tide of her brilliancy and splendor, when,

with Morality for her base, she lifts up her votaries above every degrading habit, every unhallowed passion, every polluting vice, and every bestial appetite. Masonry is, indeed, and was ever designed to be, let who will attempt to deny, or conceal, or obscure, or bedaub the ennobling truth, a compact, symmetrical, harmonious, universal, moral Institution.

And yet, Brethren, Masonry is not Christianity. Far from it. It is indeed, a perversion of truth, an exhibition of spitefulness, a manifestation of uncharitable charity, (if you will pardon the paradox) to one's own Masonic trepidude and guilt, to speak as some have spoken, to write as some have written, that some "Grand Masters grumble, because the Fraternity are not all saints,"—thus evincing a willingness, yea, a stealthy desire, to paralyze the efforts of the Grand Masters in the strict discharge of duty, to bring the individual Mason to a proper apprehension of the truth, that, as a Mason, he should be, not a saint, but a man, in the true sense of the word; a man who rejoices in the nobility of his manhood—a man, who draws himself up to the dignity of a man, in the abiding consciousness of his superiority over the brute creation, by the divinity which stirs within him—a man made in the likeness of his great creator—yea, a man, who ceases to be not a saint, but a man, when he spits out from between his self-polluted lips, the sacred name of Deity, and bestializes his own person.

Masonry does, indeed, brethren, defend and preserve true manhood; and, to this end, and that manhood may be developed to the fullest extent of glory and power, of which its unchristianized nature is capable, it enjoins unlimited obedience to the moral law. Yet, never, brethren, so long as the eye can behold the thief upon the cross, dying amid the ignominy and shame which justly attach to so execrable an offence, and yet in the full blaze and splendor of the christian faith and hope—or the young man coming to Jesus in the proud consciousness of having kept all these "from my youth up,"—a splendid specimen of a perfect Mason—and yet turning away sorrowful, because he lacked the one thing; yet, can it be contended, or will it be contended, that Masonry is Christianity, or that to be a Mason a man must needs be a saint. Christianity, on her way to Heaven, may walk for awhile by the side of Masonry, on her way to the grave, and, as she looks upon Masonry's noble deeds of beneficence and love, and her ever faithful finger pointing to the only ladder ascending from earth to Heaven, which Christianity recognizes as her own that has been dropped down from the skies—Christianity may approve and smile, and even love, as Jesus did, the moral but sorrowful young man—yet, that is all—that is all—for Masonry is human, Christianity is divine. Masonry is flesh, Christianity is spirit. The end of Masonry is the dignification of man,—the end of Christianity is the glory of God. The humblest christian will be saved in Heaven—the most exalted Mason may be damned in hell.

Is it not strange, then, brethren—yea, passing strange—when one would wisely and discreetly pass into the Sanctum Sanctorum of the Masonic Temple, and point to the moral law, as the Shekinah, which alone sheds

light and glory there, that others, who should glory in that light, and be enlightened by that glory, will stand afar off, and protest—we will not enter there, *you would have us all turn saints?* Their talent is misapplied. Their zeal is misdirected.

I am persuaded that the Grand Lodge of North Carolina, thoroughly imbued with the true spirit of Masonry, will never countenance even the most covert attempt to institute a Masonic religion, “irreverently imitating” the holy ordinances and appointments of God, and borrowing from the Church its rites, its titles, its formalities and its ceremonies. I would, therefore, brethren, in your name, and in the name of a pure and reverent Masonry, admonish these jealous and sensitive brethren to beware how they falsely strike at the very life of our order, and to bring their keen-edged blades, with their stout arms and brave hearts, to the point where real danger threatens.

Give ear to the curious and startling narrative of events, as they transpired in the Capital of the nation, on the evening of April 29, 1872 :

“The first public Masonic baptism of children which has ever taken place in the District was performed last night in the Chapter Chamber, Masonic temple, in the presence of a large number of Masons, their wives and daughters. The children were an infant son of Dr. Joseph W. Nairn, 32d degree, and a son of Mr. E. B. MacGrotty, 18th degree, who were baptized in Mithras Lodge of Perfection, Ancient Scottish Rite, which is the Consistory of this Masonic Jurisdiction. The rite was performed by Thrice Illustrious P. G. M., Albert Pike, assisted by Illustrious J. O. Sinclair, S. G. W.; Illustrious L. H. Pike, J. G. W.; C. W. Bennett, Grand Orator; W. M. Ireland, Master of Ceremonies; B. F. Hedrich, Senior Deacon; C. T. Nutze, Junior Deacon; Rev. Mr. Harris, Chaplain; H. J. Martin, Secretary and L. Stoddard, Tiler. The ceremony of Masonic baptism has always been celebrated in the Ancient and Accepted Scottish order. It has been censured by many as an irreverent imitation of the Christian rite of baptism; but well-informed Masons know that purification by washing was used in all the mysteries thousands of years before our era. After the assembly had been seated, Grand Master Pike gave a short history of the ceremony, saying that it taught neither hatred, intolerance nor revenge. After a voluntary on the organ by brother Servoss, a rap was heard at the door, and information given that two children, with their parents, desired admission, the parents praying that their children might be baptized, when the Master directed the Master of Ceremonies and his aids to bring the children, their parents and sponsors into the Lodge. Soon after, the Master of Ceremonies returned, followed by one of his assistants bearing a candlestick with three lighted candles, one white, one black and one red, forming a triangle. Following, were two assistants, one carrying the child of Dr. Nairn, Robert Brice Nairn, upon a cushion covered with light blue silk, the other leading the child of Mr. MacGrotty, Edwin Albert MacGrotty; and behind these came the parents of the children and the sponsors. The sponsors for the son of Dr. Nairn

