The name SPRINKLE, SPRANKLE, SPRENKLE, SPRENCKEL etc has been spelled many ways.

WILHELM SPRENCKEL (William Sprinkle), together with five brothers, (ADAM, PETER, MICHAEL, HENRY and GEORGE), came into Lancaster County, Pennsylvania in 1725, reportedly via Philadelphia, from Germany.

William was granted 100 acres in Lancaster, in what is now York County. Michael took up 500 acres west of the Susquehanna.

Adam was granted 900 acres and settled in West Manchester Township.

Peter acquired 50 acres and settled in York.

Henry received 50 acres and settled in Mannheim Township.

George received 50 acres and settled in Lancaster County.

Michael SPRENCKEL was born in Germany (date unknown) but died in 1748 in Pennsylvania. He married Margaret (maiden name unknown) and the following children are known:

 - 3. Elizabeth married John Strickler.

**Peter and wife Hannah migrated to Stokes County NC in the 1750s or 1760s. Their sons were:

- 1. Peter married Stacey Roberts, daughter of John Roberts.
- 2. Michael.
- 3. George married Elizabeth Pettit.
- 4. Daniel.

George was granted 230 acres on the Yadkin River, 3 April 1778. Michael was granted 200 acres on Luney's Creek, 20 Sept 1779.

In the 1790 U.S. Census, George and Peter were listed in Stokes County.

Stokes County, NC, Will Book #2, page 110, shows the names of George and Elizabeth Sprinkle's children, 5 boys and 3 girls: George, John, Peter, Michael, Thomas, Cloe, Mary "Polly" & Anny.

Surry County, NC, Will Book #4, page 127, lists the children of Peter and Stacey Sprinkle: Charity, Susannah, Jonathan, Moses, Samuel, Peter and Mary Flinn. Their son Moses married Mary Clanton and among their children was James who married Nancy Axsom.

The U.S. Census film for Surry County, NC, for the year 1850 lists the children of James and Nancy Sprinkle as follows: Alexander, age 15, Jackson age 13, Jane age 10, Louisa age 8, twins Roseanna & Rebecca age 5, Martin 2 and Joseph age 2 months. After 1850 James and Nancy Sprinkle had 3 additional children: John b. 1854, James b. 1855 and Nancy b. 1858. The U.S. Census film for Surry County, NC for the year 1860 lists everyone except Alexander, who by that time was 25 and no longer living with his parents.





ALICE OLIVIA (Jones) SPRINKLE (1873-1962)

Papa was born 30 January 1877 and was the oldest of 8 children of Joseph Axsom, (Pappy Joe) and Mary Frances Jackson Sprinkle (Grannie Mollie). Their second born, Ethel Lenora, lived only two years but the others lived to maturity. Uncle Dal was a career Army man and retired after 30 years service. Aunt Betty married Rufus J. Ledford and lived in Rural Hall. Uncle Clay was in furniture manufacturing and died of a heart attack at age 4). Uncle Ott worked on the Panama Canal, contracted yellow fever and died at age 25. Aunt Edna married William L. Speas and lived between Tobaccoville and Bethania. Uncle Frank, after serving in the Navy during WW-1, worked in the Naval Shipyard, Charleston, SC, until his death in 1938. He also died of a heart attack.

Paoa, as did his siblings, grew up on a farm in Surry County, NC, near the Fairview Community, not too far from where mama was raised. Not caring too much for farm life, he decided to go to work in Mt. Airy, first as a stone cutter and then in furniture manufacturing. He and mama owned property and lived on South Street. After I was born, (the last of eight children), they decided to move to the country and traded their "in-town" property for the place on Fancy Gap where now stands the Lutheran Church. Mama said that papa had grown tired of all the neighborhood kids congregating in our yard and stated that when we moved to the country he was going to plant "bull-dog seeds" all over the front yard. He went to school in Grand Rapids, Michigan to learn drafting and furniture design and from the early 1920s until 1934 he was foreman or design superintendent of factories in Mt. Airy, Carthage or North Wilkesboro.

In the early 20s Papa would leave for work before daylight and get home after dark; back then they worked a 55 hour week, 10 hours per day during the week and 5 hours on Saturday. The first vehicle that pape owned, that I remember, was a Model T Ford Truck with benches on the back; he'd haml other men to work for a small fee - wasn't the most comfortable way to travel but cars were few and far between and the highway wasn't paved until later. Pussell Quesenberry used to walk about a mile up to our house to help papa crank the "bus" to pay his fare. They'd have to jack up one rear wheel and use a hand crank to start it, and, in addition, in winter mama would heat a kettle of water for them to pour over the manifold to make it start easier. When he got home in the late afternoon, O'Lena and I would meet him at the driveway entrance and ride around to the barn with him and vie to see who turned the switch off. In 1924 he traded the truck for a new Model T, 2 door sedan with a "self-starter" and "roll-up" windows! As soon as he got home with the new car O'Lena and I got in the back seat and spent the afternoon rolling the windows up and down.

He was a remter of Mt. Carmel Church from 1919 until his death and for most of that 20 years he was the Sunday School Superintendent; at that time the only room was the Sanctuary which had wires strung across on which curtains were used to separate the classes. Papa would check each class to make sure they had an offering and, if not he'd put a dime in for them. Papa was also a Mason.

The kids and grand kids would climb onto his lap whenever he'd sit on the porch and if they began to annoy him, or to interrupt his nap, he'd say: "don't bother me now, i'm meditating". We didn't know what that meant but we were sure it was something very important.

Before I joined the Navy papa admonished me to "never get a tattoo". Soon after I reenlisted in the Navy in 1939, Papa disd of a heart attack. They had been to a family reunion at Little Richmond Church that Sunday and on the way home he became ill and died a short time after arriving home. Papa was given a Maschic funeral. He was highly respected and loved by all.

Mama was born 7 July 1872 and was raised on a farm on the Yadkin River, just East of Elkin, near where Mitchell's River empties into the Yadkin. She was the only girl in a family of 9 children, of which 8 reached adulthood; Uncle Charlie's twin was still-born which mama always attributed to the fact that the attending physician had had too much to drink. The Atlantic & Yadkin Railway divided Grandpa Jones' property and there was a depot nearby called Burch Station. At one time Uncle Nat and Aunt Lola were postmaster & station agent. The familywas well educated; Uncle Pinkney was a store/mill owner/farmer; Uncle Winnie was a Physician and attended Tulane Medical School; Uncle Eugene a farmer in the Columbia River Basin in Washington; Uncle Nat a Teacher/ Storekeeper; Uncle Charlie was an accountant; and Uncles Emory and Kenneth toth died in young manhood.

Mama attended Siloam Academy and she told us of having to take a "Spring Tonic" (Sulphur & Molasses) which, according to the Headmaster, would clean out any Winter's Residue and also improve the complexion! She also told of having helped her brothers put a new rocf on their house. The house is long gone now but when I saw it last in 1932/33 it was still in fairly good shape and contained a large kitchen/dining area, one large and one small bedroom downstairs; and had two bedrooms upstairs. It also had a root cellar or basement. Mama told us of one winter when they had only "cornbread". Seems that grandpa had a good crop of wheat but it brought such a good price he sold all of it! Mama decided then that if she ever was married she'd have biscuits every day. (She had a black baking pan about 15 inches squard and she'd fill it with biscuits every morning - it held 5 rows of 5 biscuits each. They were the "pinched of?" type and were scrumptious! She kept the flour - 50 pound bags - and corn meal in a barrel beside the kitchen stove and it also held the bowl in which she mixed biscuits, the barrel cover being the dough board. O'Lena made a flower stand out of the bowl).

