What are the motives for giving? Love of God? Gratitude? Overcoming of self-centeredness? Underlying all these, however, is the Christian standard, which is to give of oneself out of concern for others and to help bring the kingdom of God into the lives of men.


This is true for the whole church as well as for the individuals who make up that church. Stewardship without mission is hopeless, and mission without stewardship is helpless.

In the whole denomination the average congregation gives 85 per cent for local expenses and only 15 per cent for others. This is far short of the goal of "as much for others as for ourselves." By these standards, is the church really *giving* of its resources, or is it merely taking money out of one pocket and putting it into another?

Providing for ourselves is not enough. We must give for others in the name of Christ, as a matter of Christian stewardship.
