January - Carl Kornegay, chairman of the charity committee, was thanked by Oxford Orphanage for the Lodges' \$435 contribution and by the Masonic and Eastern Star Home for a contribution of \$120. The secretary reported that membership is now 176 and the Lodge has one entered apprentice. The WM informed the Lodge that the public installation of DeMolay was most impressive. J.K. Avent was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on January 19.

February - Brother S.T. Robeson talked on the background of George Washington's family. About 18 brethren traveled to Edenton to witness Brother Leslie Morgan receive the Third Degree.

March - A committee was appointed to investigate a lodge addition including an elevator shaft. It was reported that it would cost \$8,000 for labor and material to build the addition utilizing the vacant space between the Temple and Belk-Tylers, including the installation of an elevator shaft.

April - Bids were received for installation of the elevator and Monarch Elevator was awarded the bid. The Lodge voted to accept the recommendations and referred them to the Finance Committee for further action. At the Second Communication in April, the Lodge voted that the committee appointed to investigate the addition to the Temple and the installation of the elevator, to be an additional committee to serve with the present Building Committee, and proceed with their plans.

May - Brother M.J. Stokes, D.D.G.M. of the 18th Masonic District visited the Lodge. The Lodge was informed that the DeMolay held initiation on May 21 and John W. Cotton Chapter did good work.

June - It was carried that the Lodge attempt to establish a Blood Type Register for the benefit of the Lodge members should an emergency arise. The Satterthwaite brothers was given a vote of thanks for the new staff holders.

July - The Lodge did work in both the First and Third Degrees. Brother J.R. Satterthwaite, on behalf of Brother Amos Wooten's wife, presented him a Masonic Bible upon his raising to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. Brother Amos Woodrow Wooten was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on July 15.

August - Right Worshipful Brother Lester Haywood Gillikin, Senior Grand Warden of the Grand Lodge of North Carolina died on August 13.

It was moved and carried that the Lodge give 5 copies of the History of Concord Lodge to Edgecombe Memorial Library.

September - Brother J.R. Satterthwaite was appointed General Chairman of Ladies Night Committee.

Brother P.J.T. Rawlings, Jr. was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on September 14. An Emergent Communication was held on September 21 for conducting burial rites for John A. Knox who died September 19.

October - A discussion was held concerning the feasibility of a Masonic Burial Garden to be located in the Edgecombe Memorial Park Cemetary. No action was taken. The flue to the furnace was fixed. An Emergent Communication was held on September 7 for conducting burial rites for Brother Marion E. Dail who died September 5.

November - A special service was held at St. James Methodist Church for all masons on Sunday, November 15. Brother W.R. Keel urged all members to come out and support the DeMolay's Turkey Shoots by shooting for a turkey.

December - A committee was appointed to obtain a list of all widows and children under twelve and our disabled Brethren and that the Lodge allow the committee up to \$25 to remember them with cards for Christmas. Officers for 1960 were elected and installed. The Lodge decided to send its entire membership the Orphan's Friend for 1960.

January - Brother S.R. Satterthwaite reported that the DeMolay Chapter was in grave danger of losing its charter unless something could be done to improve attendance.

February - There is \$5,700 in the general fund. Mr. Speight had offered the Lodge two acres of land just beyond the Greenwood Cemetary for \$1,000 an acre. A committee of H.H. James, L.V. Conyers, and R.E. Sheffield was appointed to investigate and make a recommendation to the Lodge.

March - A bill for \$1.45 for a broom for the Lodge was ordered paid. The town has been contacted about changing the Lodge from commercial to residential electric rates. An Emergent was held on March 1 to conduct burial rites for Brother M.M. Marshall who died on February 29.

April - Brother R.E. Sheffield was appointed by the Grand Master to serve as D.D.G.M. of the 18th Masonic District. It was decided to investigate the condition of DeMolay and take appropriate action in the near future.

May - Rock stew was served for supper. A letter from Mohammed Grotto of Rocky Mount inviting all brethren to a barbecue chicken supper was read. Brothers M.S. Brown, Jr. and George Whitehurst were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in May.

June - Brother P.J.T. Rawlins gave some historical data regarding a Masonic Apron on display in one of the New English states.

July - Ballots were held for election to receive degrees for three who wished to join the Lodge. An Emergent was set for them to receive the First Degree.

August - H.H. James reported for the committee appointed to locate a site for the new Temple. After considerable investigation, the committee recommends that the Lodge accept a parcel of land located at the corner of Hope Lodge and Cedar Streets containing 1 1/2 acres or more which Miss Mary Austin and heirs of the late Charles T. Austin offered to give the Lodge for a new Temple. The vote will be taken in September. Brother R.L. Dunn, Jr. was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on August 31.

September - It was moved and carried that the Lodge accept the land offered by the Austin heirs for the purpose of erecting a new Temple. Brother R.E. Sheffield made his official visit as D.D.G.M. and urged each Mason to be found proficient in the work and given a card to prove his proficiency.

October - The Lodge voted to give one of its history books to be placed in the time capsule to be buried in the Town Commons to be opened in 100 years.

November - The Lodge voted to continue to send the Orphan's Friend to its entire membership. The Church Committee recommends that the Lodge attend First Baptist Church as a body on Sunday, November 20. Brothers I.M. Felton and A.L. Felton were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on November 22.

December - Officers for 1961 were elected and installed. The Lodge elected to send \$875 constituting an average of \$5 per member to Oxford Orphanage and \$150 as a contribution to the Masonic and Eastern Star Home.

