2. Is there a meeting-house yet

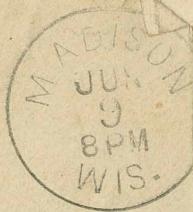
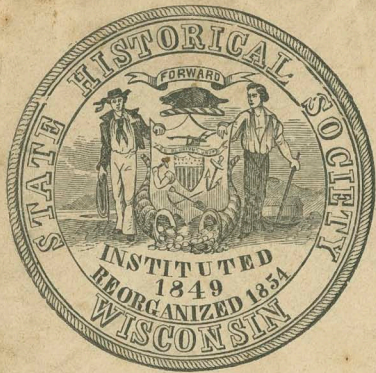
near by - to what denomination?