were Dr. J. B. Gibbs, 32d degree, and Caroline E. Davis; for Master MacGrotty, Jerome C. Davis, 32d degree, and Mrs. M. Walker. After the third circuit of the room, the procession halted, and the candlestick was placed before the altar, and the children returned to their mothers, who with the sponsors, took their seats in the center of the room. The Masonic choir then sang, "My Soul Doth Magnify the Lord." After an oration by the Master, in which he explained the duties and responsibilities which the lodge was about to assume in conferring the rite, he then asked the fathers: "Are you willing that we should accept these duties?" An affirmative response being given, the Master called upon the Chaplain to invoke the favor and assistance of God, which was done, the brethren all kneeling. The choir then sang the ode, "Rejoice, Rejoice, Fond Mothers." The sponsors then took seats near the parents, when the Master addressed them in relation to the duties they were taking upon themselves. After an invocation to the Deity, and music, the children, parents and sponsors were then conducted forward to the altar, on which water, oil and salt were placed. The Master then called the lodge up, descended from his throne, and, after a few words addressed to the group, lighted the incense on the altar. After a chant by the choir, the Master took the children severally in his arms, dipped their left hands in a basin of perfumed water, and said: "By this symbol I devote thee (in each case) to the service of virtue and truth. May our Father who is in heaven keep thee innocent and pure of heart all the days of thy life." During this ceremony the choir sang an appropriate ode. The Master then took the vessel of perfumed oil, dipped the little finger of his right hand therein, and marked with it a delta on the forehead of each child, saying, "I set upon thy forehead the symbol of wisdom, power and love of God. May he protect and guide thee in right courses all the days of thy life;" the choir singing, meanwhile, the chant, "Blessed are the undefiled in the way." The Master then replaced the vessel on the altar, and stretching out his hands toward the children, invoked a blessing upon them. The children and those in charge of them were conducted to their seats, and the choir sang an appropriate ode. The god-mothers then placed them at the altar of obligation; the brethren present formed in a circle around them, each with his left hand on his heart and his right hand raised towards heaven; all then kneeled and repeated, after the Master, the solemn vow to protect the children from all danger and temptation until their arrival at maturity. After rising, the Master, taking the vessel of salt in his hand, repeated the Arab vow which sanctifies the enemy with whom he has tasted salt, and, placing a portion of the salt on his tongue, said: "With this salt I seal my vow." The kersel was then passed to each brother, who in turn repeated the vow. The children were then invested with lamb-skin aprons, and each was presented with a masonic jewel, the Master saying: "In the name and under the auspices of the Supreme Council, I do proclaim these children consecrated to the service of truth and virtue by Masonic Baptism, and anointing after the ancient custom of Masonry, to be wards of the Mithras Lodge of Perfection." This was repeated in turn by the ven-

erable Grand and Senior Wardens. After more music, the orator delivered a brief lecture, after which two young ladies, in conformity with a law of the Scottish Rite, passed among the assemblage and received contributions from all who chose to give, the same, so collected, to be given by the Grand Almoner to the most needy person or persons known to him, the source from which it comes, in pursuance of inviolable custom, not to be made known. A closing chant concluded the ceremonies."

What means this imitative assemblage of illustrious dignitaries? What mean these children—these sponsors—these god-mothers—this basin—this perfumed water—this dipping—aye, this *Masonic baptism*? Brethren, what means all this *tomfoolery*? We have no such Masonry as that in North Carolina, and we want no such Masonry as that in North Carolina. The creative genius of Masonry is libelled, and she seeks a vindication. Masonry does not imitate. She borrows not from Pagan nor Christian—from Gentile nor Jew. And right well assured am I, that if the droll necessity were inflicted on Masonry to get up a baptism "on her own hook," she would bring forth no such medley, heterogeneous affair as that. What it would be, I don't think any living man, no matter how thrice illustrious he might be, could tell. Yet, that it would be original—*rara avis, sui generis*—who can doubt? One thing I do know, however, that those "god-mothers," and that "dipping," would certainly be left out.

And now, brethren, before I pass hence, permit me to state, with feelings, I trust, of true Masonic pride and gratitude, that the moral characters of Masons in your jurisdiction has been much improved by your wise and considerate action. The heaven is in the lump, brethren, let it work. Waver not—manifest no indifference—pass not the matter carelessly by; but press forward with fresh zeal and renewed energy, to the full accomplishment of your glorious purpose, that all the world may be made to know, that to be a Mason is to be a man, with clean lips, with unstained hands, with a true heart, and an intellect rejoicing in all its native strength and vigor. Thus shall the Square teach Morality—the Level, Equality—and the Plumb, rectitude of life.

I come now, brethren, to the consideration of a subject, which has apparently caused considerable excitement in the quarter where excitement was certainly needed, and which may be pressed upon your attention in such shape, as to argue the propriety of your beating a hasty, yet inglorious retreat from the strongly fortified position you took, at your last Communication. I refer to that anomalous class of Masons, styled non-affiliates, and the highly conservative resolution you adopted, with such commendable promptness and unanimity.

Your action, brethren, was based on the impregnable truth, that here there is no neutral ground. A Mason either has the right to become non-affiliated, or he has not. If he *has* the right, then it needs no elaboration of argument to prove that it is in conflict with every maxim of jurisprudence, with every doctrine of ethics, with all regulated liberty of thought and act, with the plainest dictates of common sense, to visit him with the

severest penalties of the law, which are designed to redress wrongs and punish offences, for the exercise of an undoubted, incontrovertible right. To concede to a Mason the right to choose the relation he shall sustain to the order, while you reserve a correlative right to deprive him of every privilege he enjoys, is the statement of a proposition, so contradictory in its relative parts, that it carries, upon its face, a refutation at once conclusive and overwhelming. (I do not lose sight of the facts, that there are rights arising out of contracts which may depend upon, and be qualified by conditions, either precedent or subsequent; but such a doctrine as that has no relevancy here, as may be plainly seen by observing that a man has the right to steal, provided he will afterwards accept thirty-nine lashes on his bare back;) and mark you, brethren, this right to punish for the exercise of a right, is nowhere defined and limited by any provision of the common law, so to speak, nor by any authoritative landmark, nor by any established usage, but only by the whim and caprice of the party, who, forsooth, considers himself aggrieved by this exercise of a right which he himself, not only recognizes, but has precedently conceded. Lame and impotent conclusion! If the poor drone has the right, why let him enjoy his Masonic laziness in peace, and "eat, drink and be merry," at industrious people's expense. If he has not, give him the lash, and put him to work, or else teach him, that he, who will not work, shall not eat.

