

Lizzie Beatrice Headen Glover, born October 25, 1909, was the daughter of the late Will Chavis and Ina Headen. She was placed in the orphanage at Oxford, North Carolina at an early age after her parents death. While in Oxford, she attended the Mary Potter School. She left the orphanage at the age of 18.

Years later she met and married the late Percy Lee Glover in 1931. To this union seven children were born.

She joined Corinth A.M.E. Zion Church in 1929, and began working as a Sunday School Teacher. Other positions she held in the church were President of Pastor's Aid Board, Class Leader for children and President of Missionary Board. She represented the church in many capacities over her lifetime. She was very active in all church related activities.

Mrs. Lizzie was also active in community affairs. She was responsible for naming the neighborhood Lincoln Heights and served on the committee to name Chatham High School. She was involved in school activities such as PTA, Band Parents and Athletic Booster Club.

She was a charter member of both The Round Dozen Club and The Order Of The eastern Star, where she served for 19 years as Secretary and later Worthy Matron.

Throughout her lifetime she served on various committees, participated in contests, attended conferences and other events that are too numerous to name.

Everyone was welcomed in her home and she never met a stranger. She served as surrogate mother to the Headen family, her friends and neighbors.

Through all these under takings she always put God first. She felt that her humble life was not in vain.

She was preceded in death by two children, Ernestine Brown and Ronald Glover.

She left behind, to mourn; her loving children, Gladys Glover and Elizabeth Ray of New York, James Glover of California, Donald Glover of Hawaii, Norma McLean of Georgia, and Edris Glover of the home; a host of grandchildren, great grandchildren and great great grandchildren.
