Cotton, tobacco, and other farm products held temporarily for market, or in the hands of original producers, may be listed under head of solvent credits, and any debts owing deducted from their value, so that the State has provided every reason why the taxpayer should make a full and free disclosure of all his personal property, including solvent credits of all kinds, and has placed in the hands of the Supervisors adequate machinery to require that this shall be done, and to acquire the information if he has reason to believe that a full disclosure has not been made.