But, brethren, does the Mason have any such right?

I am well aware that, in the treatment of this question, a swift resort has been had by mere apologists, to the abashing power of ridicule, to the pungent bitings of sarcasm, to the melting tenderness of appeals for policy, through the high social position, the polished gentility, the charming amiability and refined culture of some *men* who are worthless *Masons*; yet, brethren, to the contestant for truth, these shining weapons serve but as skirmishers and sharpshooters, who feel the enemy, discover his position, draw him out, irritate him to folly, harass, cajole, annoy and deceive—but never fight and win the battle. The battle is fought and won by sterner stuff than these. They are but aids to men who bear the brunt—splendid in their parts, but valueless of themselves. No brave and loyal soldier ever hauled down the flag of a well garrisoned stronghold, at the attack of such fragmentary columns as these, when a sharp sortie, or a few well directed cannon shot would drive them back as chaff before the wind.

I, therefore, repeat, has the Mason any such right? And this is a question, not of feeling, but of law.

To be good and true is the first lesson we are taught in Masonry—good in all the relations of life, and true to every obligation and duty, which these relations impose upon us. And this positive, virtuous injunction is constantly illustrated and enforced, both by the emblematic teachings and historic traditions of the order. The forceful and suggestive lesson of the bee-hive, reminds us that every drone should be thrust from the hive. The brilliant example of that amiable and exemplary character, whose memory we celebrate, whose virtues we are so eloquently exhorted to emulate, and who sealed his inflexible fidelity to his trust, by calmly and coura-

geously welcoming the grim tyrant, reminds us that Death should meet us in the faithful discharge of every duty. How touchingly beautiful right here, the ancient doctrine, "Once a Mason, always a Mason, and once a member always a member."

With these brief, but significant allusions, brethren, which your own skill may readily multiply, I ask, where can the law be found, which sets these teachings at naught, and abrogates, or modifies, the logical conclusions of our impressive and instructive ritual, written and unwritten? Can it be found in the old Constitution? No. Anderson tells us, no brother can withdraw from membership, except to join another Lodge, or to unite in the organization of a new one. Does Mitchell record it? No. The page of his erudite and discriminating work, is illuminated and adorned by this declaration of Masonic wisdom, justice, and fidelity—once a Mason always a Mason, and once a member always a member, is the doctrine of the ancient law. Does Mackey, illustrious for his comprehensiveness of research, and his copiousness of reference, bring it to light? No. He maintains, that non-affiliation is a violation of Masonic law, and the offender, if he refuses to abandon that position, may be tried and punished for it, even by expulsion, if deemed necessary and expedient. Where then can the law be found? Echo answers where? And criminals are silent in the midst of their confusion and guilt, while Echo, yet again, answers where?

The truth is, brethren, and we might just as well concede it, this startling innovation, this dangerous and corroding practice, has crept in among us, simply by inertness and cowardice, and not by any permissiveness or sanction of law. Attachment to principle, and zeal for the Institution, we profess to venerate so much in its purity and integrity, gave way under the pressure of men, whose influence blinded us, and whose opposition made us afraid. And now, what shall we do? We have tried persuasion—we have tried remonstrance—we have tried entreaty—we have tried gentle, and we have tried strong restorative means—and all have failed, as fail they should, because all were wrong. I say now—(what say you?)—cut the Gordian knot—thrust the drones from the hive—free the camp of deserters. Render to each his just due without distinction. Remember the beautiful virgin weeping over the broken column. Vindicate the law. Be good—be true—be faithful. Then shall the unbroken column, with no stragglers in the rear—no deserters in the woods—no traitors in the camp—march forward amid the universal refrain—Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth—and achieve victories, which shall surely exalt Virtue, and make Humanity glad. And this, brethren, is just what you have proposed to do. You have declared, following the plain reading of the law, that all non-affiliated Masons, who have dimitted from their Lodges, with the understanding express, or implied, that they would speedily re-connect themselves with other Lodges, must carry out that understanding, or become legally, what they are already, in fact, Masonically dead.

Your action, brethren, has been published to the world, passed through

the hands of other Grand Lodges, and been subjected to the accustomed criticism and scrutiny—and your judgment receives its highest commendation in the fact, that the weightiest objection against it, is to be found in the report of the Chairman of the Committee on Foreign Correspondence to the Grand Lodge of Missouri—and this is a little singular, as our distant brother's pertness of speech, facetiousness of manner, and sympathy for the printer, is much more noticeable than the certainty of his premises, the cogency of his reasoning, or the brilliancy of his conclusions. In the opinion of this brother, your resolution is "extraordinary" and "palpably unjust"—and why! "Because," says he, "we find that Masons have had the *legal right* to dimit, without giving any particular reason, and now, because they exercised that right they have got to be expelled." Would not the intended inference have been more tolerable, had the brother proved that Masons ever had the *legal right* to dimit. It would be well to state for the information of the brother, whose hasty desire to be witty seems to have concealed from him the fact, that to be successful in argument, his conclusions must not be based on premises, which take for granted the very point at issue. He should have proved first the legal right to dimit, in the unqualified sense in which he uses the word, which he cannot do, and which common courtesy requires us to believe he would have done, had he been able.