Mama was 30 years old and still living at home when she & papa eloped. She'd had beaus before but grandpa didn't think any of them good enough for her; papa wasn't on his list of eligibles either! However, they made a fine couple and raised 9 fairly decent children. Mama liked to work outside and raised a garden from which she canned, pickled and preserved all summer as well as feeding all our hungry mouths. Us kids would help hoe, plow and harvest the garden, pick all types of wild berries and in the fall would make and fill a 50 gallon barrel with cider which would become the supply of vinegar the following summer for the entire neighborhood. Mama also had a "Cobbler's Bench" with different sized shoe lasts which were used when she'd resole our shoes. The work shoes she'd sometimes sole with an old automobile tire. She was very close when it came to spending money. (Papa used to say - "Alice would be disappointed if she didn't die in the poor house"). If a recipe called for 2 cups of sugar she'd use only 12; her rhubarb pie was so sour that I couldn't each it.

Mama loved to sing (she could read music) and had a great sense of humor! Cross when we lived on Miller Road she had a man painting the kitchen; the day was cold and she was cooking a pot of turnip greens or some equally vile smelling "creasy sallet"; she closed the door to keep the odor out of the rest of the house and the painter got a nose full. Another time while living with Edd & O'Lena on Fairview Avenue, she was cooking a pot of greens in a pressure cooker when she noticed the cooker was acting funny & said to do Lena - "Jo, ve'i better get out of here before this thing blows up". They did and it did! It splattered the kitchen ceiling with greens and the color probably still leaches through unless some later owner painted the ceiling green.

She was always ready to go if anyone suggested a trip. She amazed us for she'd never take advantage of a rest stop - once in the car, there she remained until we reached our destination.

Mama was a member of the Mt. Carmel Baptist Church from 1919 until her death and she helped to break ground for the present educational building. During the 1920s and early 30s we only had church once a month and the preacher would end up at our house for Sunday dinner at least half the time. Mama is buried in the Church Cemetery alongside papa. O'Lena, Edith, George and I were with her when she died.

Everyone loved mama and the church was filled to overflowing for her funeral. A little bit of mama shows up in most everyone she touched.



Edith was the oldest of us 8 children and attended Mt. Airy High School but quit in her senior year to marry John Allred. My earliest recollection of Edith was when Henry was born at our home above Mt. Airy. (The Lutheran Church now stands about where our barn was located and our old home serves as the church office). Henry's arrival being imminent, mama had O'Lena and I take Alice down to Harris Brown's store - don't remember what we were to buy - and when we returned Henry was there! I remember saying to mama that if I ever got married I wanted 2 children like Edith, however, they went on to have a total of eight from 1922 to 1949. When I was 6 or 7 years old I speht a few days with them in their home on Brookstown Ave. in Winston-Salem. The only thing I remember about the house was the bathroom; the toilet seat was "spring loaded" and stayed upright when not in use. When you sat down on the seat the "flush tank" would fill up and when you got up wif the seat would flip up and automatically flush the toilet. While they were living on Brookstown Avenue they drove out one summer evening to Crystal Lake to cool off. While they were swimming or entertaining Alice a man parked his car alongside theirs and left his pet monkey chained to the steering column. The chain was long enough that he could jump into John's car and when they returned Edith sat Alice on the seat and only then discovered that the monkey had used their car seat for a bath room. Needless to say both Alice and the car seat required cleaning. The family moved to Newport News, Virginia in 1942 or 1943; Dave Jones, Ike's brother, used his truck for the move with Edith and the younger children riding in the cab with Dave. Edith said Dave had to stop frequently and check the load but what she didn't know was that Dave was taking a "taste of the grape" at each stop. He was probably a "happy trucker" when they arrived. In Newport News they lived in a new development, Copeland Park, and all the houses looked alike to John so when it was time for him to get home from work she'd send one of the children out to flag him down when he approached their house, otherwise he'd go right on by. Most of the children grew up during the depression of the 1930s and World War II with the 3 oldest boys being in service. Henry was in the Coast Guard(he couldn't pass the Navy physical, he had a heart murmur) and Dick & Agnew both in the Navy. Dick was the healthiest of the three - Henry and Agnew both had asthma; Agnew was still on medication when he went into the service and hought a large tube of shaving cream, cut open the bottom of the tube & emptied the cream, then placed his atomizer containing his asthma medicine in the empty tube and took it to Boot Camp with him. In addition to Alice and the three mentioned here their other children were: Billy, Pat, Faye and Phillip. Once when Mama was visiting Edith and I happened to be there too, we were all sitting on the front porch talking and the conversation fot around to the subject of the colored race. After a few minutes mama said she was going to tell us something that we didn't know and proceeded to tell us that her father, our grandfather Jones, had impregnated a negro woman and that she'd had a daughter as a result. The child was mostly white and was sent up North to Philadelphia and educated and married a white doctor who didn't know of her ethnic background. They never had any children and the woman is buried alongside her mother near Dobson. Edith nudged me and said: "ain't it a shame mama's only sister had to be a negro"??

Edith dearly loved to sing and had a good sense of humor, traits which she inherited from out mother. She wrote poetry as a hobby and also short stories. If she'd had any spare time in her earlier years she could have been a well known writer but she was always too busy being a wife and mother. She was a "home economist" being able to stretch a dollar further than anyone i've ever known. In her last two or three years Edith, due to numerous light strokes, lost her eyesight and no longer recognized anyone other than her own children and sometimes not even them. We loved her dearly and will always remember her cheerful outgoing personality.


Had would around and back again Right on 40 where they had been. Tennessee scenery was beautiful, you bet, And the road to Knoxville the longest yet.

Remember Those Old School Pictures?

Remember those old school pictures? The students were all dressed up — the girls in their Sunday best and the boys, most all of them, in coats and ties.

The girls appeared to love it — the boys were at the opposite extreme. Especially was this so when the parents would deliver the traditional admonition to their coat-and-tie 'charges, "Mind you, don't get dirty,

Mothers, especially, didn't seem to grasp that it was impossible for boys to play baseball or kneel down and shoot marbles in the Sunday best that they were ordered to keep dirt-free.

While the majority of the male students dreaded the annual occasion, their parents must have been delighted, purchasing the pictures even in those cash-starved days of the Great Depression. The resultant pictures that have come down now are a pictorial history of those good old days in the local schools.

newspaper copy of the fourth-grade class of 1913-14 of Rockford Street School was taken to The Mount Airy News. Minnie Sommers was the teacher of that class of 80 years ago.

Many of the names in the picture are familiar ones. Eloise Sparger became Mrs. Conrad Siceloff and a was a well-known teacher in the city schools. Hester Jones, later Hester Jones Leland, also became a wellknown teacher.

The history of Rockford Street School was a lengthy and proud one. The school was located where the Andy Griffith Playhouse parking lot is now and the Playhouse was the old school auditorium. Renovation came about in the mid-1970s. Dedication ceremonies for the Mount Airy Municipal Building and Mount Airy Public Library were held in the Playhouse.

It was back in 1869, according to historian Ruth Minick, that a free academy was organized for the education of males.

Minick said that research by Verona West Smith, a former principal of Rockford Street School, showed that an agreement was struck between Thomas F. Prather and Joseph Hollingsworth, James Greenwood, Elisha Banner, Robert S. Gilmer and Win-

ston Fulton whereby Prather received \$150 for land on Rockford Road (Street) for a male academy and free church for the citizens of Mount Airy and the surrounding country.

The historian also quoted Porter Graves as saying that there "was a small building which stood not far north of the residence of the late Judge Graves (where the Mount Airy Public Library now is located), which was used as a schoolhouse and free church."

But educational facilities around the old site of Rockford Street School went back even further. It was in 1812 or 1813, Minick said, that Edward Hickman reportedly had "an academy of note ... in the vicinity of, or at the site of old Rockford Street School.