January - It was decided to continue working with the John W. Cotton Chapter Order of DeMolay until it could be determined if the members wanted to keep the chapter alive. Committee appointments for the year were made by the Master. Brother Ernest G. Davenport was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on January 10.

February - A letter from Philips & Philips regarding the lot donated to the Lodge by the Austin heirs was read.

March - It was moved and carried to mail a membership list and a committee list to each member. The Lodge voted to pay \$133.89 insurance on the Temple. An Emergent was held on February 15 for conducting burial rites for brother J.H. Brown who died February 13.

April - Brother R.E. Sheffield gave a report on the 174th Annual Communication of the Grand Lodge Reports were given on DeMolay.

May - A rock fish stew was served for supper. After favorable action it was decided to purchase a new flag for the Lodge Hall from the Boy Scouts.

June - Brother M.S. Brown, Jr. was appointed overall Ladies Night chairman. Brother Sochia made interesting remarks concerning the work in Mass. Brother Frank E. Grayiel, Jr. was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on June 5th.

July - The Temple Committee was given permission to have the second floor painted at a cost not to exceed \$200.00. The Lodge was reminded of an upcoming lecture service.

August - The Lodge received an invitation from the O.E.S. to attend a picnic supper at the home of Mr. & Mrs. J.R. Satterthwaite.

September - A letter to Miss Mary Austin thanking her for the land donated to the Lodge was read. It was announced that Brother M.S. Brown, Jr. had passed the examination for and is now a Certified Lecturer. Brothers Jasper P. Sugg, Walter Eugene Roberson and Herman G. Leggett were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in September. Burial rites were held for Brother John Pearse who died September 28.

October - Brother R.E. Sheffield, D.D.G.M. of the 18th Masonic District, made an official visit to the Lodge. The Lodge elected to buy new aprons and gloves to be used for funerals and special occasions. Burial rites were held for Brother Albert N. Mason who died October 22.

November - It was reported that the DeMolay Chapter was making progress and that initiation of new members would be held this month. One hundred dollars was given to the chapter by the Lodge to operate.

December - Election of officers for 1962 was held and officers were installed. Brother W.R. Keel was appointed as temporary DeMolay advisor for Brother A.L. Felton until May at Brother Felton's request.

January - A committee was appointed to study the selling of the present building and building a new one. Brother Herschel McBride was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on January 8.

February - Officers for 1962 were installed. The Lodge organized a fund drive for contributions to the George Washington National Memorial at Alexandria, VA. Brother Jessie A. Barnhill was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on February 27.

March - Brother Alvin Moore gave a brief resume about the Eye Bank. A motion was made and carried to let the DeMolay sell key chains to make money.

April - H.H. James, A.F. Felton and L.G. Sheffield were appointed as a committee to check into the feasibility of building a new lodge on the site donated to the Lodge.

May - Each brother was urged to donate \$1.00 toward the George Washington National Masonic Memorial.

June - There was degree work in the First and Second Degrees. Brother H.H. James was given power to pursue clearing up the deed of trust for the Temple.

July - The secretary was authorized to obtain all papers necessary for the admission of one of our brethren into the Masonic and Eastern Star Home. Brothers Edgar E. Mayo, John G. Andrews and William C. Pulley were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in July.

August - Brother Conyers brought up for discussion the property at North Tarboro that we have an option on and what we plan to do with it. Brother R.E. Sheffield D.D.G.M. 18th Masonic District notified the Lodge that he would make his official visit to the Lodge in September.

September - Brother J.G. Raby gave the brethren some highlights of his life in masonry as he celebrated his 50th anniversary in masonry in June. An Emergent Communication was held on September 21 to conduct burial rites for Brother O.O. Boykin who died on September 19.

October - Brother James reported that the deed of trust issued in 1923 against the Lodge has been cancelled in the Register of Deeds office as of October 3, 1962.

November - The 17th and 18th Masonic District Meeting was held on November 13, 1962 at Tarboro, N.C. Brother J.C. Peel was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on November 19.

December - Officers for 1963 were elected and installed. The Lodge voted to add \$350.00 to the \$500 already collected to bring the total donation to Oxford Orphanage to an average of four dollars per member.

January - A committee was appointed to investigate the purchase of an elevator from the old hospital that the Lodge could purchase for \$200.00 plus about \$600.00 for the removal of the elevator.

February - The Elevator Committee reported that an architect had been contacted and was working on the project. A school of instruction was held. Brother R.L. Dunn became a K.C.C.H. in the Scottish Rite.

March - Murray Brisson, an architect reported to the Lodge that an elevator and an additional office would cost \$18,000. A motion carried to get all necessary papers required to dissolve the Joseph W. Cotton Chapter of DeMolay.

April - The Building Committee's recommendation to go ahead with the installation of the elevator and additional offices at an estimated \$32,000 was moved and carried by vote of the Lodge. May - The Building Committee reported that the revised sketches for the addition to the Temple had been turned over to the architect, and arrangements for financing the addition were being made. Brother J.L. Bullock was reported seriously ill in the hospital. Brother Edward H. Marrow, Sr. demitted.

June - A motion was made and carried unanimously that a resolution be adopted authorizing the borrowing of \$25,000 and securing the payment of the same for the construction of the Temple addition. Brother Elmer Leo Everette was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on June 11, 1963.

July - The Grand Lodge approved the construction of the Temple addition and was expected to be completed in the first quarter of 1964.