Besides, most of the Grand Lodges—and for aught I know the Grand Lodge of Missouri itself—deprive the non-affiliated Mason of all the rights and privileges of Masonry—would not the brother's consistency have been much better preserved, had he gone further, and assailed these Grand Lodges—and probably Missouri—in his own inimitable way, by re-stating his argument thus: We find that Masons have had the legal right to dimit, and now because they exercised it, they have got to be deprived of all the rights and privileges of Masonry. If our brother is not more circumspect and guarded in his conduct as a Mason, than in the delivery of his arguments, we fear that the "sword pointing to the naked heart," will measurably diminish his sympathy for the "Undertaker," which gushes forth from him so copiously in the conclusion of his report.

It may, however, be contended that the Lodge itself, in granting the dimit, conferred the legal right to dimit, and that, for this reason, the non-affiliated Mason occupies no unlawful position. Is the Lodge under the law, or above the law? Can the Lodge, by a violation of the law, make its own act of violation conformable to the law? Does breaking the law annul the law?

But enough, brethren, on this topic, vital, as it is, at this juncture, to Masonry in North Carolina. Let me pray you to take no step backward. Be firm in your impregnable purpose. You have already accomplished much good. Many have taken alarm at the approach of the coming storm, and have found shelter, where shelter ought only to be found, in the secure retreat of the Lodge itself. If there are others to whom our Institution, with its inseparable membership, has become so repugnant; or who are so obstinate in their determination to continue in their pres-

ent disorderly condition, that they will heed no remonstrance—be moved by no entreaty—be quickened by no warning—be obedient to no authority—why then, brethren, let them be cut off. They are but dead branches. They do us no good—we can do them no good. They are “rubbish,” let them be thrown aside.

The poet has told us

“—Error wounded writhes in pain,
And dies amid his worshippers.”

There may be writhings here, brethren; but let him die, and may no member of this Grand Lodge be found amid his worshippers.

It became my duty, at your last Communication, to decide, under the parliamentary rules governing your deliberations, upon the admissibility of the demand for the “previous question.” The favorable decision, which I then pronounced, has met with much comment and criticism; and, as it might be the establishment of a precedent, that may exert a decisive influence for good, or for evil, in your future transactions, it seems to be proper that it should now be submitted to the revision of your more enlightened judgment.

The “previous question” has been no especial favorite in North Carolina, the impression appearing to be that majorities, as such, possessed sufficient defensive strength without it, and that minorities alone, by reason of their comparative weakness, were entitled to what I shall style, a restrictive protection. Whether you partake of that impression, brethren, I know not; yet I am firmly convinced that, by existing rules, you have clearly made the “previous question” a part of your parliamentary law. That you had the power and the right to do so, I shall not permit myself to doubt even though frequent, yet inappropriate, allusion is made to the unquestioned inadmissibility of the rule in subordinate Lodges, where it would seem to have been excluded, and justly too, by reason of the assumed inability of the craft generally to deal with unfamiliar technicalities, without detriment to themselves, and the Fraternity at large. Yet, brethren, a Grand Lodge, with its modern organization, composed of men of varied experience and versatile talents, is purely a creature of conventionalism; and, being possessed of the exclusive legislative Masonic power, it would be irrational and impolitic to conclude that it could not avail itself of those rules, which the eminent wisdom and comprehensive experience of kindred bodies have proved to be invaluable, in conducting their deliberations to a just, enlightened and rapid determination. Your rules, brethren, have evidently been founded on this sensible idea; and, therefore, excepting motions to close and call off, which are analogous to motions to adjourn, you have determined that in all other respects, “Rules which generally govern deliberative assemblies, shall be observed.” The admissibility of the “previous question” becomes, then, not a question of law, but of fact. Is it a rule which generally governs deliberative assemblies? Knowing that it governed in the Federal Congress, and in the General Assembly of North Carolina, and, as I believed, in most other

deliberative assemblies, I promptly decided that it should govern here. The exception, too which I have quoted, fortifies this decision. Would not the motion to close and call off, which are clearly inadmissible in Subordinate Lodges, have been allowable here, but for the exception? Otherwise, why were they excepted?

But, brethren, whether I was right, or whether you believe the "Previous Question" incautiously, and not designedly, admitted into your rules, is a matter for you solely to decide.

I will not permit myself here to go into any elaborate discussion of the supposed advantages, or disadvantages, dependent on your decision. Much may be said on both sides. I will remark, however, that, in my judgment, both advantages and disadvantages are wholly contingent on the temper and disposition of the respective contestants. If the minority are always proof against a surly spirit, the previous question is useless and unnecessary. If the majority be not hasty and intemperate, it is of incalculable benefit, in subduing unreasonable and obstinate tenacity, in escaping tedious and profitless debate, in avoiding much needless consumption of time, which, in Grand Lodges where members receive no *per diem*, is of immense value. Whether then, brethren, after these skirmishing observations, the Grand Lodge of North Carolina is so constituted as to admit the "Previous Question," with or without benefit, I submit entirely to your judgment and knowledge of the motives and feelings which are most likely to prompt human conduct under provoking circumstances. I have no idea, however, that you can be warped by a prevalent prejudice, that such a rule is necessarily tyrannical, or unjust, *per se*, to the rights of a minority. You will calmly and discreetly, and wisely, consider its operations elsewhere, and, then, taking into account your own experience with the rule, and without the rule, come to a conclusion, which, no matter what it may be, will not be more acceptable to any than myself.

