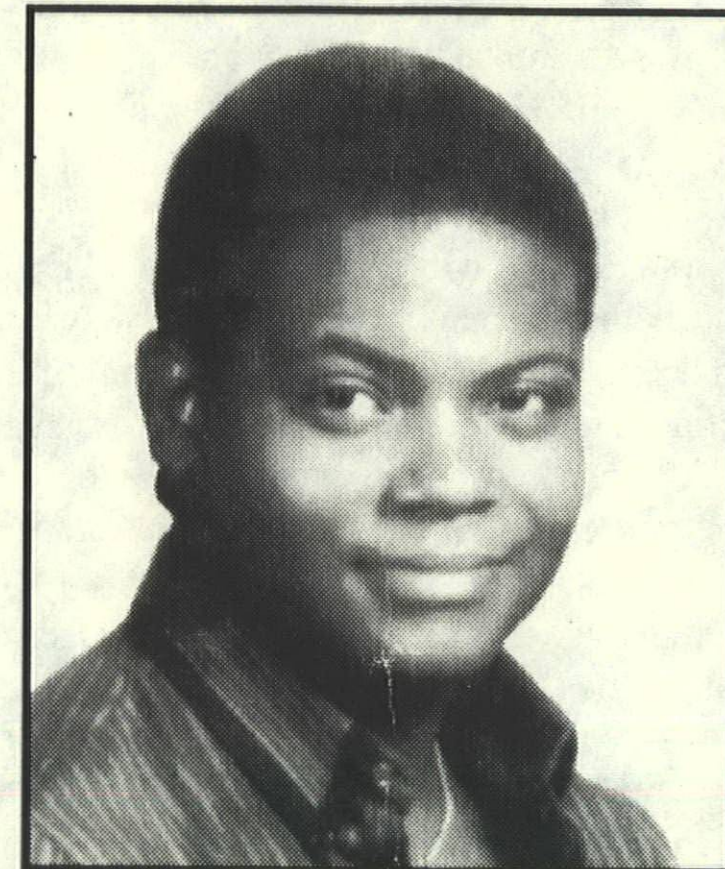

## The Obituary
