GOD in His infinite wisdom and divine love, sent an angel of mercy to call to eternal rest, *Magdalene Enoch Wade* on Saturday, March 4, 2006. "Mag" as family and friends affectionately knew her, slipped away quietly and peacefully while the family she loved mournfully stood by her side.

Magdalene Enoch Wade, daughter of the late Ida Mae (Daye) Enoch and the late Dan Enoch, was born in Caswell County, North Carolina on September 23, 1907. One of eleven children (three sisters and seven brothers, all of whom preceded her in death) Mag was without reservation the family matriarch who with watchful eyes maintained the cohesiveness of the Enoch Klan as well as many extended families.

Raised in Caswell County and later relocating to Alamance County, Mag was joined in holy matrimony to the late Bruce Wade in 1930. They were married 36 years before Bruce's death (November 15, 1966) and together they raised two children--a dedicated, devoted biological son Donnell Wade and a loving, loyal daughter Montroes Enoch Hunter. Although she was primarily a homemaker, Mag also worked in a domestic capacity at Ben L. Smith High School in Greensboro, North Carolina. Mag had a reputation of being a very hard-working, committed and trustworthy employee.

Mag loved the Lord and had a deep and abiding faith in GOD. While in Alamance County, Mag attended Martin's Chapel Baptist Church in Mebane, North Carolina and in the early seventies, became a member of Saint Paul Baptist Church in Greensboro, North Carolina where she served diligently as a nurse's aid, and was a faithful member until her health began to fail.

GOD blessed Mag with an incredible gift of strength, fortitude, feistiness and love that touched everyone who knew her. Always governing as a strong disciplinarian with eyes that would put you in your place, Mag was known to have a *no nonsense*, "tell it like it is" spirit --you never had to second-guess where she was coming from! To know her was to know that Mag found immense pleasure in cooking – and what a cook she was. Known for her mouth-watering biscuits, sweet potato pies and pound cake, Mag's fried chicken and fried fish were second to none. With hospitality in hand and a stove that was always ready to burn, a good meal at Mag's house was a known fact. She will always be remembered by her family and friends for her unconditional love and the strong sense of family values she embraced.

Mag leaves to cherish her precious memories one son, Donnell Wade; one daughter, Montroes Enoch Hunter; an exceptionally, committed daughter-in-law, Linda Jordan Wade; five grandchildren, Rhonda Michelle Wade and Bruce Donnell Wade of the home, Timothy Wade (Charmaine), Ronnie Lea and Jernice Lea (Vernon); five great grandchildren, Mitchell, Courtney, LaTashia, Rodney and Hala; and two great-great grandchildren, Taylor and Kai. "Aunt Mag" will forever be loved and cherished by a host of beloved nieces, nephews, relatives and friends. Because of her loving heart and generous spirit, she was an adopted mother, grandmother and aunt to many, both near and far.

There are no words to describe the true depth of our grief with the loss of our most beloved mother, grandmother, aunt, and our greatest champion. She will be sorely missed. We praise and thank GOD for bestowing upon us the rare and profound precious gift of that courageous, magnificent spirit we knew as "MAMA" and "MAG".