August - Progress was being made on converting the boiler from oil to gas. Brothers R.E. Sheffield, E.L. Everette, and H.H. James gave a report on a visit they made recently to the Lodge in Halifax County.

September - Brother Alvin Earl Armstrong was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on September 16. A school of instruction was announced for next month.

October - Walter Hook Associates Architects wrote a detailed letter to the Lodge explaining in detail all aspects of the proposed elevator building program. There are so many factors contributing to the high increase over the original estimate that the architect firm recommended that for the same amount of money, a new one story Lodge could be built.

November - A letter was written to Walter Hooks Associates thanking them for the service rendered in the proposed building program. Brother C.B. Martin of Stonewall Lodge #296 of Robersonville and Tarboro School Superintendent gave a talk on the history of education in Tarboro. A minute of silent prayer was observed in memorial of the untimely death of U.S. President John F. Kennedy on Friday, November 22, 1963.

A motion was carried that the Treasurer be empowered to pay all utility bills.

December- Officers for the ensuing year were elected.

January - The Lodge decided to continue the Feed Committee and reimburse the chairman for any amount due not received from members. An Emergent Communication was called to conduct burial rites for Brother Herman G. Leggett who died Friday, January 17, 1964. The annual reports for 1963 were submitted and approved.

February - W.M. read a definition of "Obligation" for education. J.E. Simmons, Jr., was reported sick in the hospital. Willie Keel reported that he had carried a group of DeMolay up to Raleigh last week.

March - Brothers Robert H. Sneed and Willie D. Strawbridge were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on March 10, 1964. Brothers W.R. Keel and M.S. Brown, Jr., were appointed to secure fire extinguishers for the Lodge building.

April - Brother Allen W. Harrell of Wilson Lodge #712 gave a talk on the dignity of the Masonic Degrees. Past Masters Night was celebrated on April 14, and all Past Masters were recognized. Brother J.C. Liles died April 20, 1964.

May - Brothers Keel, Kornegay and Ellrod escorted 21 young men of DeMolay to Morehead City for the weekend. Brother A.F. Felton reported highlights of the Grand Lodge meeting he attended. Brother J.R. Satterthwaite reported on Camp Rainbow and informed the brethren that a library had been erected in memory of Brother J. Howard Brown.

June - Brother Jack Andrews reported that he visited Henderson Lodge #229 to witness the conferring of the Master Mason Degree.

July - In July Emergent Communications were called for conducting masonic burial rites for Brothers J. Roland Davis and Homer Zirkle. Brother R.E. Sheffield gave a talk on the relationship between government and mankind.

August - The Lodge voted to assist the Shriners in a parade in Tarboro in October. DeMolay had a successful dance at the Moose Lodge chaperoned by Brothers W.R. Keel, C. Kornegay, L.M. Brock, J.L. Satterthwaite and M.S. Brown, Jr.

September - Brother W.C. Baker, PM., made a short talk concerning the workings of the Lodge many years ago. The Lodge received a letter from Huguenot Lodge #381, Tottenville, Staten Island, N.Y. informing the brethren of the death of Brother William S. Long.

October - The Lodge hosted the District Meeting for the 5th, 18th, and 20th districts.

November - Brother Conyers reported that he attended DeMolay and was impressed with the young men. Brother L.E. Raskin collected \$626.00 for the Oxford Orphanage.

December - The John W. Cotton Chapter of the Order of DeMolay met with the Lodge for supper. Lodge officers for 1965 were elected and installed.

February - Brother J.J. Cummings reported on the installation of a telephone in the Temple. The Temple Committee was given authority to have some work done on the second floor. The brethren were invited to attend DeMolay meetings.

March - Brother James reported that the second floor work had been completed with a materials cost of \$230.00. Brother Joe Fryer is a patient in Wilson Memorial Hospital.

April - Masonic Education Programs included laws concerning our actions as Masons and an article entitled "I Believe". Brothers Zeb Cummings and Ernest Davenport were reported in the hospital sick.

May - Brother Carl Kornegay stressed the importance of DeMolay and announced that several of the brethren would take members of DeMolay to the beach for the weekend.

June - Brothers W.R. Keel, Tom Elrod and Jimmy Fleming chaperoned the DeMolay trip to the coast. Work was done in the First Degree.

July - Masonic burial rites were held for Brother Roscoe B. Sharpe who died on July 23. Brother John A. Alford, Junior Grand Deacon of the Grand Lodge of Japan gave a talk on masonry to the Lodge.

August - Brother Allen Ray Forrest was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on August 10. There were four Lodge Communications in August with degree work in the First and Third Degrees.

September - Brother Alvin Armstrong was appointed chairman of the Ladies Night banquet. Brother Howard C. Hux was reported home from the hospital.

October - Brothers Turner Felton and Jon Felton were elected to membership in the Lodge. Brother Ernest E. Ward was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on October 21. Brother Wilbur Cox D.D.G.L. gave a short talk concerning changes in the OSW.

November - Brother Ralph H. Percival was elected restored to membership after exclusion for NPD. Brother Carl Kornegay gave a talk on the responsibilities of a committee of investigation and the importance of the proper performance of their duties.

February - Brother M.S. Brown, Jr. reported the Committee on Masonic Education was holding coaching sessions at the Temple two nights weekly.

March - John Sanderson and Billy Wilder were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on March 3, 1966. Wayman Jerry Holcomb was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on March 14, 1966. Brother Charles Lockhart spoke to the Lodge about the state and local beef cattle program.

