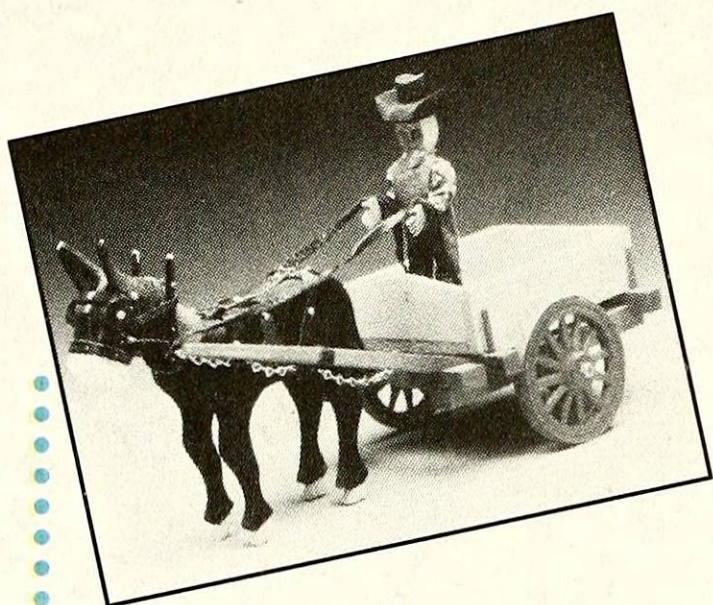
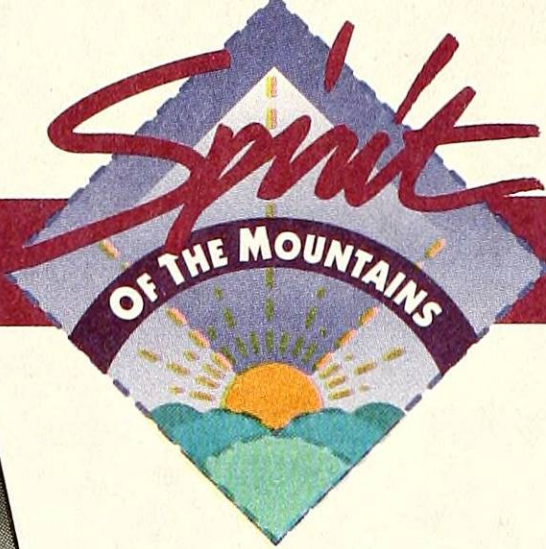

**T**he Appalachian mountain region of the Carolinas is rich in tradition and creativity.

"Spirit of the Mountains" is a nearly two-month long celebration of Appalachian culture at Spirit Square. Through the very personal, often enlightening photographs of Robert Amberg, the vibrant patchwork quilts of Ora Watson or the versatile flatpicking of her celebrated nephew, Doc Watson—through a series of workshops, exhibits and performances, Spirit Square hopes to share a vision of mountain culture through art created by and

about the people who have kept this vibrant culture alive— a culture reflected as succinctly in the fiddle playing of Doug Wallin that will echo through the halls of Knight Gallery as it is in the farm tools and tobacco curing instruments that will be on display throughout the celebration.

## EXHIBITS

### Through October 21, 1992 **Handmade In North Carolina** Dickson Foundation Gallery

An exhibit by the Southern Highlands Handicraft Guild focuses on traditional forms of mountain crafts, including carvings, basketry, toys, ceramics and chairs. The SHHG was founded in 1930 to preserve the centuries-old handicraft skills of the Southern Appalachians. The Guild is currently located on the Blue Ridge Parkway in the 30,000

square foot Folk Art Center. This exhibition represents a small number of the more than 600 working members of the Guild.

Andrew Glasgow, Curator, Southern Highlands Handicraft Guild: *"Over the years, the momentum built for this movement was about more than just crafts. It touched something deep within us all — the need to create with our hands. Today, as the century nears its close, handicrafts shout above the din of our*

*mechanized world, returning the favor to us by preserving that which is important in our lives."*

This exhibit includes handmade mountain instruments contributed by The Appalachian Cultural Museum at Appalachian State University, the Southern Highlands Handicraft Guild and private collections.

