

William Pretty, Jr. walked in the principle of stewardship which is God's plan to fulfill our lives so that we will abound having all our needs met and meet the needs of others.

William Pretty, Jr., excelled in this principle. He ended his walk on Sunday, September 28, 2003 at UNC Hospital in Chapel Hill, North Carolina at the age of fifty-nine years.

He was the first child born to William Pretty, Sr., and the late Lovie Pretty of Raleigh, North Carolina on November 11, 1943. His entire life was devoted to spiritual, family, civic, academic and political endeavors.

As a young lad, he became a member of First Baptist Church, Raleigh, North Carolina, where he actively participated in Christian youth training. This early training helped to cultivate his philanthropic character that established the standard for his vision for life.

He was a graduate of J.W. Ligon High School Raleigh, North Carolina. After graduation, he matriculated at Shaw University, Raleigh, North Carolina, receiving a Bachelor of Science Degree. While attending the university, he met and married his long-time companion, Mildred Southerland, whom he referred to as "Mill." To their union, two sons were born, Reginald Fitzgerald and Furney Lavone. Later they became the proud grandparents of three beautiful granddaughters; Gabriella, Alexondria, and Isabella. They were the "apple of Bill's eye."

The Prettys moved to Sanford, North Carolina in 1978 to open the first McDonald's on Horner Boulevard. Later, a second store was opened on Spring Lane. As a McDonald's entrepreneur, Bill's name became a household word.

Bill had a special rapport with young people and always went out of his way to nurture them. His motto was, "The work experience, no matter how short is very valuable." To support his motto, even when overstaffed, young people were employed at McDonald's. He served as a mentor for youth at local elementary schools.

In the Sanford Community/Lee County, altruistic endeavors were well-known through the Fuel Fund for the Elderly, Headstart, Disaster Relief Fund and many church functions. In addition to his charitable contributions, he was active politically.

Because of his long-term commitment to education and humanitarian endeavors, he was selected to be a member of the Board of Trustees of Shaw University, and on November 22, 2002, an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters was bestowed upon him.

He was a faithful steward of First Calvary Baptist Church from the time he moved to the Sanford Community until his passing away. Bill was active in the Sunday School, Bible Study and regular worship. He served as Vice-Chairman of the trustee board and a member of the Benevolent, Finance and Budget Committees. Being proud of both Shaw University and his church, Bill's latest undertaking was to implement "Shaw Day" at the church scheduled for October 19, 2003. This project will provide scholarships and grants-in-aid for underprivileged students wanting to study at Shaw.

Bill was a true humanitarian in his walk as a steward. His love for mankind and his outreaching personality created many valuable and long-lasting relationships with all people.

Left to cherish precious memories are his father, William Pretty, Sr.; wife, Mildred Southerland Pretty; two sons, Reginald F. and his wife Antress, Furney and his wife Mary Beth; three grandchildren, Gabriella, Alexondria, and Isabella; one brother, Milton Pretty; three sisters, Glenda Wilkins, Vanessa Dunn and Beverlyn Pretty; a beloved mother-in-law, Geneva Southerland; brothers-in-law, David Southerland (Laurinda); Erwin Southerland (Jackie), and William Southerland (Brenda); sister-in-law Martha Southerland Waymon (Joe) and a host of nieces, nephews and friends.