Rockford Street School served the city as elementary and high school for years. However, Mount Airy High School was built in 1916 and Rockford Street School became an elementary facility, serving the town until the



"Mirn", as we all called her, was the second child. She also attended Mt. Airy High School and earned her Bachelor's and, as years went by, her Master's degrees in primary Education at Boone Normal, Appalachian State Teachers College and Appalachian State University (all the same school). She taught first grade in the Surry County School System having to house break as many as three generations of some families. She was a member of Mt. Carmel Baptist Church for about 75 years and was very active in the church, having served on numerous committees and as president of the Wemen's Missionary Union. Papa once said that if anyone was ever born a Christian, she was. She married Ike Jones in 1925 and they had 2 children, Mary Alice and Nat Sprinkle Jones.

Her mind was always in overdrive figuring ways and means of helping others. The rest of us had to be light on our feet and quick of thought or she'd volunteer us too. After retiring from teaching, she continued her connection with the educational system and served several years as membership chairman for the Surry County Retired Teachers Association. She also volunteered for service with "Yokefellow Cooperative Ministry", dedicated to aiding the needy, providing food and clothing, rent and utilities for those less fortunate in conjunction with the Salvation Army and United Fund. For this work she received the "Extra Mile Award" from the Mt. Airy Chamber of Commerce.

"Mirn" had a heart of gold, was very naive and would believe almost anything, if it was told her with a straight face. She could be comical at times - even by accident. such as: one time she had baked a fresh apple pie for dessert. Her husband Ike was late getting home so she and the children had already eaten, but she had saved Ike a slice of pie. While he was eating his late supper "Mirn" sat down to talk and keep him company and unconsciously ate his dessert. Another time - she was baking a pound cake and decided that since she had enough ingredients and two pans she'd make two and give one to her preacher. When she cleaned up she didn't notice that one of the beaters from her mixer was missing. The cake she kept was fine but the one she gave the preacher yielded up her missing beater. Also, during World War II she sent me a "Care Package". containing cookies, candy, a safety razor and one large cake of lifebuoy spap. Lifebuoy flavored cookies never have been myfavorites! After I retired from the service, Ann & I moved to the mountains near Sparta. Since Ann's people lived in Central Florida we visited often, (especially Aunt Jessie), and would always bring fruit back to share with family and friends. On one occasion we brought back some "Old Florida Lemons", they looked similar to a Temple Orange but would lay a pucker on you that wouldn't quit. Mirn passed them on to the same preacher as oranges. He never mentioned them but "Mirn" got a kick out of it when we told her they were lemons rather that oranges. If anyone offered her anything in the way of food or clothing she never refused it even though she couldn't use it - she knew someone who could and she'd pass it on to them.

"Mirn" married Tommy Gordon in 1983. They had known each other all their lives and both had lost their partners. Mary Gordon's Life Has Been One Of Service To Others And 'Unto The Lord'

When schoolteacher Mary Gordon retired" 15 years ago from Franklin Elementary, her daily work load was decreased considerably — from 18 to 15

Yokefellow is a charitable, all-volunteer organization that aids the needy with food, clothes and utilities in greater Mount Airy. It was begun by local churches, is funded by them and the United Fund and often works in conjunction with the Salvation Army.

Gordon can't recall the number of volun-teer hours she has put in to help the poor both at home and abroad. She made herself available to them 24 hours a day. "I just went when I was needed. Sometimes they'd call me at night or on weekends and I'd go, she said.

Charles was the third child, the cldest boy, and if anything was an "over achiever". When he was six years old he went down to Burch Station to spend the winter with grandma and grandpa Jones. He started school down there and when they discovered that he could read and write they promoted him to the second grade during the first week. Grandpa wouldn't let him go to school any more that year saying that it wasn't good for children to learn too fast. Later in Mt. Airy High School, if anything came up that the teachers didn't have a ready answer for they'd call on Charles and he could usually give them the answer. In the early 1920s we had a "hand crank" telephone in the hallway of our house - I remember mama talking to Uncle Winnie in Texas and telling him that grandpa had died. Not too long after that we had an ice storm which broke the lines down and the telephone company didn't repair the damage and we were without telemone service up our way until the late 1930s, except that the line between our house and the Smith house next door was still good and we 'd call back and forth. Charles was interested in physics and other science subjects and used the old "magneto phone" as a snocking machine. The older boys would form a circle and hold hands with the two on the end holding one telephone wire. The faster you cranked the more electricity it would generate. Charles also used it a couple of times to shock us younger kids. He'd place pennies in the bottom of a bucket and fill it with water and when one of us kids would try to get the pennies he'd start cranking and shock us. Mama put a stop to this shortly though!

Charles attended N.C. State and received his degree in Chemical Engineering. After graduation he worked in Philadelphia for about a year and then came back to North Carolina and went to work for Reynold's Tobacco Company in Winsten-Salem in the Laboratory. At that time we were living in North Wilkesboro and when he'd come home for the weekend he'd date a fourth grade teacher Edith Williams, whom he married in 1935. They first lived in an apartment in Rural Hall and then moved into a house on Queen Street near the Baptist Hospital. They finally built a house in Northwest Winston-Salem and their two children, Kitty and Charlie, attended Reynolds High School.

At the time of his death Charles was Agricultural Manager for Reynolds and did much research in all phases of the tobacco industry. After I retired from the Navy, Ann and I settled on top of the mountain near Sparta. Not being over-loaded with money we figured we could ease the cost of living by growing our own vegetables and canning or freezeing the excess. Neither of us had ever done any canning, planting or preserving of anything so we started out by asking Charles how far apart to plant the rows of vegetables, to which he replied: "far enough apart that you can run your lawm mower between them." I suppose he thought we'd never plow or hoe them!

We were vacationing in Florida when Charles suffered a heart attack and was admitted to Forsythe Memorial Hospital. He was still in the hospital 2 weeks later and reportedly doing well when he had another (a massive) attack which he did not survive. We were enroute home and had stopped overnight with Hugh and Tommye the night of his death. I wish we had started home a couple of days earlier; Charles was a good friend, a fine brother and highly thought of by everyone.

Joseph Bramlett SPRINKLE

Buddy, as we called him, was named after his two grandfathers. While growing up if anyone wanted to start a fight all they had to do was call him "Bramlett", and then they'd better duck real fast or run like hell. Buddy was an excellent athlete and played football, baseball and basketball. He was selected "All-State" Center in football his last two years in high school at Carthage and also won a football scholarship to North Carolina State. He had medical problems during the two years he attended State, first a badly sprained ankle and in his Sophmore year he had a riptured appendix and was not able to participate much. He married Louise Colvard, a North Wilkesboro girl, during his second year and became a family man. They had one daughter, JoAn. Buddy spent his life in furniture manufacturing and worked in several locations in central and western North Carolina as foreman or superintendant. Buddy did, however, work in an explosive plant in Radford, Virginia during WW-II.

When we were growing up most of the neighborhood boys would congregate at our house after church on Sunday and played war (choosing sides and throwing corn cobs or green apples at each other), or choose sides and play baseball on during the hot summer months, go swimming in the creek about a half mile away. Buddy taught me to swim in Thaggard's pond near Carthage and also gave me my first cigarette. One Sunday Papa let Buddy have the car, a Model T Ford Coupe, to take his girl friend to ride; Papa gave me permission to go with them. We started out but Buddy didn't want me tagging along so he gave me a cigarette to get out and walk back home. I smoked the cigarette and got sick and when I got home Mama knew i'd been smoking but I don't remember whether she whipped me or blamed it on Buddy.