April - Brother W.R. Keel received the DeMolay Cross of Honor Award, one of the highest honors that can be conferred on a Master Mason by the Order of DeMolay. Brother Silas D. Fuller of Rocky Mount was announced to have been appointed District Deputy Grand Master of the 18th Masonic District.

May - Jack Bobbitt and Rossie Pittman were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on May 4, 1966. C.B. Martin, Superintendent of City Schools gave a presentation on the public school system.

June - A film on highway safety was shown. Brother George Brown was reported to be a surgical patient in Duke Hospital.

July - Brother H.H. James was empowered to purchase louvers for our window fans. The Eastern Star picnic was held at the home of Dot and Carl Kornegay.

August - The Lodge attended First Baptist Church and enjoyed an excellent service. The Building Committee was given authority to have painting and repairing done as needed.

September - Brother M.S. Brown, Jr. announced a lecture service to be held.

October - The Lodge was reminded of the new registration and the importance of registering to vote. Brother J.R. Satterthwaite reported that 19 made a trip to Oxford Orphanage. They had dinner with the children and then had a tour of the campus.

November - Billy Wilder was thanked for the excellent job he did as Ladies Night chairman for the most successful ladies night. Turner Felton was thanked for the job he did as emcee.

December - Officers for 1967 were elected and installed. Brother Henry Harvey James was elected to life membership in the Lodge because of his many contributions of time and talents to the Lodge.

of business pertinent to the Lodge. Brother G.W. Edwards gave remarks and presented the Lodge with the Grand Master's Award.

September - An emergent communication was called on September 3, 1974 for the purpose of conducting Masonic burial rites for Brother Henry Harvey James, Sr. who died September 2, 1974. On September 10, 1974 Brothers Robert F. Isley and Oliver Stevens Surles were received and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason. On September 24, Brother Julian L. A motion was carried to send checks for \$1500 to the Orphanage and \$1000 to the Masonic and Eastern Star Home. Election of officers for 1975 was held. The following, receiving a majority of the votes cast, were declared elected for the ensuing year: Rudy A. Allsbrook, WM.; James M. Fleming, SW; Eugene Roberson, JW; T.E. Stirewalt, Treasurer; and James L. Alford, Secretary. The brethren officially thanked Brother R.E. Sheffield for service rendered the Lodge through the office of secretary. Brother J.J. Cummings was thanked for the fine and dedicated job he had done while serving the Lodge as treasurer.

A motion was made, seconded, and passed at the first stated communication to remit the dues of our 50-year veterans: Brothers N.P. Battle, W.G. Clark, Jr., R.V. Knight, and J.W. Wiggins, Jr. Brother J.J. Cummings was given a vote of thanks for his many years of service as Treasurer of Concord Lodge.

February - The Secretary reported on the death of Brother Ivey Otto Hucks who died on January 30 and was buried on February 1 in Burlington, N.C. A letter was received from the Grand Secretary informing the Lodge that Brother Warner Baughman, Jr., had demitted to Asheboro Lodge #699 on February 20. Brothers J. Monte Bishop and Linwood R. Langley were elected to membership through affiliation.

March - Brother Dalton Rackley reported for the Building Committee. Land prices were read and a great variation was found. Brother Rackley made a motion that the firm offer to the Austin heirs for the property near Thorne's new store be accepted. After much discussion, a motion was made to table the issue until the First Stated Communication in April for clarification of Grand Lodge rules for the purchase of property. This motion was passed and the issue tabled until April.

April - The matter of the purchase of land for a new Masonic Lodge was brought up after having been tabled since the First Stated Communication in March. A substitute motion to "not" buy the proposed property was made and seconded. Much discussion was heard for both sides of the proposal. A ballot was taken and the motion was defeated. A vote was taken on the original motion to purchase the property of the Austin heirs near the new Thorne's Drug Store on Hospital Drive. The motion passed and the land is to be purchased upon completion of details by the Board of Trustees and the Finance Committee.

May - A letter from Brother Robert L. Pugh, chairman of the 76 Committee, was read to the Lodge. Brother Pugh's letter was to inform the Lodge of the proposed monument in the Town Commons to commemorate the founding of The Grand Lodge of North Carolina in Tarboro. Brother Grover Edwards, DEC of the 18th Masonic District, gave a program on the Education program of our district and informed the Lodge that Concord Lodge qualified for the Grand Master's Award for 1974.

June - The W.M. called an emergent communication for June 20 at 7:00 p.m. for conferring of the Third Degree by a full-dress team from Greenville. Brothers T.P. Williamson, John Norville, Ronald Weeks, and Jerome Bostic (Greenville courtesy) were received and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in due and ancient form. The W.M. informed the Lodge of the plan of the Bicentennial Memorial to be placed in the Commons. President Gerald Ford, Thirty-Three Degree, has been asked to be the key speaker at the unveiling.

July - An emergent communication was held on July 5 for the purpose of conducting Masonic burial rites for Brother Joshua Lee Satterthwaite who died on July 4. At the Second Stated Communication, a letter was read from Brother Robert Pugh to Representative L.H. Fountain concerning the presidential visit for the Masonic Celebration in 1976. A motion was made, seconded and passed that letters from Concord Lodge and the other five lodges in our district to be sent to President Ford inviting him to speak at the up-coming event.

August - Brothers Willie Mears, Robert G. Brock, and T.P. Williamson were recognized for a job well done in preparing letters to President Ford and to the other Lodges in our district.