I regret, brethren, that it is not in my power to make any feasible recommendation in regard to the dissemination of the work throughout your jurisdiction. It is cause for much congratulation, that you have plighted your faith, and extended the assurance, to the Subordinate Lodges, that it shall undergo no change. But yet, brethren, the work, no matter how changeless it may be, must be disseminated. It is the very alphabet of Masonry. No more can the man be brought to a correct understanding, and scholarly appreciation of the true meaning and signification of the words of his own tongue, without being taught the varied sounds and scientific arrangement of letters, than can the Mason be lifted up to a proper standard of Masonic excellence and virtue, who has not the means, which the work supplies, of delving deep into the vastly productive mines of hidden treasure, which is being constantly found by the earnest explorer after sublime Masonic truth. The work, brethren, if I may be permitted to change the metaphor, gives to the Mason telescopic observations into worlds of truth, invisible to the naked eye, which arouse within him a curiosity to know more and more of the moral law of gravitation, which holds

man in his proper sphere of action, and links him fast, at a reverential distance, to the great central Sun of truth—Almighty God himself. And true views, too, of the enchanting scenes thus unfolded to the delighted eye, depend upon the nicety of mechanism, and precise adjustment, of the various lenses, which magnify to perceptibility the sparkling beauties which are spangling all around. The work, brethren, should, and must be disseminated, and correctly too, if Masonry ever becomes what Masonry was ever designed to be, the great symbolic teacher of the infinite wisdom of the Supreme Grand Master, in the adaptability of the moral law to the nature and wants of man, even in the independent relationship of man to man. I had supposed that a Masonic Lodge was organized primarily to dispense the work, and that a Masonic Lodge that could not, or would not, fulfil this primary object of its organization, did not deserve to retain a corporate existence as a Masonic Lodge. Afid, therefore, in the early part of my first official term, having taken pains to see that the work was uniform in the hands of all I commissioned to impart it, I at once required Subordinate Lodges, upon pain of forfeiture of their charters, to make themselves proficient in the phraseology and skilful in its use. The effort was attended by the most encouraging success, as I had the honor, heretofore, to report. But, brethren, you disarmed me of the conservative power which I was wielding so successfully, to compel Subordinate Lodges to fulfil the very primary object of their existence, and to make themselves in reality, what they were in name, Lodges of Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons. Pardon me now, if, with my strong conviction, that a thorough dissemination of the work necessarily precedes a general intelligent reception of the sublime moral truths of the Institution, I do warn this Grand Lodge, that this consummation, so devoutly to be wished, will never be attained without the use of compulsory appliances. Your past experience proves it. You have tried this plan, and that plan, but all in vain. You have appealed, you have persuaded, you have entreated—but all in vain. Appeals, and persuasions, and entreaties, to strong healthy, vigorous action, are all lost on the man enfeebled by disease. He must first be restored to health, even if he be forced to take copious draughts of the strongest and most nauseating doses. Brethren, it is a knowledge of the work, and a knowledge of the work only, that will restore our languishing Lodges to healthfulness of tone, to vigor and enterprise, to buoyancy of pride, to the all conquering strength of self-respect.

During my official terms, I have been called on to decide only one question upon which there is conflict of authority, and which could not have been easily decided by reference to the laws of the Grand Lodge, or to any, even the most obscure work of Masonic Jurisprudence. Oftentimes, the Grand Master in this respect, is subjected to much needless trouble and annoyance; and it would seem to be necessary and expedient to require Subordinate Lodges to have at hand an approved author, that the simple legal points, which are constantly arising, may be made of prompt and easy solution.

The question, to which I have referred is this: What vote is necessary to re-instate an indefinitely suspended Mason?

Suspensions are definite and indefinite. A majority can inflict either, and have the right to fix the time *instantly*, or leave it to be fixed at some future period. If a majority, then, has full power over the question of time permanently, and can fix it, *instantly*, or leave it to be fixed at some future period, can any possible reason be given, why, when that period arrives, it cannot fix it then? The circumstances being the same, it does seem, that the same power can accomplish next week what it can accomplish to-day.

Besides, I am not disposed to conclude that there is no difference, save in name, between indefinite suspension and expulsion, which would be the case if an unanimous vote were necessary to restoration.

Does it require an equal power to restore suspended animation, and to bring the dead to life?

For these reasons, briefly stated, I gave the opinion that, under existing law, which clothes a majority with power to suspend, a majority may re-instate.

This, brethren, is a mooted question—writers of celebrity and learning, arraying themselves on either side, as the weights of argument seems to them to preponderate. I leave it to your careful consideration and mature judgment as a question of much practical importance.

And now, brethren, I have done. I have finished my course. I lay down the trust you confided to my charge. Let him who takes it up with one hand, bear the *acacia* in the other. I would to God that I had had an angel's tongue, and a pen pointed with a diamond from the rich stores of heavenly treasure, that I might have impressed, on your minds and hearts, the most excellent tenets of an Institution, and the final accountability of that immortal part, within us, that bears the nearest affinity to the Supreme Intelligence of the Universe, and which can never, never, never, die!

As Time's wings have rapidly borne us on to the close of another year, let me affectionately remind you that the Hour Glass is an emblem of Time. "Behold! how swiftly the sands run, and how rapidly our lives are drawing to a close. We cannot, without astonishment, behold the little particles which are contained in this machine—how they pass away almost imperceptibly, and yet, to our surprise, in the short space of an hour they are all exhausted. Thus wastes man! To-day he puts forth the tender leaves of hope, to-morrow blossoms, and bears his blushing honors thick upon him, the next day comes a frost which nips the shoot, and when he thinks his greatness is still aspiring, he falls like autumn leaves to enrich our mother earth."

Brethren of the Grand Lodge of North Carolina, be diligent to attain unto the pure heart, "which is always an acceptable sacrifice to the Deity." Be ever "watchful and guarded in your thoughts, words and actions," that triumphant in a well grounded hope, and the assuring realization of a well-spent life, you may, "having been safely wafted over this tempestuous sea of troubles, be safely moored in that peaceful harbor, where the wicked cease from troubling, and the weary shall find rest."