I remember a trick Charles, Buddy, Lonnie Brown and Arvel Easter played on Walter Brown when they were in their middle to late teens. Walter was very bashful and they decided to fix him up with a date; Walter didn't know it but his date was to be Buddy in "Drag". Don't remember the outcome but don't imagine there was much smooching going on. Another time - Buddy and George played a trick on Nat, Christmas was coming and Mat wanted an air rifle in the worst way. Our house had a carbide lighting system when Mama & Papa traded for it but for some reason (maybe safety) its use was discontinued but the piping which carried the gas was still there and was just about the size of an air rifle barrel. Buddy & George cut a piece of the pipe for the barrel and whittled a stock out of a board and wrapped it up. When Nat got up on Christmas morning and saw that package he knew that he'd hit the jackpot. As soon as he unwrapped it he knew he'd been had and clobbered Buddy with it.

Puddy reminded me of Papa - he was very easy-going and had the patience of Job, which he certainly needed during his married life. Ann and I, together with JoAn, were with him when he died in the early morning of 5 February 1982 at Duke Hospital in Durham. I enjoyed Buddy's company and wish we could have spent more time together in later years.

George was the middle one of the boys and was a clown, an imp, an angel, and a leprechuan all rolled into one, hence, the nickname "Goofy". He could do a pretty good job of keeping O'Lena, Nat and me crying with his shenanigans and continuous picking at us. George was the least healthy of us 8 kids and had "Bright's Disease" when he was 9 or 10 years old. During this sickness he went completely blind for several days and when he regained his sight "Mirn" was the first thing he saw - he said: "Mirn", I can see you; ain't that good news"? He once fell off Bernie Allred's mule and broke his arm and got sort of mixed up "brain wise". When he came to he asked "where am I"?, to which Paul Allred answered "here you are George". He also had to have his tonsils removed and we had many laughs about his experience while recovering from the operation. Another patient named "Roscoe" something had his tonsils removed the same day and they shared the same room. When his father came to visit him that night he asked his son: "Roscoe, do you want an orange"? We thought that was hilarious and the question was was repeated many times by us kids. George went barefoot all one winter before he started school and Alma Easter stopped by to visit with "Mirn" one day after school and offered George a penny if he'd walk barefoot through the snow to the barn and back. He started out but "Mirn went out and carried him back to the house. Don't remember whether Alma paid him the penny or not.

As a result of being sick so much, George was 20 years old when he graduated from North Wilkesboro High School in 1933 and was also married to Virginia Johnson. To this union was born one daughter, George Lou but the marriage anded in divorce about 1940. George was drafted into the Army during World War II and served for about 3 years. He and I got together in San Francisco for a night on the town in the spring of 1945 and we proceeded to terrorize the natives! The next time I saw George, the war was over and we both visited Edith as Mama was also out there. He went to school under the G.I. Bill in Michigan for a while and later he and two other men went into the plywood business at Danville . In the meantime, George had gotten married to Dora Shaw, a Galax girl, and they honeymooned at the Willard Hotel in Washington, D.C. This union produced a son Jerry and a daughter Julie. Their next door neighbor in Danville, a Pharmacist installed a "bomb shelter" in his ba sement and knowing that George had been in the service asked george what he should do when he first came out of the shelter should there be a need to use it. George told him "you can come over and bury us". I stopped by to see them as often as possible in going to and from Norfolk and Mt. Airy and when I was transferred to Key West. Florida in late 1963 I spent the night with them and we talked until all hours. When George died in the spring of 1964 I flew from Key West to Greensboro where Edd and O'Lena met me and carried me on to Danville. I spent the night with Dora, Jerry, Julie, and Dora's sister Lola and drove them to Galax, Virginia the next day. Near Martinsville Dora told me about a trip they'd made to Galax not too long before. It seemed that George and Jerry were leading the way in George's car and Dora and Julie were following in the family car; the family was going to stay in Galax a few days but George had to be back at work on Monday. The Virginia State Highway Patrol had set up a road block and were checking driver's licenses and registrations; George suggested to the patrolman that he arrest the woman driving the car behind him, said she'd been following him ever since he left Danville. The natrolman reported this to Dora and asked if she knew the man in the car ahead and she admitted that he was her husband.

George was a lot of fun to be around and was one of everyone's favorites but his heart just quit all of a sudded while he was at work on 7 May 1964.

Nat was the sixth in line and was named after Mama's brother. Our family carries the name Nat followed by the maiden name of the mother, thus "Mirn's" son is Nat Sprinkle Jones. Mat was a "free spirit" and extremely independent. He was taught to swim by Eli Cooke when he was only 3 or 4 years old and he would follow the older boys to the creek to go "skinny dippin"; even though they'd run off and leave him he knew the way and would follow. He was never too interested in school even though he did compete one year in the County Spelling Bee (3rd or 4th grade level) and came in second having, as he said, missed on purpose so that the girl wouldn't cry when she lost. He finally quit school in the ninth grade and went to work full time at Tom Forester's Service Station in North Wilkesboro. At one time or another he also worked in furniture manufacturing; knitting - where he was a "fixer" or machinist: sheet metal worker in a shipyard; oiler in the merchant marine during WW-II; railroad brakeman and conductor; and when he died he had been the Railway Worker's Union Legislative Representative in Richmond for several years. With more formal education Nat could have been anything he wanted to be for he was a fast learner and bleswed with a lot of common sense.

His main fault was his enjoyment of alcohol and, in his early years - fighting. Once when I was home on leave at Christmas (either 1939 or 1940), Nat, George and I, along with several of their Galax friends, were out at a night spot between Galax and Hillsville. There was a man there from Wythe County named William something who was strutting around and in general thinking highly of himself, when Nat finally had enough and confronted the fellow with: "over in Wythe County you might be "Wild Bill" but down here in Carroll County you are "Sweet William" and he then proceeded to give the gentleman a boxing lesson that he wasn't likely to forget. Nat had naturally curly hair and until he grew up he hated it; then he found out that the girls liked it - as a matter of fact - the ladies considered him extremely handsome.

Nat also married a Galax girl, Aline Martin, and they had seven children: Sue Ann, Sandy, Jay, Rebecta, Nancy, David and Danny. Nat said that everytime he hung his pants over the bed post Aline got pregnant!

Nat, like most of the Sprinkle men, had heart problems and spent several vacations in the hospital as a result of heart-attacks. I visited him once just after he was released from the hospital and as I drove up I saw him squatting down planing the door jamb. He was finishing installing a storm door and was adjusting the clearance. When I told him that door hanging wasn't the healthiest thing he could be doing in his condition, he replied: "Speck, you cant give up just because you've been sick if you do, you might as well be dead.

The first time Nat saw our place near Sparta, N.C. he said: "Speck, this is as close to Heaven as you'll ever be. He was the only person whose driving didn't bother me. No matter what the speed or road condition I was always at ease, knowing he could handle it. He, Aline and their youngest, Danny, visited us once in Melbourne not long before he died. Danny had been doing most of the driving and Nat was continuously on him about going too fast, following too close or something. On their way back home Nat was driving and got a ticket for speeding.

In early November in 1975 Ann and I decided to take a trip down to the Florida Keys and come back up the West Coast, arriving back home Saturday the 8th. On Sunday we got a call telling us that Nat had died so we headed for Newport News with empty wallets and had to rely on plastic for food, gasoline and motels until we got there. To us Nat was a very special person and he was well liked and highly respected by those he worked with.

