He was born December 20, 1918, at Avoca Plantation, Merry Hill, N.C. He was pre- ceded in death by his wife of 61 years, Eugenia Shuford Capehart. Mr. Capehart was a veteran of World War II serving as a lieutenant in the Army Air Force of the United States. He was a pilot of B-17 Bombers, was shot down and was a prisoner of war in the German POW camp, Stalag 1 for 18 months. He was awarded the Purple Heart.

Mr. Capehart's business ca- reer spanned 35 years with Exxon Corp. as an industrial salesman. He retired in 1980.