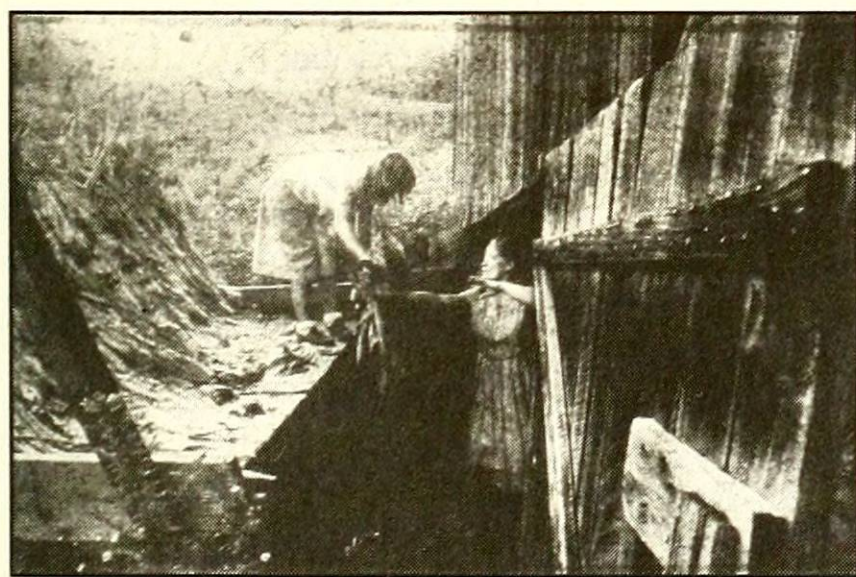
## Tobacco, Chickens & Jr.: Glimpses of the Rural Carolinas

Knight Gallery  
September 11 - October 21, 1992

The photographs of Robert Amberg (Marshall, NC) are featured in this exhibit. For the past eighteen years, Amberg has photographed the life of the rural Carolinas while working as a carpenter, college teacher, freelance photographer and darkroom technician. Through his work and activism, Amberg has fused life with photography. The quality of his images and the sincerity of his mes-

sage have earned him the respect of both colleagues and audiences across the nation, culminating in Amberg's receiving an award from the John Simon Guggenheim Foundation.

Robert Amberg: *"I feel great sympathy and empathy for the people I work with. I feel pretty good about rallying around their cause, and I don't feel that I am dismantling the fabric of their lives or imposing some "rural aesthetic." My idea is to reinforce this way of life and strengthen it by using the very modern tools provided by modern systems... Perhaps the bigger problem is that I sometimes feel so close and so involved in the situation that I don't know whether to shoot the cow or go milk the pictures."*

## Pieces and Patterns

Middleton McMillan Gallery  
September 11 - October 21, 1992

The exhibit includes hand-crafted "friendship" quilts by residents of Madison County, North Carolina as well as a selection of Master quilts by Ora Watson (Boone, NC). Friendship quilts came about in Madison County as newcomers began to move into the area. The women of newcomer families often had young children and other duties that isolated them within the mountainous landscape. As a means of social interaction, the women began to meet for mutual support. Respectful of tradition, a community effort of quilting was adopted. Quilts were made as friendship gestures to honor birthdays, weddings and significant life events with various women in the community assigned to create one patch each, which would result in a wide range of styles contained within the finished quilts. Today, pieces are planned more in collaboration whereby color, pattern, and subject are selected after considering traditional styles, the particular design strengths of the women involved, and the interests and history of the quilt's eventual recipient.

