Sylvania C. Herring entered into eternal rest Thursday

evening, December 7, 2000, at Wayne Memorial Hospital.

Sylvania was born in Randolph County on January 7, 1928 to the late James Manley and Donna McDaniel Cheek. Sylvania was one of twelve children, three boys and nine girls, with five siblings preceding her in death.

She completed high school in Randolph County and received her B.S. Degree in Elementary Education from Elizabeth City State University. She completed graduate training in Library Science at North Carolina Central University with further training at North Carolina A & T State University.

She was married to James L. Herring on December 27, 1950. To this union was born one daughter at Fort Still, Oklahoma, Donna Bonita Herring Moore. Sylvania and Bonita were not only mother and daughter, but friends. Bonita gave Sylvania the gift of her grandson, Leron, who was her greatest joy in her later years.

Sylvania was reared at Cox Chapel Methodist Church in Randolph County where she remained a faithful member. After marrying, she joined her husband at Peter's Tabernacle Missionary Baptist Church in the Iron Mine Community of Wallace, North Carolina.

Sylvania taught school in Randolph and Sampson Counties, later served as Librarian in Sampson County, and retired in 1987 as a Media Specialist in Wayne County. After thirteen years in retirement, she returned to work part-time in August as an instructor at Wayne Community College and remained there until her passing.
