About Lee Smith

Lee Smith received the Robert Penn Warren Award for Fiction in March of this year in Chattanooga. She is currently a Fellow at the Center for Documentary Studies at Duke University, where she was also a Visiting Professor of Creative Writing last semester. She holds the title of Professor in the English Department of North Carolina State University. A graduate of Hollins College, she has taught also at the University of Virginia and at Hollins. She was a feature writer, film critic, and Sunday Magazine editor for the Tuscaloosa News. She has won two Sir Walter Raleigh Awards, the John Dos Passos Award, the North Carolina Award, and two O. Henry Awards for short fiction. Fair and Tender Ladies is the latest of eight novels, and Me and My Baby View the Eclipse the second of two collections of short stories. She has published short stories in Redbook, McCalls, Carolina Quarterly, Mademoiselle, the O. Henry Awards Anthologies (1979 and 1981), Ladies Home Journal, Black Warrior Review, Ms., and Southern Review.