And now, brethren, with a heart full of gratitude for your repeated kindness and partiality, and yet full of sorrow for my own short-comings, my own lack of fidelity to the noble lessons I have endeavored to impress upon you, and in view of the saddening probability that you shall never all be permitted to meet again in this terrestrial Lodge below, I give you my parting words—May God bless you, and make you good men and Masons, that there may be at least a blissful re-union in that upper sanctuary, the Celestial Lodge above where the Supreme Grand Master presides.

Finally brethren, in the discharge of our responsible duties, “May the blessing of Heaven rest upon us ; may brotherly love prevail, and every moral and social virtue cement us. Amen.”

Bro. C. T. Murphy moved that the thanks of the Grand Lodge be returned to the M. W. Grand Master for the very able and interesting address just delivered, and the question being put by the Deputy Grand Master the motion was unanimously adopted.

The Grand Secretary submitted the following as his annual report, which was read and referred to the Committee on his Books :

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

BRETHREN : I respectfully submit this report embracing such matters appertaining to the office of Grand Secretary as I felt it my duty to mention.

The usual number of copies of the Proceedings of the last Annual Communication was printed by direction of the Printing and Publishing Committee, and distributed among the Lodges of this jurisdiction, the several Grand Bodies with which we are in correspondence, and the present and Past Grand Officers of this Grand Lodge entitled to them by regulation.

By a comparison of the volumes of Proceedings of this Body published for several years past it can be readily seen that the size of the Proceedings increases with each year. This is occasioned principally by the increase of Lodges and the larger amount of business done at each successive Annual Communication.

Notwithstanding this, by effort on the part of the contractors and myself the Proceedings of the last Annual Communication were printed and distributed within quite a reasonable length of time. The mechanical part of the work speaks well for the contractors.

In compliance with a resolution of the last Annual Communication, I caused to be printed the number of copies of the Uniform Code of By-Laws for the government of the Subordinate Lodges, necessary to furnish each Lodge with twenty-five copies. This duty was performed as soon after the close of the last Annual Communication as practicable.

Since my last Annual Report the receipts into the Treasury amount to two thousand, eight hundred and thirty-five dollars and fifty cents, and were derived from sources as follows:

This amount has been paid to the Grand Treasurer, as shown by receipts from that officer, except the small amount received for diplomas and Grand Lodge Proceedings, which was applied to express freight on books for the library.

Fourteen new Lodges have been established during the year—thirteen under the Dispensation of the Grand Master and one under the Dispensation of the Deputy Grand Master, as follows:

Information has been received that Liberty Lodge, No 45, at Wilkesboro', Wilkes County, Person Lodge, No. 113, at Roxboro', Person County, and Pisgah Lodge, No. 200, at Hendersonville, Henderson County, have ceased to work. Their charters are forfeited under section 6 of Article IV of the By-Laws of the Grand Lodge. I have taken the necessary steps to get possession of the property belonging to these Lodges, consisting, as I learn, of a few articles, which can be easily transported.

Charters were granted to four new Lodges at the last Annual Communication, numbered from 308 to 311 both inclusive. The charters of Davie Lodge, No. 39, and Scotland Neck Lodge, No. 68, which were surrendered many years ago, were restored. These Lodges, are, as far as information has been received, regularly at work.

The number of Lodges now existing under this jurisdiction is two hundred and twenty-nine. Two hundred and thirteen are working under charters and sixteen under dispensations.

At the last Annual Communication a proposition was submitted to amend the Constitution of the Grand Lodge, as follows: By striking out the words "and the Grand Lecturers," in section 4 of Article II, and all of section 2 of Article VI.

In compliance with the directions of the Grand Lodge a circular letter, dated 6th of May last, was addressed to the Secretaries of the several Subordinate Lodges, calling the special attention of the Lodges to the proposed amendments, requesting action thereon, and a report of said action under the seal of the Lodge and signature of the Secretary, before the present Annual Communication. To this time comparatively few of the Secretaries have reported, and I am, therefore, unable now to state whether the amendments have been ratified or rejected.

If additional reports are received during this Communication a statement of the vote of the Lodges will be submitted.

I have received circular letters, purporting to emanate from official sources, announcing to this Body the organization of Grand Lodges in British Columbia and the Territory of Utah, which, with the Proceedings of the Conventions forming these Bodies, received since, have been referred to the Committee on Foreign Correspondence.

As Custodian of the Grand Lodge Library, I report that I have, by continued effort, added to the library forty-seven bound volumes, at an expense of only the cost of binding and a very small amount of express freight. The number of bound volumes now in the library is two hundred and fifty-four.

The collection of pamphlets, consisting principally of the Proceedings of the several Grand Bodies of the country, and Masonic Periodicals and Journals, is quite extensive, and will, if full sets can be procured, (and it is hoped that further effort will accomplish it) make many more rare and valuable volumes.

Owing to my high appreciation of, and the importance attaching to, enterprises of this kind throughout the country, I have made the library a subject for mention in my annual reports.

The attention given to the subject by Masonic Bodies generally has been the means of bringing to light, and preserving in an enduring form, the genuine history of the Order, particularly on this continent. I am glad to say that our own jurisdiction shares in the benefit of this work. Although our collection of bound Masonic works is not as large as desired, yet its value cannot be too highly estimated.

My cash book, showing the amounts in detail of moneys received from all sources, and ledger showing the state of the account of each Lodge, together with the book containing a record of the proceedings, are ready for the Committees that may be appointed to inspect them.

With my congratulations upon the favorable circumstances under which you again assemble, and the return of the occasion for the exchange

of fraternal greetings; and with the sincere hope that the legislation of this Communication may accomplish the end in view, to-wit: the promotion of the interests of the Order, this brief report is respectfully submitted.

