*Resolved*, That a committee of three persons be appointed to purchase said Theatre, provided it does not sell for more than ——— dollars; and that they call on the Treasurer to execute a note for the purchase money, under the corporate seal, payable the 1st day of January, 1833, with interest.

The select committee to whom was referred the resolution of Brother Samuel T. Sawyer, directing them to confer with Hiram Lodge and Raleigh Chapter on the subject of purchasing the basement story of the Masonic Hall, and also the probable cost and terms of sale, have had the same under consideration, and beg leave to report,

That in regard to the first branch of the resolution directing them to confer with the officers of Hiram Lodge and Raleigh Chapter, held in the Grand Lodge room, in order to ascertain



whether they would co-operate with the Grand Lodge in effecting said purchase, your committee have been prevented by the inclemency of the weather and other causes from fully complying with this part of the subject; but from the indications made at the time of the introduction of the resolution, that the Chapter paid an annual rent for the use of the room, and that Hiram Lodge had neither the inclination nor the means, we have every reason to believe that no reliance or expectation can be made by the Grand Lodge for assistance in the purchase in that quarter. In regard to the expediency of the purchase and the amount and terms of sale, your committee submit the following extract of a letter received from the gentleman who has the management and control of this business: "I find that by the terms of the deed the trustee is authorised to sell at public or private sale." Upon consultation with him we have agreed that the Grand Lodge may have the basement story of the building for the amount due the Newbern Bank, which will be, on the 29th January, 1832, \$246 59. The payment can be arranged to meet the convenience of the Grand Lodge, with interest from the 29th of January, 1832. If the Grand Lodge do not accede to these terms the sale will take place at public auction in twenty days. From the foregoing letter it will be observed that the terms of sale can be made easy and accommodating to the Grand Lodge; and the only question of embarrassment to be decided is, is it expedient to make the purchase? and if so, is the amount demanded a reasonable one? All who have witnessed the inconvenience resulting to the Grand Lodge from the Theatre below, can have no hesitation in deciding this part of the question. Besides, it is now manifest that a sale must and will take place publicly or privately. Is it prudent that the Grand Lodge hazard a sale at public auction, when it is known that she is already interested and wishes to purchase the balance? May she not be compelled to give more than the property is worth, or suffer it to fall into other hands who may prove more troublesome than the Theatre has heretofore been? As to the price, your committee are not prepared to determine positively as to its reasonableness, but are inclined to the opinion it is not too much. At a former session of the Grand Lodge, perhaps winter before last, a similar committee was appointed—they ascertained the price then demanded to be 500 dollars. The sum now asked is less than one half the former charge, and we do not think it more than a fair valuation of the property, and would therefore recommend the adoption of the following resolution. All of which is respectfully submitted.

*Resolved*, That the Treasurer be directed to contract with the person or persons authorised to sell for the purchase of the basement story of the building in which the Grand Lodge is held, for the sum of \$246 59; and that he execute his bond to the Bank of Newbern for that sum, to be paid by instalments; and that he take a deed executed to the Grand Lodge for said purchase.

Which was ordered to lie upon the table till the next meeting.
