

In 1934, he married the former Anna Grady, who survives. One daughter was born to this union.

In 1936 he joined the Mount Vernon Baptist Church, where he was a member for many years. Reverend Reaves preached his trial sermon in 1943. In later years he joined the Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church where he was a faithful, loyal, devoted, and conscientious member.

As a member of the Doric Masonic Lodge #28, Reverend Reaves was a willing worker and participant. He was a member of the Cape Fear Conference "B" Division. He served as assistant pastor of the Oak Grove Free Will Baptist Church under the leadership of the late Reverend W. F. Cox and under the present pastor, the Reverend Z. D. Harris, until his death on December 18, 1960 in the Veterans Hospital at 10:30 P. M.