The unanimous approval given by the Grand Lodge at its last Annual Communication to the action of its Treasurer in regard to that portion of the Grand Lodge building not used by its officers, induced me to make the same disposition of the rooms for the past year.

I desire to call the attention of the Grand Lodge to a resolution passed at the last Grand Communication, which reads as follows:—

Resolved, That the Grand Treasurer be authorized to subscribe for ten thousand dollars' worth of stock in the North Carolina Masonic Temple Association, and in order to meet this subscription, he be instructed to apply any balance in the Treasury, at the close of each Masonic fiscal year.

—and to ask this Grand Lodge to make an appropriation of a specific amount for this purpose, if it should be deemed advisable. The report of your Treasurer shows a specific amount on hand at the close of each Masonic fiscal year, but the demands upon the Treasury during the session and immediately upon the close of the Grand Lodge, are so large and pressing, and the dues of many Lodges so slow in coming in, that the Treasury is generally in a depleted condition, except during the session and soon after the close of the Grand Lodge, and a disbursement of the balance left from the previous year at the close of each fiscal year might produce embarrassment in paying the appropriations made at the Annual Communications. This has been very much the case in the past fiscal year, when a large portion of the dues of the Lodges was received only in the last two weeks of the Masonic fiscal year. In making a specific appropriation, therefore, the Grand Lodge could act with all the lights before them, and year by year pay over to the Masonic Temple Association according to the ability of the Grand Lodge Treasury, considered with regard to appropriations made at Annual Communications. I will add that but little time has been lost to the Masonic Temple Association if the Grand Lodge sees fit to

take no further action in the matter, as the first Masonic fiscal year after the passage of the resolution has just closed, and it will become the duty of the Grand Treasurer to pay over to the Treasurer of the Masonic Temple Association the sum of \$181 04, if no further action is had, that being the amount of the balance in the hands of the Grand Treasurer at the close of the past fiscal year.

Bro. B. I. Howze, from the Committee on claims against St. John's College, appointed at the last Annual Communication, submitted a verbal report, announcing that no claims had been presented to the Committee, and asked to be discharged. The Committee was discharged.

Bro. W. H. Smith moved that a similar committee be appointed in lieu of the one just discharged.

The motion was adopted and Bre. J. H. Mills, Simpson Barbee and John W. Cotten were appointed the committee.

Bro. B. I. Howze was, at his request, relieved from service on Committee No. 2, on Suspensions and Expulsions, and Bro. W. P. Williams was substituted.

Bro. B. F. Rogers introduced resolutions providing for the sale of St. John's College, the proceeds thereof to be applied to the payment of certain claims against said college, and the residue, if any, to be invested in the Masonic Temple, &c.

Bro. J. Q. Jackson presented as an amendment, to be inserted as the first of the series, a resolution rescinding the action of the Grand Lodge at its last Annual Communication, subscribing for stock in the Temple Association, which resolutions and amendment were laid on the table.

Bro. Geo. B. Harris introduced the following resolution, which was read and adopted :

Resolved, That all Master Masons now in the City of Raleigh, in good standing, members of regular Lodges, are invited to take seats in this Grand Body.

Bro. James Southgate introduced the following resolution, which was read and referred to Committee No. 3, on Charters and Dispensations :

Resolved, That the name of H. S. Lee Lodge, No. 308, be changed to that of Hall Lodge, and that the old number (53) of said Hall Lodge be restored.

Bro. H. H. Munson moved that a committee of three be appointed, to whom shall be referred all by-laws which may have been adopted by the Subordinate Lodges in addition to the Uniform Code of By-Laws.

The motion prevailed and Bre. John Nichols, J. H. Mills and James Southgate were appointed the committee.

Bro. Geo. B. Harris introduced a resolution providing for the sale of St. John's College to the State for a Lunatic Asylum, which was read, and, after discussion, laid on the table.

Bre. J. T. Littlejohn, B. F. Rogers and Solomon Pool were announced as the Committee on Appeals.

Bro. C. A. Cilley, J. G. W., moved that the resolutions of Bro. B. F. Rogers and amendment of Bro. J. Q. Jackson, in reference to the sale of St. John's College, be taken from the table. Not agreed to.

Bro. Cilley introduced the following resolution, which was read and adopted :

Resolved, That a committee of three be appointed by the chair, with instructions to report to this Grand Lodge some plan by which the Grand Master and Deputy Grand Master may be enabled to visit all Subordinate Lodges in this jurisdiction, with as little expense as possible.

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

The Board of Directors of St. John's College regret to report that they have failed to make any arrangements in establishing a school in this institution. After advertising for proposals to lease the property for a male or female school or college, they received but one application. The terms upon which the College offered was to this person, to-wit : \$500 per annum, was declined on the ground that the rent was too high. The Board has put

the building in charge of a competent gentleman, who resides on the premises, and supervises the property and pays a small rent. The buildings are now in a good state of preservation.

Bro. J. H. Mills was relieved from service on Committee No. 1, on Charters and Dispensations, and Bro. W. A. Philpott was substituted.

It being represented to the Grand Lodge that the brother having in charge the proceedings, &c., of Falling Creek Lodge, U. D., had been robbed of the same, the Grand Secretary was instructed to issue a duplicate dispensation, and upon the restoration of the Proceedings by the Secretary of the Lodge, the Committee on Charters and Dispensations was requested to investigate the claims of that Lodge to a charter.

The Grand Master announced to the Grand Lodge that he had just been informed of the death of R. W., William P. Taylor, Past Deputy Grand Master, Bre. James Reid, Past Grand Chaplain, and J. W. Howlett, an old and highly esteemed former member of this Grand Body, hence, the omission to make suitable mention thereof in his address.