September - The annual dues were changed to \$12.00, effective January 1, 1976. Brothers Tommie Vaden, Robert McBride, Cecil Wilkins and Gerald Perry were received and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in due and ancient form.

October - The W.M. read a letter from Brother Robert Pugh to the Postmaster of Tarboro requesting a cancellation stamp stating "The Grand Lodge of A.F. & A.M. of N.C. Founded, Tarborough, N.C. 1787". The stamp will be used for a 30-day period next year during the month of the dedication of the memorial in the Commons. A motion was made, seconded and passed to purchase presentation paper aprons embossed with the American Eagle for 1776-1976. These aprons are to be presented to each member of the Lodge next year as a means for celebrating the bicentennial of our Lodge.

November - Brother James Alford gave a brief reading of some of the "Rights and Privileges" of Masonry. He tied these to some of the thoughts the public may have because of or inspite of the actions of some of the Master Masons in performing their duties according to their "Rights".

January - Brother Willie Mears gave a report on the Bicentennial Committee reporting that programs would be presented at the First Stated Communication each month this year of the bicentennial. He asked for assistance and input on ideas for the July 4 special meeting. Brother Mears requested that Brothers Rudy Allsbrook, Hartwell Fuller, and T.P. Williamson be allowed to use the East to present the first of the bicentennial programs for the year. The program "Birth of A Nation" consisted of the reading of the Declaration of Independence followed by a talk outlining some of the events leading to the final document and its signing. A request was granted to Brother Albert Wiggins that his 50-year award be presented in Concord Lodge. Brother Wiggins was raised in Concord Lodge and also served as Master. Checks for \$1500 and \$750 were sent to Oxford Orphanage and the Masonic and Eastern Star Home respectively.

February - Brother Willie Mears reported for the Bicentennial Committee that President Gerald Ford would be unable to attend the up-coming Grand Lodge meeting. Senator Sam Ervin is to be the keynote speaker and the date of the unveiling of the monument in the Town Commons would be April 17. Brother Rudy Allsbrook reported for the Temple Committee than in consulting several construction people, the general condition and structure of the Lodge is sound. The committee is preparing a report as to the several options which will be available to the Lodge. Brother Willie Mears reported that the Grand Lodge meeting scheduled in Tarboro for April 17 would be changed to March 27. A motion was made and passed to invite all 397 lodges in North Carolina to participate in the Bicentennial event.

March - Brother Rudy Allsbrook reported for the Temple Committee that the roof and parapets had been repaired at a cost of \$2900. Inside repairs to the front ceiling were done at no cost by the roofing contractor. Insurance will cover \$1080 which is one-half of the \$2160 estimate on the roof replacement with a \$50 deductible for windstorm damage. The W.M. congratulated the Temple Committee on their quick work in getting the roof repaired. A notice was read to the Lodge of an Emergent Communication of the G.L. to be held in Tarboro March 27, 1976 at 1:30 p.m. for the purpose of unveiling the Historical Marker in the Town Commons.

April - Brothers Carlton Owens and Charles B. McIntyre were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in due and ancient form on April 13. The secretary announced that bicentennial aprons, programs of the G.L. emergent communication and copies of the Daily Southerner were available to the Brethren. The Temple Committee reported that a tenant on the first floor was available on a five-year lease and repairs would be required on the plumbing, electrical, venting system, and windows. The committee presented a tentative budget for building renovation of \$30,000 with a guaranteed income of

\$300 budget per month. A motion was made and passed that the \$30,000 budget be approved and that the committee be given the authority to proceed. The secretary announced that Hubert Earl Brown, Jr. had been raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason by courtesy of Ionic Lodge #145 in Reisterstown, MD. on April 9, 1976.

May - A proposal for honorary membership for Brother Joe Kerman was read and received in the Lodge. It was proposed for his unfailing assistance in any work the Lodge requested of him. Brother Grover Edwards, D.E.C., was recognized and presented to the W.M. the G.M. Award for 1975. He complimented the Lodge on its work and challenged the Lodge to continue as one of the leading lodges in the district.

June - A proposal for Honorary Membership was read for Brother Joe Kerman after the prescribed waiting period. No objections being heard, a ballot was spread and Brother Kerman was duly elected to Honorary Membership in Concord Lodge.

July - The Committee of Investigation on the application for affiliation of Brother Charles Roger Hale reported. A ballot was spread and Brother Hale was duly elected to membership. A letter was read from Brother Robert Pugh, '76 Chairman, expressing concern for the condition of the monument in the Town Commons. He requested that an inquiry be made to the Town about the lights and a water line to use to wash the monument. Brothers Jim Alford reported that Mr. Chapman of the Town had been requested to check on the lights and also a water line to the site. Mr. Chapman assured him he would take care of both requests.

August - Brothers Frank Sefcik, Spencer Etheridge, and Jimmie Keel were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in due and ancient form on August 10. Brother Robert Brock, assisted by Brothers Hartwell Fuller, Carlton Owens, and Jim Alford, presented a bicentennial Masonic education program on one of the founding fathers of our country, M.M. Benjamin Franklin.

September - Brother J.J. Cummings presented to the Lodge "The American's Creed" which he obtained from the Grand Lodge of Georgia. The W.M. thanked Brother Cummings for the gift and received it on behalf of the Lodge. A bicentennial Masonic education program, "Our Masonic Presidents", was presented by the officers of the Lodge, assisted by several other brethren.