O'Lena, or "Sissy" as we called her, was the youngest girl and next to the youngest child, there being only 16 months difference in our ages. We grew up together and both of us, like our brothers and sisters before us, learned our ABC's and how to read at Mama's knee. In the afternooh we'd take turns combing mama's hair (back then she wore it long and rolled into a bun) and she'd teach us using cereal boxes or any type printed matter as teaching aids. When O'Lena wax about 6 or 7 years old she had a loose tooth and Charles was threatening her by pulling it with a pair of pliers but mama just touched it with her finger and it fell out. That was before the invention of the "Tooth Fairy" so she just lost it and didn't get paid for it. We attended Green Will School in our early years walking the 2 mile to and from. The school had only 2 rooms for 7 grades when we started, they later added a third room and they were heated by pot-bellied stowes. School only lasted 6 months back then as the students were needed to help raise crops on the farms. When she was about 7 or 8 years old they held a recital at Green Mill and O'Lena was to recite a poem. She forgot the ending and wound up by saying "that ain't all of it" and brother George never let her forget her memory lapse for several years. In winter we'd all wear homemade grey flannel underwear which we called "flannions". When she was about 8 or 9 years old O'Lena asked mama what type underwear she was going to wear to school that winter, George answered - "flannions like the rest of us!". Along about that same time our neighbors cow was bitten by their rabid dog and O'Lena and Marian had to undergo the 21 rabies treatment shots. Also, the two of us were sent out to the Smiths for milk late one afternoon and walking home down the "old road" she almost stepped on a snake (a copperhead). Growing up back then had its pit-falls too. We moved to Carthage in the late twenties and attended the 5th & 6th grades there. My fifth grade teacher's name was Miss or Mrs. Shaw who had a large Dewberry patch which I helped pick. O'Lena and Mary Worthy Sprnce, her best friend and next door neighbor, were also going to help but spent most of the time sitting and eating the berries. I don't remember how much we were paid but back then it couldn't have been very much. We moved to North Wilkesboro in 1929 and attended 7th grade and high school there. O'Lena did a geography project in the 7th grade for which she received very high marks. The subject was the State of North Carolina and she cut the paper out in the shape of the state. She was a very good student in "Mome Economics" in high school and won a prize for a dress she designed and made. She was a member of the girls basket-ball team for 2 or 3 years and graduated in 1934. We were never the greatest students but we did manage to survive! O'Lena married Edd Cox in 1935 and they had 5 daughters: Tommye, Linda, Jo Lena, Diane and Betsy. After papa died in 1939, they lived with mama (or she lived with them) until her death in 1962. After Edd died in 1965, O'Lena attended Forsythe Technical Institute in Winston-Salem and became a Licensed Practical Nurse. She worked at the North Surry Mospital in Mt. Airy for a while and then went to Lenoir Rhyne College in Mickory where she was the "on campus" nurse until she retired.

She is now into crafts of all kinds and is still the perfectionist. A good bit of her time is spent visiting her five daughters, a of which live from 200 to 750 miles from Mt. Airy (our old home town) where we still hold our family reunion.

Born 1918. Graduated from High School 1934, Joined the U.S. Navy 1935. Married first time 1946. Son James L. III born 1947. Divorced 1964. Married second time 1964. Retired from the Navy 1966. Retired from everything 1979.

After finishing school and attaining age 17, I signed up for the Navy in June 1935. At that time North Carolina was not allowed to provide any Navy Recruits due to the number of Infantile Paralysis cases and it was October before I could enlist. As an Apprentice Seaman I was raid the grand sum of \$21.00 per month but after 120 days I was advanced to Seaman Second Class and drew \$36.00. My first meal in the Navy was on a Monday night about 8 o'clock. A group of us had been sworn in at Raleigh, N.C. earlier that day and sent by train to Norfolk, arriving about 6:30pm. They carried us by truck to the Naval Operating Base, where the East Coast Naval Recruit Training Center was located and were immediately sent to the mess hall. I'll never forget that first meal: fried liver and onions which had been soaking in melted lard since 5pm and was barely luke warm. (I had a strong aversion to liver for several years). After Recruit Training and "Boot Leave" I was sent to the West Coast aboard the USS Chaumont, which sailed via Guantanamo Bay, Cuba and Panama. In Panama I had my first taste of cars driving on the wrong side of the road; they later changed to driving on the right side. The Chaumont was large enough and the ocean calm enough that I didn't get seasick on this trip but upon our arrival at San Diego, California, I was assigned to the USS Waters (DD-115), an old WW-1 type destroyer. The ship was 30 feet wide and 310 feet long and the slightest movement of the ocean caused that sucker to roll and pitch something fierce. We'd go to sea on Monday and come back in port (Sam Diego) on Friday; as soon as we cleared the channel Monday morning i'd get sick and remain so all day. On Tuesday i'd be fully recovered and the rest of the week would be fine, but, came the next Monday Sprinkle would barf all day. After about 6 months of this I suddenly found my "see legs" and was never seasick again. (While on this ship we had 2 men to receive discharges for "chronic Seasickness". Ty first Commanding Officer was named McFarland and when the ship was leaving or entering port he'i be continuously digging at his "backside"; we called him "scratchyassed McFarland -- behind his back, of course. During my first year in the Navy I went to South America, crossed the equator, went to Alaska and the Aleutians and in July 1936 went to Hawaii. We stayed in Hawaii until February 1937, came back to California for shipyard overhaul and then went back to Hawaii. While there I attended Radio Operators School at the Submarine Base at Pearl Harbor and stayed on the base until February 1939 whom I was sent back to Norfolk for discharge. I rode the transport USS Henderson from Hawail to Norfolk, stopping in San Francisco, Long Beach, San Diego, Panama, Puerto Rico and Guantanamo Bay Cuba. The boatswain's mate in charge of us passengers would assign work duties and I managed to elude him until we were near Panama. He stopped me and asked: "Sprinkle, what are you doing now"? to which I replied "same thing boats". He just said OK so I continued to be a sightseer. I was discharged at Norfolk & went back to Mt. Airy but reenlisted after 88 days and was sent to duty in Pensacola, Florida. Waile stationed there papa died, I was advanced to Radioman Third Class, and Radioman Second Class. I was transferred to the 8th Naval District Headquarters in New Orleans, Louisiana in the fall of 1941 and was advanced to RMlc. I was the Radio Supervisor on duty when we received the message "Air Raid on Pearl Harbor this is no drill" . In 1942 I took the examination for Chief Radiomen and was promoted to that rank in October 1942. I was sent overseas to Africa in early 1943 and was assigned to the Staff of Commander of Landing Craft and Beses, North Africa. Our headquarters were in Oran, Algeria and we lived in a "tent city". Early one morning a contingent of British Army Troops came marching in to "Bagpipe wailing". My opposite number - a Royal Navy CPO Telegrapher - allowed it was "ghastly" & sounded like the bloke had a hagfull of cats a squeezing them. We went from there to Bizerte, Tunisia,

