



A Time To Be Born... it was on August 28, 1937 in Siler City, North Carolina that Bettye Moffitt-Person was born to the late Dora L. Spinks and Robert Moffitt Sr. Bettye was one of five born to that union; Sisters and brothers include Wilmer, Allie (deceased) Robert Jr. (deceased), Larry Moffitt and Pearl Marsh Degraffenreidt (deceased foster child). Bettye grew up to be a beautiful woman. She was educated in the Chatham County School System in Siler City, North Carolina.

Which Is Planted... it was on April 5, 1955 she was blessed with a very dedicated and faithful son "Anthony" who always stayed faithfully by his mother's side throughout her illness unto death.