October - Brother Robert F. Thompson, Jr.'s application for affiliation was approved by the Lodge. Brother Leonard Ex Noble was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in due and ancient form on October 12. Brother Jim Alford announced that Brother Noble was the 200th member of Concord Lodge on our country's bicentennial year. It was reported that Brother Sigmund T. Robeson died on October 21. Brother Julian Cleveland presented a bicentennial Masonic education program entitled "Masons of the American Revolution".

November - The W.M. announced that the Historical Society had requested the Lodge to supply something for the "Time Capsule" if we so desired. Brother Willie Mears was appointed to make suggestions for appropriate items to be placed in the capsule. A motion was passed to remit the dues of the following 50-year members: Brothers Newsome P. Battle, W.G. Clark, Jr., R.V. Knight, P.J.T. Rawlins, and J.W. Wiggins. Brother Robert Brock presented a bicentennial Masonic education program on "The Tenets of Masonry". The program pointed out the three principal tenets of Masonry: Friendship, Morality, and Brotherly Love.

December - Brother Dalton Rackley reported that approximately 40% of the membership had contributed to Oxford Orphanage. Brother Earl Stirewalt reported that approximately \$1500 had been collected for the Oxford Orphanage and \$500 to the Masonic and Eastern Star Home. Brother Hartwell Fuller presented a Masonic education program on balloting and its importance on the fraternity. The annual election of officers was duly held for 1977.

January - On January 7, 1977, the elected and appointed officers, being found proficient, were duly installed for the ensuing year. Brother Dalton Rackley, reporting for the Temple Committee, proposed that action be taken on the seven-year lease agreement to Volume Merchandizing, Inc. at the greater of \$400 per month or 4 1/2% of monthly gross sales. The Temple Committee was empowered to proceed. Fifteen thousand dollars, to be taken from savings, was approved for use by the committee for renovation of the first floor, stairwell, and building front. Brother Jimmie Fleming expressed great appreciation to Brothers Dalton Rackley, Rudy Allsbrook, and Raymond Whitehurst for their untiring efforts on the Temple Committee.

February - Brother Robert Brock presented a Masonic education program entitled "What is Free Masonry". Free Masonry was defined as well as the teachings of Masonry through brotherhood and duties to God, country, neighbor, and self. Brother Hartwell Fuller presented a Masonic education program on the symbols of Masonry and expounded on the purposes and meanings of selected Masonic symbols. Brother Robert Brock and Brother Hartwell Fuller were recognized for their work in refinishing the Wardens columns as well as the "Porch" columns used in the Second Degree.

March - Brother Rudy Allsbrook of the Temple Committee thanked all who had worked in cleaning the basement and taking down the walls on the first floor. Books on the First and Thirty-Second Degrees, found by Brother Willie Mears during the cleaning of the basement, were presented to the Lodge for storage in the archives.

April - Brother Hartwell Fuller read the following report from the Grand Lodge program pertaining to the erection of the historical marker placed in the Town Commons on March 27, 1976.

REPORT AND ROSTER

This series of meeting was inter-spiced with what was perhaps that most significant event on the Grand Lodge level for the '76 celebrations. This took place in Tarboro on Saturday, March 27, 1976, with the unveiling of an historical marker on the Tarboro Commons with an elaborate program, which was statewide in its application. The Grand Lodge of North Carolina was founded in the Town of Tarboro in December of 1787 and yet that act had never been marked or commemorated in any way in that delightful town. The '76 Committee of the Grand Lodge resolved that this should be one of the highlights of the year's celebrations and during the year 1972 it began making plans to that end. Fortunately, the committee enjoyed the wholehearted cooperation of the Tarboro Town officials and also the Historical Society without whose wonderful assistance the program never could have been enacted. Concord Lodge No. 58 deserves the utmost credit for the manner in which it participated in the formulation and in the execution of the plans for that auspicious event. The program began on that day, March 27, with a parade in which all of the Shrine units in North Carolina participated as well as the dignitaries connected with

the program. A luncheon was served by the Chef Crew of Sudan Temple and the Grand Lodge opened at two o'clock in the afternoon in the auditorium of St. James United Methodist Church. After closing the Grand Lodge, the assembled Masons then formed a procession and marched to the Town Common where an appropriate program was presented. There was a program of patriotic music by the Chanters of Oasis Temple which was beautiful; there was a proclamation issued by the Grand Master; then there followed a beautiful and appropriate address by the distinguished former Senator and brother Mason, Sam J. Ervin, Jr. The ceremony of unveiling came next, a moment that had been anticipated by all and upon a given signal the Grand Master and his daughter, Miss Carol Noble, advanced to the marker and with dignity unveiled it. The marker was, and is, a joy to behold, beautiful in every respect, and worthy of all the admiration that could possibly be given to it. It represents a great achievement and Brother John Conway and his able assistants in Greenville who had charge of the construction of the marker deserve the commendation of all Masons in North Carolina. Into the marker before it had been erected there had been placed a copper cylinder in which mementos and souvenirs from each of the nine Lodges that participated in the organization of the Grand Lodge in Tarboro in 1787 had been placed. There were mementos also from Concord Lodge No. 58 of Tarboro and, appropriately, mementos from the Grand Lodge itself. All of these mementos were placed in the copper container, sealed, and deposited within the large rectanglar base of the historical marker. It is hoped that one hundred years from now the capsule , or container, might be re-opened and a comparison made of conditions in the year 2076 as related to 1976 and 1776.