after Rommel surrendered. In Bizerte our troops were disembarking from landing craft via one gangplank while Italian Prisoners of War were embarking up the other. They were a happy group, saying: "fini le guerre"! and for them the war was over. We staged for the invasions of Sicily and Italy at Bizerte. While there we lived on an old French Naval Base. The one thing I remember most was the "toilet". They resembled shower stalls with raised sections made of cement for your feet and they had no seat. They'd automatically flush and you'd better be standing on the raised portion. Admiral Connolly was my boss and was known as "get closer Richard". He'd tell the captain of of our flagship to "geta little closer, I can't see anything". When we returned to Bizerte after invading Italy, I had been selected for promotion to Warrant Officer and was transferred back to the States for reassignment. I was granted 20 days leave and then went to San Francisco for transportation to the Seventh Fleet in Southwest Pacific. On the transport I was assigned to a stateroom with 6 bunks; my 5 roommates were all U.S. Army Chaplains so I was blessed with protection from higher up! I left the transport at Milne Bay, New Guinea and rode an ammunition snip on to Brisbane, Australia, 7th Fleet Headquarters, and was then assigned to duty with the Staff of Commander Motor Torpedo Boat Squadrons, Seventh Fleet, whose flagship was at that time in New Guinea, so, back I went via air and the last leg from Port Moresby, New Guines to Finschhaven, New Guinea in a Navy "Black Cat" flying boat. One of our PT-Boat skippers was John F. Kennedy, later to become President of the U.S. We also had as skippers George and Alfred Gwyn Vanderbilt. George and I, among others, were sent temporary duty to establish a new PT Base on Biak Island (off the coast of North New Guinea) and living conditions were primitive. Our toilet there was a 12 holer - 6 of them back to back. When our assignment was completed we roda a PT Boat back to our home base. On our way back we each got a ration of beer - 2 cans - for which we had to pay 10¢ per can. George Vanderbilt had no change so I loaned him 20¢, which he still owes me. Our PT-Boats would go out on patrol at night - leaving the base about 6pm and would return the next morning about an hour after daylight. They'd harass Japanese shipping and also any bases along the shoreline. They'd sneak up on our own army, at times! Some of the U.S. Army bases along the shore line would build their "out-houses" out at the end of a small pier where they'd be over the water. Our PTs, when running with their mufflers closed, were very quiet and when they'd get within 50 yards or so from an "occupied necessary room" they'd go to full throttle with their mufflers open and would kick-up quite a rooster tail which would bathe the nether parts of anyone sitting! General Mac-Arthur made them stop harassing friendly troops as soon as he found out about it. In the spring of 1945 I was transferred back to the states for reassignment and flew from the Philippines back to Hawaii on military aircraft but was lucky in that 3 of us were given transportation from Hawaii to San Francisco via the Pan American "China Clipper". I next attended Warrant Officer's Radio Engineering School in Washington, D.C., while there got married. I was next assigned to the Heavy Cruiser USS Los Angeles. The Los Angeles spent about 6 months in China just prior to the Communist takeover and we were in Shanghai for Christmas and theh went up to North China to Tsingtao. Shortly after we returned to the States for yard overhaul, Jimmy was born. In the fall of 1947 I was assigned to the Aircraft Carrier Coral Sea and while on her we made a Mediterranean Midshipman Cruise. We had almose 6,000 men in the craw and air group and carried another 1,500 midshipmen. We visited Portugal and France and on our trip home the entire group of ships stopped and held "swimming call" in the middle of the Atlantic! Too deep to wade". During the Korean flap I was assigned to a repair ship, USS Jason and we spent almost 2 years in Japan in support of our fighting ships as well as other United lations fighting ships. At one time we had vessels from 5 different countries alongside for repairs in Sasebo, Japan. Our ship was also the Flagship of the Admiral Commanding Service Squadron Three and we had a bugler (of sorts) to sound calls over the public address system for just about anything - reveille, taps, chow call, mail call, liberty call etc. The forward accommodation ladder came up to the Quarter Deck where the Officer of the Deck and his Boatswain's Mate, Messenger, Bugler etc were stationed. The Executive Officer's stateroom had a port hole which opened onto the quarterdeck and after a particular bugle call had been almost camouflaged by sour notes the "Exec" stuck his head out the porthole and said to the bugler: "Bailey, as a bugler you sometimes leave something to be desired". To which Bailey replied: "Commander, what do you expect for \$54/ month, Harry James'

My next ship was another Repair Ship, USS Amphion, homeported in Norfolk, Virginia. During this tour Lebanon became a trouble spot and we were sent over to repair our ships. We spent much time in Greece, Crete, Turkey, Cyprus and Lebanon, also visiting Gibraltar, France and Italy enroute. In Athens we toured the Acropolis and several of us attended a Greek "Wine Festival" held at a Byzantine Monastery" outside Athens. I then followed this with a solit tour - first at the Naval Air Facility, Sigonella, Sicily. I rode a transport from New York to Italy with stops in Gibraltar, Spain and Leghorn, Italy where I had lunch at a sidewalk cafe across the street from the Leaning Tower in Pisa. I disembarked at Naples and drove my car down to Taranto and caught a ferry across the Straits of Messina to Sicily. I flew back to the States for my last sea assignment on the USS Arneb. She was the re-supply ship for personnel wintering over in Antarctica - this made the last of the seven continents for me to visit. We made 2 trips into the ice from New Zealand where we had "Ice Breakers" to precede us into the "Frozen DEEP SOUTH". After our last trip in, we returned to Norfolk via Australia, New Zealand and the Panama Canal. During this cruise, I operated a "Ham Radio Station" aboard the ship and i'd contact other Hams all over the country & they'd make phone patches (collect) for us. We made about 300 or more calls that way and I stayed in touch with Jimmy, O'Lena and Edith as Dick had terminal cancer. He died after we left New Zealand and headed home. I was then assigned duty in Key West for my last tour which finished my 30 years. During this final tour, I was divorced on June 8th and Ann and I were married on June 13, 1964. Jimmy stayed with us his Senior year in High School and graduated from Key West High in 1965. Ann "Retired" 31 December 1965 and I retired from the U.S. Navy 1 February 1966.

After retiring, Ann and I moved to a mountain top retreat near Sparta, N.C., and after we got our Mobile Home fixed up for year-round living, I went to work near Elkin, N.C. as the Security Supervisor at the Sunbeam Electric Shaver Plant. A couple of years of that and I was asked to set up a credit bureau in Sparta and, after about 5 years of full time mountains, we decided that it was too cold and bought our present place in Melbourne and I then worked during our summer stay (about 6 months) in the mountains) as a salesman for Irwin-Chevrolet-Olds in Sparta and we'd spend our winters at our home in Melbourne. In 1979 I was diagnosed as having colon cancer so THAT DID IT. We decided we could get along very well with our Social Security plus Navy Retirement and we'd just travel and enjoy!! After more cancer operations, both of us having heart attacks and corrective surgery, we are still doing just that - only a little slower and a little less often, perhaps. We managed to visit all the 48 contiguous states accompanied by our two dogs, Chipper and Duchess). They both died at age 18 and are buried atop the mountain (just off the Blue Ridge Parkway) near Sparta.

Jim and Andi were married in 1973 and for about 7 years lived in the Washington, DC area. They were then transferred to Arizona and found that they liked it out there. After about 8 years (and many visits back and forth), Jim received a promotion and was transferred back east to New Jersey. They missed the better weather of Arizona and, since they had decided they'd like to retire in that area, they finagled a transfer back out there. They now live in Mesa (again), have a very nice house and 3 cats. We visited them for a week recently and have decided we'll no longer make that long drive but that any future visits will be made by train or plane.

I am seated to answer your welcome letter of the 4th of July would have answered sooner if it had been convenient. I was glad to hear you was all well, this leaves us all in usual health. We have had an usual wet summer. I have no news to write of interest, more than my brother Andrew Axsom is dead - died some 6 weeks ago. I remember last Tuesday 21 years ago - you left to go west - it seems to me a long time, but - I am glad the Lord spared our lives to meet in this world again, and should we not meet again in this world I trust we will all be prepared to meet in Heaven, then we know we will not part. Rose and Joe has just come in - they are well as usual. While you are receiving a mother's bountiful love please share a portion to your wife by kissing her and children for me. I would have told you that this country is wide awake in Rail Road matters. The road is being built just up the river on this side. They are making it quite lively blasting both rock and dirt. John says you told him to be a good boy and mind his mother and you would send him a present. He says he has been good boy and minded his mother and claims the present I am your affectionate mother

Dec. 28th 1880

Mr M. Sprinkle

Dear son I drop you a line to inform you that we received your letter the 25th Inst. which gave us great satisfaction to hear from you. Yet it is mortifying to hear of your bereavements by the loss of your child. But no doubt from the age you say it was when it left you your loss is its gain for we conclude that such it is that compose the Kingdom. So we should be resigned to the omnipotent disposer of all goods he chastises for good both sickness and death.

