Mr. Harrell, a native of Ahoskie, N.C., was the son of John D. Harrell, Sr. of Durham, and the late Blanche Slaughter Harrell. He was the husband of Fannie Johnson Harrell.

He was educated in Hertford County Schools and was a graduate of Robert. L. Vann High School. Mr. Harrell received the Bachelor of Science and Master of Science degrees from North Carolina Central University and did post graduate study at the University of Iowa and the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. He began his teaching career at Southern University in Baton Rouge, La., and N.C. A & T State University in Greensboro, N.C. Before retiring from NCCU in December 1993 after 33 years of service, he was an Assistant Professor of Mathematics and was a former Director of the Data Processing Center. He received many academic awards but his proudest achievement was his selection as an Outstanding Teacher Award at NCCU.

Mr. Harrell's many civic affiliations include charter membership in the Phi Beta Sigma fraternity and recognition in 1979 as Father of the Year, chosen by the Durham Merchants Association and active participation with the Edgemont Community. He was an Army veteran of the Korean War.

He was a member of White Rock Baptist Church where he served on the Deacon Board, Trustee Board, Finance Committee, Budget Committee, and was chairman of the Scholarship and Communion Committees. He was a member of the Miles Mark Fisher Sunday School class and was the leader of the Oakwood Park District. He started a tutoring program in which he participated for fifteen years.