Whereupon, Bro. R. W. Best, P. G. M., moved that a committee be appointed to prepare resolutions of respect to the memory of these departed brethren.

The motion was adopted unanimously, and Bre. R. W. Best, P. G. M., Thos. B. Carr and Solomon Pool were appointed the committee.

Bro. C. A. Cilley, J. G. W., introduced the following resolution :

Resolved, That the Grand Lodge appoint three Commissioners who shall proceed to advertise and sell St. John's College, either at public or private sale, to the State or to any person or persons, on such terms as they may think best, reporting their action to the next Grand Lodge, in order that they may then receive further instructions as to the disposition of the proceeds of sale.

Bro. J. H. Mills presented the following as a substitute for said resolution :

Resolved, 1. That St. John's College shall be made an asylum for the protection, training and education of indigent orphan children.

2. That this Grand Lodge will appropriate \$—— annually for the support of the institution, but will not assume any additional pecuniary responsibility.

3. That this Grand Lodge elect a Superintendent who shall control the institution and solicit contributions for its support from all classes of our people.

4. That orphan children in the said Asylum shall be fed and clothed, and shall receive such preparatory training and education as will prepare them for useful occupations and for the usual business transactions of life.

Pending discussion, the Grand Lodge proceeded to the consideration of the special order for this hour, (12 o'clock M.,) set apart at the last Annual Communication, being the following resolution :

Resolved, That all motions or resolutions, touching Masonic jurisprudence, shall lie over one day before the same is acted on, unless notice thereof in writing be given one day before its introduction.

The resolution was read and rejected.

The consideration of the resolutions in regard to St. John's College was resumed.

The question recurring on the substitute of Bro. J. H. Mills, the same was put and decided in the affirmative.

The proposition as thus amended was adopted.

Several propositions to fill the blank in the 2d resolution were submitted and rejected, when on motion of Bro. Sam'l A. Williams, *five hundred dollars* were inserted.

Bro. D. G. W. Ward, from Committee No. 1 on Charters and Dispensations, submitted the following report, which was read and adopted :

To the Most Worshipful Grand Lodge of North Carolina :

The Committee No. 1, on Charters and Dispensations, have examined the proceedings of Wilmington Lodge, working Under Dispensation, and find them correct, and recommend that a charter be granted to them. Also that their delegates be admitted as representatives on this floor.

Also, the proceedings of Selma Lodge, working Under Dispensa-

tion, and find them all correct, and recommend that a charter be granted to them. Also that their delegates be admitted as representatives on this floor.

The Grand Lodge has already expressed its high appreciation of the extraordinary value and ability of the Address. The firmness and persistency with which the Grand Master enforced the resolutions of this body against drunkenness and profanity, has greatly elevated the moral character of our noble institution. He has not required every Mason to be a saint, but he has clearly and forcefully shown that a demon cannot be a Mason. The Address also sounds a wise and timely warning against the danger and folly of confounding Masonry with any religious rite. No. 3, on Suspensions and Expulsions:

We, your Committee No. 3 on Suspensions and Expulsions, have looked into the case of Bro. Sebastian Bangert, of St. John's Lodge No. 3. Sentence,—indefinite suspension. We ask the Brethren of St. John's Lodge No. 3, in all the kindness of love and Charity to remit the "Indefinite" part of the sentence, and if consistent, to restore the Brother, who, from his letter, appears to be deeply penitent for having been intoxicated once or twice. He who spake as never man spake, forgave the erring Magdalene, and rebuked the impetuous Apostle Peter when he ordered him to forgive his brother, not seven times but seventy times seven. With these suggestions your committee can do nothing less than confirm the action of the Lodge below.

Mt. Pleasant Lodge, No. 157, in the matter of Erastus Ray. Habitual use of intoxicating spirits. Sentence—Expulsion. Your committee affirm the sentence.

In the matter of Franklin Lodge, No. 109, in the trial of J. L. Figurado and his expulsion, we confirm the action without comment.

In the matter of Bro. D. S. Fletcher, Mount Pleasant Lodge, No. 157. Indefinite suspension. Judgment is affirmed.

In the matter of Bro. P. C. Person, Franklinton Lodge, No. 123. Reprimand in open Lodge. Sustained by your Committee.

In the matter of Bro. J. W. Bellamy, from Franklinton Lodge, No. 123. Indefinite suspension. Your Committee report affirmed.

In the matter of Bro. Willis B. Sanderlin, Widow's Son Lodge, No. 75, we think the sentence extremely harsh, to-wit: Expulsion. The language used ought not to subject the brother to a greater punishment than dismemberment or suspension for a definite period. Your Committee therefore think that the sentence of the Lodge below ought to be revoked and judgment rendered in accordance with your Committee's report.

In the case of Bro. Thos. G. Craven, of Richland Creek Lodge, No. 291. Sentence—Expulsion. Your Committee think it a righteous decision in all and every respect.

We examined the case of Bro. Samuel Moore, of American George Lodge, No. 17. The sentence of Indefinite Suspension for habitual intoxication and profanity ought, in our opinion, to be confirmed.

Disobedience to summons from the proper authority, comes up from St. John's Lodge, No. 3, the offender, Bro. J. B. Henry, was suspended. We cheerfully affirm the sentence, since we see from the evidence that he could have attended if he had so desired, without detriment to his business.

Bro. Thos. F. Masters, charged with drunkenness, was expelled from St. John's Lodge, No. 96. We your committee see no reason why the judgment of the Lodge below should not be affirmed.

We have examined the case of Mt. Olivet Lodge vs. Ensley Loudermilk, in which the Lodge below thought proper to suspend indefinitely the brother. We think the sence too harsh. The matter in question was not, in our opinion, of sufficient importance to justify the sentence. We recommend, therefore, that the Lodge No. 195, restore Bro. Ensley Loudermilk to the privileges of Masonry under their local by-laws.