On that occasion - and subsequently also in the '76 Committee's report to the Grand Lodge of North Carolina presented, April 1976 to the Grand Lodge, and approved at that time - that in the year 1987, when the Grand Lodge itself will have reached its two hundredth birthday, the Grand Lodge would return to the beautiful little town of Tarboro and there it would hold a two hundredth anniversary celebration that would be worthy of the marvelous history of Masonry in North Carolina.

Also, on the Grand Lodge level, the '76 Committee prepared silver and bronze coins for sale among the brethren. There were 1,000 of the silver coins and 15,000 of the bronze coins, all of which have been received and have been distributed among the brethren.

It was announced that Brother William Joseph Bateman died April 14. Brother Rudy Allsbrook reported the signing of the lease to Volume Merchandising, Inc. with an occupancy date of July 1.

May - Brother Joe Kerman, D.D.G.L., was welcomed on his official visit to the Lodge on May 10. Brother Spencer Etheridge gave a Masonic education program on the history of Concord Lodge and the history of Masonry in North Carolina. Brother Jim Alford, D.E.C., was recognized and presented the Lodge the Grand Master Award for 1976. Along with the award, he presented Brother Jim Fleming, P.M., a pin for the Grand Master Award.

June - Brother Henry Donald Hamilton was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in due and ancient form on June 14.

July - Brother Jesse Felton, D.D.G.M., presented a Masonic education program on the Masonic Funeral. He stated that three parts of the service should always be given, even in inclement weather. These parts include the Apron, the Evergreen, and the Committal. He concluded the program by going through the procedure and phases of conducting a funeral service. A motion was made and passed to have necessary repairs made to the carpet on the Lodge floor and the bathrooms. A motion was made and passed for the Lodge to sponsor three children from our jurisdiction to Oxford Orphanage. Brother Donald Sizemore, Director of Admissions at the orphanage, was authorized to investigate the home situation and determine the status of the children in question.

August - Brother Henry D. Hamilton was presented to the East for examination on the Catechism of the Third Degree. Brother Danny Herring conducted the exam and the W.M. announced it satisfactory. A letter was read from Monroe Lodge No. 244 stating they had conducted a Masonic Funeral for Brother Curtis H. Ross, Jr., on August 6, 1977. A memorial gift will be sent to Oxford Orphanage in his memory.

A general discussion was held on attendance and why it is so low. Several questions were raised as to how we may encourage more fellowship, and how we may obtain more support for Oxford Orphanage and the Masonic and Eastern Star Home. It was discussed that the Lodge should have a planned program for the activities to encourage and use the talents of members of Concord Lodge.

September - Petitions for admission to Oxford Orphanage were approved for the three McDonald children. Brother Turner Felton, chairman of the Finance Committee, reported on the financial condition of the Lodge and the need for an increase in dues. He proposed that dues to cover operating expenses be raised from \$12.00 to \$18.00 per year, effective January 1, 1978. A motion was made and passed to this effect. Brother Hartwell Fuller presented a Masonic education program on the "Principal Tenets of a Master Mason: Brotherly Love, Relief, and Truth".

October - On October 5, 1977, an emergent communication was called for the purpose of conducting a Masonic burial ceremony for Brother Jimmie Wiley O'Neal who died on October 3, 1977.

The amendment to the By-Laws to increase the dues to \$18.00 per year was read a second time, it having laid over the prescribed lunar month. A ballot was taken and the amendment passed. On October 25, 1977, Brother Richard Williams was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in due and ancient form.

November - Brother Julian Cleveland presented a Masonic education program on some of the definitions of Free Masonry. He developed several of the key words which make up the doctrines and beliefs of Free Masonry. A motion was made and passed to increase the Treasurer's allowance to \$150.00 per year. A motion was made and passed to increase the Secretary's allowance by \$50.00. It was announced that these increases would become effective January 1, 1978.

December - Brother Dalton Rackley, chairman of the Oxford Orphanage and Masonic and Eastern Star Home Committee, recommended that \$1216.00 be sent to the Oxford Orphanage and \$608.00 be sent to the Masonic and Eastern Home. A motion was made and passed to this effect and Brother Rackley was commended for leadership in the project. A letter of demit for Brother Herbert Andy Powell was read and the W.M. granted the demit to Brother Powell to join Roman Eagle Lodge No. 122 in Danville, Virginia.1978

January - On January 6, 1978, the elected and appointed officers, being found proficient, were duly installed for the ensuing year. The W.M. announced that a monthly Lodge newsletter would be initiated to inform the Brethren of Lodge activities. Two brethren having completed 25 years of continuous Masonic service were recognized. Brother Carl Kornegay and Brother William R. Ward were conducted before the alter and the W.M. presented them certificates and pins.

February - On February 14, 1978, Brother R. V. Knight, having completed 60 years of continous Masonic service, was presented the Diamond Jubilee Award by Brother J. R. Satterwaite, P.M. Brother Satterwaite ordered the Secretary to read the Masonic history of Brother Knight which is as follows:

Initiated E.A. May 8, 1917

Passed E.C. October 23, 1917

Raised M.M. February 12, 1918

Brother Satterwaite, after prayer, presented Brother Knight the certificate and pin of the award. Brother Knight was escorted to the East and remained there for the honor. Brother Rudolph Sexton read a statement for Brother Knight due to the emotion of the event. After hearing the statement, no member could have left the Lodge untouched. On February 28, 1978, Brother Tom Phillips was admitted and raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in due and ancient form.

