Obituary

Mr. Coy Augustus Brooks, the son of the late Nathaniel Brooks and Cora Mae Ferguson Brooks was born in Chatham County on July 31, 1922 and departed this life on September 24, 1996 in Chatham Hospital in Siler City, North Carolina.

At an early age he became a member of Lamberts Chapel Baptist Church and later before departing this life he accepted Jesus Christ as his personal savior. September 7, 1943 he joined the military and was a World War II veteran. He was given the American Theater Campaign Ribbon, Good Conduct Medal and Victory Ribbon and received an honorable discharge on March 9, 1946.
