

#### **OBITUARY FOR WENDELL C. SOMERVILLE**

He Died While Climbing

Dr. Wendell C. Somerville, a charismatic preacher and zealous advocate for Christianity, was born March 10, 1900 in Reidsville, North Carolina into a family deeply rooted in the ministry of the Gospel. His father, the Reverend Clanton Clay Somerville and his maternal uncle, Reverend C. S. Brown, were among the founders of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention, an organization devoted to fulfilling the Great Commission.

On February 12, 1918, Wendell Somerville enrolled in the Navy, where he served until his honorable discharge on September 30, 1921.

At the age of 27, Wendell Clay Somerville received the call to preach, and on April 22, 1927 he was ordained in the Mill Neck Baptist Church of Como, North Carolina by a council consisting of representatives from seven churches. He, thereafter, pastored the First Baptist Church of Rocky Mount, North Carolina, and, in 1934, served as the first full-time Executive Secretary for the General Baptist State Convention of North Carolina.

Clad in a borrowed black suit, Reverend Somerville married Alice Earl Cooper on September 4, 1924. The one dollar and fifty cents marriage license, which legally sealed their union, was blessed, and the Somervilles' marriage thrived for more than 73 years until his death parted them in this life.

When the mantle of Executive Secretary of the Lott Carey Baptist Foreign Mission Convention fell upon Dr. Somerville's shoulders in September 1940, he embraced the call with vigor and commitment, serving until his retirement in 1995. He was thereafter unanimously elected Executive Secretary-Treasurer Emeritus, an office he held until his death. During his active tenure in office, he traveled extensively, making 28 trips abroad and one around the world; all the time spreading the Word and working tirelessly in God's vineyard. In his travels, he was personally received by such world leaders as Emperor Haile Selassie of Ethiopia, Presidents William Tubman and William A. Tolbert of Liberia, Prime Minister Kwame Nkruma of Ghana, Prime Minister Forbes Burnham of Guyana, and President Gita and Prime Ministers Jawaharlal Nehru and Indira Ghandi of India.

Reverend Somerville matriculated at Shaw University, receiving the Bachelor of Arts and Bachelor of Divinity degrees. He earned his Master of Arts degree at Oberlin College. During the presidency of Dr. Mordecai Johnson in 1960, Howard University awarded Dr. Somerville the Doctor of Laws degree, acknowledging and applauding his service to God's call:

Howard University salutes you with esteem and affection, Wendell Clay Somerville . . . . Pure hearted leadership like yours is the bread of life for our Negro people. For newly developed people wherever they are in the world, it is such leadership alone which can inspire them and lead them to know how to use their cooperative power for great and worthy ends.

Dr. Somerville received numerous awards and accolades during his long and active life, including being designated as a "Kentucky Colonel" by the State of Kentucky in 1977, decorated by the Liberian government for his service to its people, and named "Man of the Year" by the Negro College Fund's Washington Inter-Alumni Council in 1970. His many affiliations include, the National Council of Churches, the International Missionary Council, the Baptist World Alliance, and the Omega Psi Phi Fraternity.

Wendell Clay Somerville departed this life on Sunday, December 28, 1997, after a brief illness at his Washington, DC home.

He leaves to cherish his memory, his devoted wife, Alice Cooper Somerville, nieces, nephews, the Lott Carey family, and other relatives and friends.

Wendell Clay Somerville's divinely guided preachments, humorous anecdotes, witticism, and tall imposing handsome stature had a tremendous influence for good upon the lives of those he touched, men, women, and youth alike. His life was an embodiment and testimony to his Divine Assignment—and nothing nor anyone could separate him from it and the everlasting burden of his song:

A charge to keep I have; a God to glorify
A never dying soul to save and fit it for the sky.
To serve the present age, my calling to fulfill
O may it all my power engage, to do my Master's will.