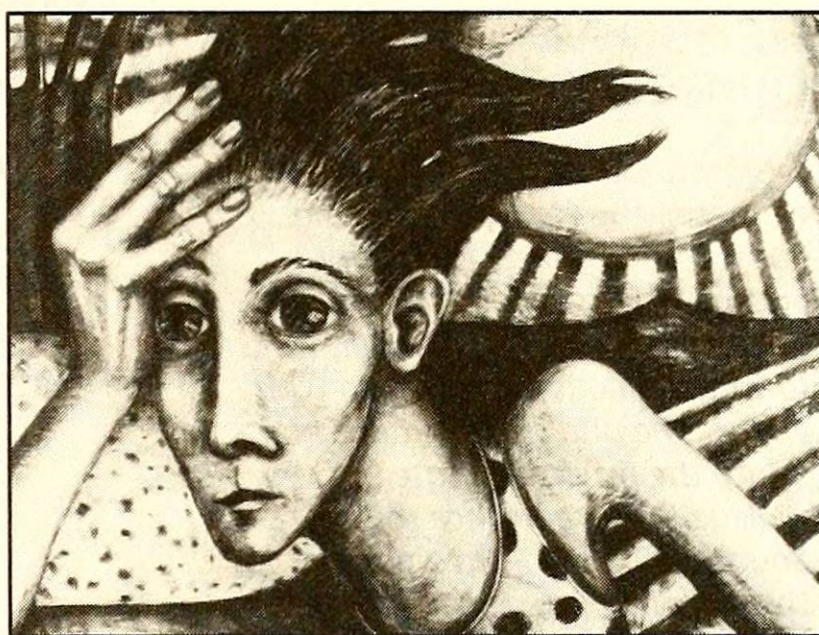

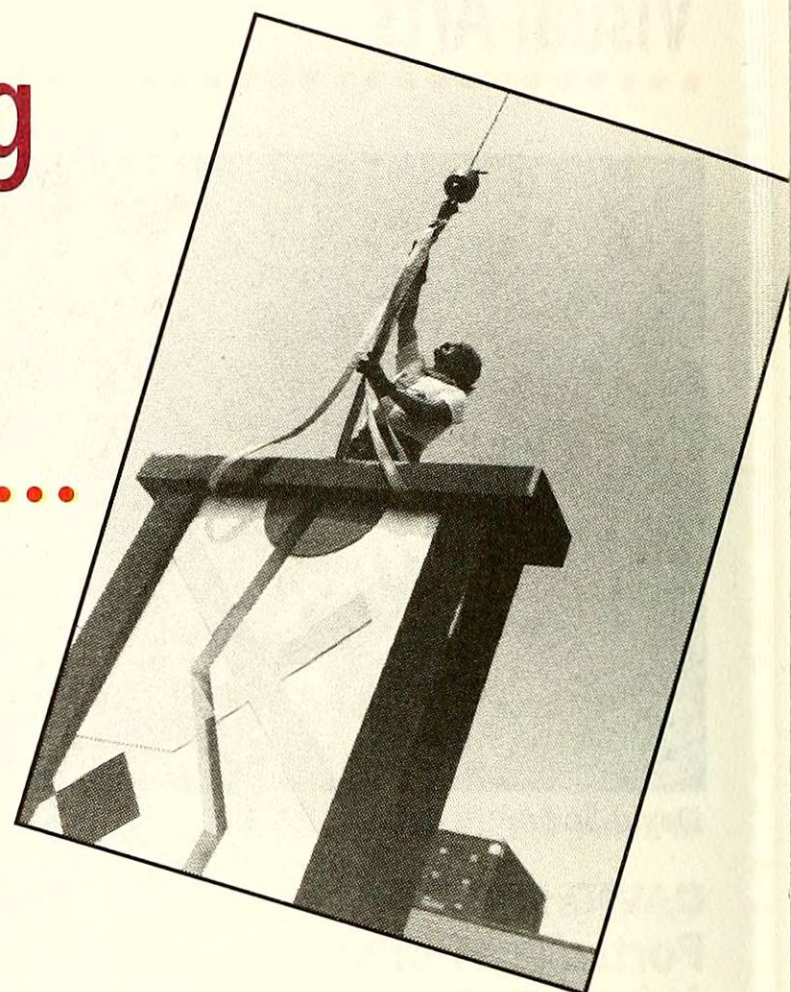