Here in this connection your mother wishes to know if you feel prepared to meet Thomas beyond the grave? By the course of naturewe have not long to stay here & we should try to prepare for a better world than this. I would be glad for you to come & see us soon. A visit to your mother county would be acceptable to all your connections. We are all on foot but not stout - I and mother both failing. I am troubled with a great deal with rheumatism not able to get about to do much. Thomas Sprinkle is very much afflicted with rheumatism. The rest of the family is well. Your Uncle Joseph Axsom is & has been laboring under disease of asthma & sometimes quite bad. We maised good crops in this section but we have had so far a hard winter. The snow has covered the ground for 8 days and it looks very much like the ---- would come.

I would like to hear a description of that country. I enclose Nancy's photograph taken about 2 years ago. I close by ascribing our love to you and wife Mary. Send us you and Mary's type. Write soon and often to your yet living parents

In the border conflict between Pennsylvania & Maryland the Germans on the west side of the Susquehanna were first told that their land was under the jurisdiction of Lord Baltimore. When they learned the truth, fifty-four of them signed a letter on Aug. 11, 1736, to the Governor of Maryland, repudiating his authority and announcing their alaegiance to the Penns. Michael Sprenckel was one of these, and as a consequence a warrant was issued on Oct. 21, 1736, "for contriving signing and publishing a seditious paper and writing against his Lordship and this government" - against each of these signers. Their names are preserved in Calvert Papers No. 717, in which his name appears "Michael Aringall." This peculiar spelling appears because the name was copied by a clerk in Maryland who was unfamiliar

was a private in the Sixth Class, Third Company (Captain Simon Coppenhäfer's), Second Battalion (Colonel William Rankin's), York County Militia within the period 1777-1779; within the same period he paid fines aggregating £37 10/ for non-performance of militia duty. 2 Member of the Second Class of inhabitants of Manchester Township, classified under an Act of Assembly passed in 1780, entitled "An Act to compleat the Quota of the Foederal Army": each class was "required to provide, in fifteen Days from this Date [January 30, 1781], one able-bodied Recruit for the Continental Army, to serve during the War, " under penalty of a fine of £15 specie (or £1125 Continental); this class defaulted. Private in the Seventh Class of Captain Reinhart Bott's (the First) Company, Third Battalion (Colonel Michael Smyser), York County Militia, within the period 1779-1783.4 One of a party of the York County Militia who apprehended British deserters and took them to Camp Security in York County, sometime in 1782 or 1783.⁵

CHAPTER LXVIII

Pioneers of the Upper Valley

In the tracings given of many pioneers, the writer confined his notices to such as properly belonged to the Lower Valley, known as Frederick *County. He will now briefly mention the names of pioneers who settled in the Shenandoah Valley chiefly South of the line between the Augusta and Frederick Counties, whose deeds were recorded in Orange County between the years This class of pioneers purchased large tracts from what has been called the Beverly Grant, which was issued 12th of August, 1736, to William Beverly of Essex County, Sir John Randolph of City of Williamsburg, Knight, Richard Randolph of Henrico County, and John Robinson of King and Queen, "for 118,491 acres, being in Orange beyond the mountains." This grant extended from the Augusta line Southward towards the head springs of the Shenandoah River. Prior to this settlement, there is no doubt but that the historic Lewis family had seated themselves in the lower section near what is generally known as Port Republic. Thomas Lewis, the pioneer, and several sons were there about 1733. He obtained his grant for a large tract of land. His sons, Andrew, William and Charles were settled near by. This family have their historic names associated with events mentioned in this volume. The pioneers who had deeds, represent a large class of the English, Scotch and Irish immigrations, who were not willing to contend with the Fairfax and Hite prospective litigations, on their arrival in the Lower Vailey, pressed further South beyond the Fairfax line, and began to settle all over the Valley South of a line from Swift Run Gap beyond the mountains North of Harrisonburg. Among this class a few names will be recognized as Germans, Hollanders, etc. John Lewis, William Cathey, Samuel Givens, George HutchinRobinson, James Davis, Daniel Mahahan, Patrick Campbell, Thomas Henderson, John Wilson, Wm. Michael Sprenckel was granted a license by Samuel Blunston, Esquire, agent for the Honorable the Proprietaries on April 6, 1734 to take up 500 acres west of the Susquehanna. Pursuant thereto he took up a tract of land in Manchester Township, York County. In the border conflict between Pennsylvania and Maryland the Germans west of the Susquehanna believed for a time that their land was under the jurisdiction of Lord Baltimore. When they were informed otherwise fifty-four of them signed a letter to the Governor of Maryland on August 11, 1736, repudiating his authority and acknowledging their allegiance to the Penns. Michael Sprenckel was one of these, and because of this action a Maryland warrant was issued on October 21, 1736 for the arrest of him and the others "for contriving signing and publishing a seditious paper and writing against his Lordship and this government."

Their names are preserved in Calvert Papers
No.717 in the Maryland Historical Society, in which his name
appears "Michael Aringall." This peculiar spelling appears
because the name was copied by a clerk in Maryland who was
unfamiliar with German signatures.

The date of his death is unknown, but it probably occurred in 1748, as an administration bond was filed for his estate at Lancaster in that year (York County had not yet been formed).

His widow, Margaret, married Henry Eberhart of Manchester Township and was living as late as 1765. He left among others nine minor children, of whom two were sick a long time and died in their minority, one child became blind with smallpox, and one was sick a long time but recovered after the father's death. The following issue are known:

In the border conflict between Pennsylvania & Maryland the Germans on the west side of the Susquehanna were first told that their land was under the jurisdiction of Lord Baltimore. When they learned the truth, fifty-four of them signed a letter on Aug. 11, 1736, to the Governor of Maryland, repudiating his authority and announcing their alaegiance to the Penns. Michael Sprenekel was one of these, and as a consequence a warrant was issued on Oct. 21, 1736, "for contriving signing and publishing a seditious paper and writing against his Lordship and this government" - against each of these signers. Their names are preserved in Calvert Papers No. 717, in which his name appears "Michael Aringall." This peculiar spelling appears because the name was copied by a clerk in Maryland who was unfamiliar

Michael Sprenckel was granted a license by Samuel Blunston, Esquire, agent for the Honorable the Proprietaries on April 6, 1734 to take up 500 acres west of the Susquehanna. Pursuant thereto he took up a tract of land in Manchester Township, York County. border conflict between Pennsylvania and Maryland the Germans west of the Susquehanna believed for a time that their land was under the jurisdiction of Lord Baltimore. When they were informed otherwise fifty-four of them signed a letter to the Governor of Maryland on August 11, 1736, repudiating his authority and acknowledging their allegiance to the Penns. Michael Sprenckel was one of these, and because of this action a Maryland warrant was issued on October 21, 1736 for the arrest of him and the others *for contriving signing and publishing a seditious paper and writing against his Lordship and this government."

Their names are preserved in Calvert Papers

No.717 in the Maryland Historical Society, in which his name
appears "Michael Aringall." This peculiar spelling appears
because the name was copied by a clerk in Maryland who was
unfamiliar with German signatures.

The date of his death is unknown, but it probably occurred in 1748, as an administration bond was filed for his estate at Lancaster in that year (York County had not yet been formed).

His widow, Margaret, married Henry Eberhart of Manchester Township and was living as late as 1765. He left among others nine minor children, of whom two were sick a long time and died in their minority, one child became blind with smallpox, and one was sick a long time but recovered after the father's death. The following issue are known:

-JONES-

If your name is Jones, you have the distinction of being named for one of the Disciples. That one closest of all to our Lord, St. John.