March - Brother Hartwell Fuller presented a Masonic education program entitled "Wise Master Builder". The talk was about the building of our spiritual and moral body, that building which endures all material buildings. He spoke further of using our Masonic wisdom to become Master Builders. Brother Dalton Rackley gave a Masonic education program on the scripture for the M.M. Degree (Ecclesiastes 12: 1-7). Brother Willie Mears, W.M., and Brother Dalton Rackley shared some of their impressions of their visit to Royal White Heart Lodge No. 2 in Halifax. It is the oldest Lodge in use in the United States. An emergent communication was held on March 31, 1978, to provide Masonic rites for Brother James Perry Satterwaite, who died on March 29.

April - The W.M. accepted from Brother J. J. Cummings a placard commemorating the 200th Birthday of the United States. The W.M. announced the placard would be placed in an appropriate place within the Lodge. On April 11, 1978, Brother Milton Moye and Sam Dean were recognized for 50 years of Masonic service. The W.M. ordered Brothers Moye and Dean to be escorted to the Alter. He then recognized Brother Vernon Conyers, P.D.D.G.M., who presented the pins and certificates to the honored brothers.

May - Brother Carlton Owens gave a Masonic education program on the rights of people in the world to freedom and how America stands as a great symbol of freedom to the world. He stated that we must continue to defend these rights or lose them and that we must ever be mindful of our duty to be loyal to our country and our faith in God.

June - On June 13, 1978, M.W. Brother Leslie H. Gardner, P.G.M., presented a program entitled "What Can a Mason Tell a Non-Mason". He defined Freemasonry as an organization teaching good men to be better through the belief in the Fatherhood of God and the Brotherhood of Man. He stressed the importance of "his own free will and accord" in reference to membership. He stressed that Masonry is not a religion but that Masons are a religious people. Masonry is not a secret organization but rather an organization with secrets stressing that these secrets are of a nature that will make each Mason want to live better lives - showing the high value placed on living a life of high morals.

July - A letter was read from the G.L. approving the G.L. District Meeting to be held in Tarboro on September 7 at the First Baptist Church. Brother Dalton Rackley, chairman of the Temple Committee, requested authority for the Temple Committee to repair the temple stairwell. A motion was made and passed to that effect.

August - Brothers Robert Brock and Hartwell Fuller presented a Masonic education program on the E.A. Degree. It covered the historial meaning of the degree from the operative point of view. Then the privileges and limitations of the apprentice from the speculative viewpoint were covered. The symbolism attached to the entry of the candidate into the Lodge and the reception were discussed, as were the other rituals.

As a matter of unfinished business, the W.M. brought to the floor the discussion of purchasing aprons for the officers at an approximate cost of \$450.00. After discussion, the motion passed.

September - An emergent communication was called on September 7, 1978, for the purpose of hosting the G.M.'s District Meeting. M.W. Brother Jacob C. Goodman, Jr., G.M., spoke on the subject of "Responsibilities of a Mason". Masons from the 17th and 18th Masonic Districts were in attendance with 107 being present.

Brothers Carlton Owens, Robert Brock, and Hartwell Fuller presented a Masonic education program on the F.C. Degree. The program ranged from the ancient operative to the present speculative meanings of the degree.

October - Brother Dalton Rackley reported for the Temple Committee that the repairs to the Temple had been completed. He made a motion that the repair bills be paid and that the Temple account be closed. The motion passed.

November - The W.M. announced that the Lodge building had been appraised for insurance purposes at a value of \$125.00. A motion was passed that coverage be increased to that amount or 80% as necessary for full coverage. Brother Dalton Rackley of the Oxford Orphanage Committee reported that 70 members had contributed \$1300.00. Brother O.S. Parks was presented the Masonic Service Award for 25 years of continuous membership. Brother Parks made a few comments on the high ideals of Masonry and how proud he was to have been a part of the order.

December - Brother Sam Satterthwaite presented to the Lodge an apron belonging to deceased Brother D.O. Boykin who was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason on January 30, 1923.

At an Emergent Communication on December 14, 1978, Brothers George M. Stewart and Guilford Hollis were raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason in due and ancient form. Brother Stewart and Hollis gave a belief response of their gratitude at the honor of being raised to this Sublime Degree. Brother R.C. Speight, P.M. and grandfather of Brother Stewart, expressed his pleasure at seeing his grandson raised in the same Lodge in which he received his degrees and in which he had served as Master.

A motion was made and passed to issue 1979 dues cards to the following 50-year members: Brothers N.P. Battle, W.G. Clark, J.S. Dean, R.V. Knight, M.J. Moye, P.J.T. Rawlins, and J.W. Wiggins. On January 24, 1979, an Emergent Communication was called for the purpose of conferring last Masonic Rites to Brother James Wright Wiggins who died on January 22, 1979.

February - As a matter of unfinished business, the old officers' aprons were not auctioned, but are to be displayed in the Lodge. The aprons were purchased June 14, 1949. It was announced that Brother D. Frank Horn died on February 13, 1979. A motion was made and passed that the two front offices on the second floor be renovated by members of the Lodge. Brother Hartwell Fuller presented a Masonic education program on "Masonry and Religion".

March - Brother Willie Mears was escorted to the Alter and was presented a P.M. Jewel. Brother Spencer Etheridge was recognized and thanked for his service as Orientation Chairman. A letter of appreciation to Brother L.E. Raskins for his contributions to Masonry was read.