Before the legions of Rome pushed their way into the British Isles, the various peoples cared little for names as we know them. That which we now call 'nicknames' were usually given to individuals. Because they were uncivilized and worshipped local gods, they ofttimes were given the names of the gods they wished to please.

With the Conquest of Britain in about 55 B.C. the natives learned many Roman things. Later, during the latter days of the Invasion, approximately 79 A.D., Christian missionaries travelled with the army. As they converted the pagans to the new faith, the Christian priests insisted the old names of former gods be forgotten. However no person could live in a tribe or clan without a name, but what name should they adopt?

Transferring their loyalty to the new religion, they decided to adopt the names of the early Christian heroes, the Apostles, as their own. This is the reason most of the Apostles' names are found with great frequency in England.

Under the former method, when a child was born into a family, the god whom the parents wished to honor or appease was selected to give the child its name. Now this was impossible.

As in the case of the family whose new name was John, it was the case of adding the suffix 'son', or in Wales, a final 's', to the name John. Thus the name Johnson or Jones means 'the son of John'.

Through the years, the letter 'h', because it produced no sound of its own, was omitted in the spelling. Johns became Jones — the 'son of John'.

'John' was originally Hebrew because the Apostle was Hebrew, as were the other Apostles with one or two exceptions, so to trace the origin of the name to its very source, we must go to the old Hebrew language. In that ancient tongue the name John signified "Beloved, or Gracious". As Jones is but another form of John's son, it too means "Beloved".

Therefore, if you are a member of the very large Jones family, hold your head high, for you are named after one of the greatest men who ever walked this earth.







CHAPTER III

SETTLEMENT AND EARLY HISTORY BY RUTH BLACKWELDER

Associate Professor of History, Lenoir Rhyne College

Former Research Assistant in the Institute for Research in Social Science, University of North Carolina.

In 1740 only a few white families were scattered along the Hico (Hyco), the Eno, and the Haw rivers in the area that became Orange county. There were not twenty taxables in that region in 1748, but by 1751 Governor Gabriel Johnston reported that settlers were "flocking in," mostly from Pennsylvania. Alexander Mebane, Orange county's first sheriff, returned 1,113 tithables for the years 1752 and 1753, a figure which would indicate a total population of approximately 4,000 when the county was formed in 1752. By 1767 Orange had the largest population of any county in North Carolina.

The great migration from Pennsylvania to Piedmont Carolina came in the middle of the eighteenth century. Scotch-Irish and German immigrants, finding the price of land too high for them in Pennsylvania, journeyed southward along the "Great Wagon Road" through the Shenandoah valley to Carolina. From 1745 to 1760 land was granted along the many creeks and rivers in every part of Orange county. Grants on New Hope creek are recorded for Bladen county as early as 1745 and along Deep river in 1749. According to the records for Granville county there were land grants in northern Orange on the Hico river in 1748 and along the Dan river and the Hogan and County Line creeks in 1751. In central Orange grants on the Eno river were entered for the year 1751.

The Eno community, about seven miles north of Hillsboro, was the most distinctly Scotch-Irish settlement in the county. Scotch-Irish also lived east of the Haw river. One of the largest landowners in that area was Samuel Strudwick, an Englishman, who was granted land in the Haw Fields (Hawfields) to satisfy

William Blackwood's grant on Buffalo creek was entered in the land grant office in 1752; Gilbert Strayhorn's on Prestwood creek in 1755. Alexander Mebane, the first sheriff of the county, owned land along Cain creek in 1756 and James Hunter on Stinking Quarter and Sandy creeks in 1757. James Stockard's land was in the Back Creek section and William Montgomery's was on the Buckhorn. Marmaduke Kimbrough, who built the first courthouse for Orange county, entered his 640 acres on Pole Cat creek in 1752.

There were Scotch-Irish in eastern Orange—in the Little river and New Hope creek sections. Mark Morgan secured a land grant in the New Hope area as early as 1747, William Craig and Richard Caswell in 1756. Hogans, Blackwoods and Freelands also settled in that area. Charles White located in what is now Chatham county. The Scotch-Irish in what is now Guilford county organized Buffalo Presbyterian church in 1756. Although Cumberland county was the especial home of the Scotch Highlander, Highlanders also built homes in southern Orange, in what is now Chatham county.

Germans held the land west of the Haw river. The pioneers in that group were Lutherans. Ludwig Clapp's grant of 640 acres on the Alamance was recorded in 1752. Michael Holt's large acreage lay along the Great and Little Alamance. John Faust had land on Cain creek and Adam Trolinger on the west bank of the Haw river, near the present rallway crossing. Among the pioneer Germans were Christian Faust, Jacob Albright, Peter Sharp, Philip Snotherly and David Ephland (Efland). By 1773 there were so many Germans in western Orange that J. F. D. Smyth, an English traveler, experienced difficulty in finding anyone who understood his language in some areas west of Hillsboro.

There were other distinct settlements in Orange county. English emigrants from Virginia settled in northern Orange along the Hico river and County Line creek. "South Ireland" near Stoney creek, in present Alamance county, indicates the Irish element. Thomas Lloyd, one of the first representatives from Orange county to the general assembly, was foremost among the

IN THE NAME OF GOD, AMEN. I George Sprinkle, of the county of Stokes & State of North Carolina, being sick of body but of perfect mind & memory, do this 17th day of May in the year of our Lord 1810, do make and publish this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following; that is to say I will that after my decease my body be buried in a decent Christian manner and my funeral charges & just debts be paid out of my estate as also my just cre debts to be collected by my executor hereafter to be named.

And First, I give and bequeath unto my son George that part of my land beginning at a poplar on the river Longins corner running East to a corner

ginning at a poplar on the river Longins corner running East to a corner P.O., thence North to a branch, thence down said branch to the river, thence along the river to the beginning. Further, I will that my said som George pay an amount of his lands being worth more than that of my other sons the sum of eighty dollars to my wife & son Thomas as hereinafter specified. Secondly, I give to my son John that part of my land beginning at a branch on the river Georges corner aforesaid running said branch the dividing line between my said sons George & John to the old line thence North on said lime to where it will range with a crop fence that runs down the river from thence to run along exactly with said fence to the river from thence down the river to the beginning.

Thirdly, I give to my son Peter that part of my land beginning at the aforesaid crop fence on the river the aforesaid Johns corner running up the river to Michaels corner near the mouth of a Gutt, thence along said Michaels lime up the spring branch nearly a Northeast course to the old corner white oak, thence South along said old line to Johns corner aforesaid, thence West with a crop fence the dividing line between said John & Peter to the beginning on the river.

Seventhly, I give unto my daughter Cloe one bedstead with the bed furniture one cow & calf.

Eighthly, I will that all the remaining part of my estate be sold & five pounds in cash thereof be paid to my son Michael & the balance to be equally divided and distributed among my wife Elizabeth and my daughters Polly, Anny, & Cloe.

And Lastlt, I hereby make ordain nominate and appoint my beloved wife Elizabeth & my son Peter Executors of this my Last Will and Testament. In witness whereof I the said George Sprinkle have to the my Last Will and Testament set my hand & seal the day & year above written.

I constitute this to be my East Will and Testament in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty to which I appoint Thomas Sprinkle and my beloved wife as executors to execute this my Last Will, to wit, I give unto Jesse Sprinkle my son fifteen dollars.

Item. I give to George Sprinkle my son my rifle gun & shot pouch. Item. I give Michael Sprinkle my son my shotgun then leaving all that I possess in possession of my wife during her widowhood also desiring that each of my girls when marrying may have one feather bed & cow and calf given them. In regard to my lands when the youngest child come of age it is to be equally divided then cessed at its value by two good freeholders & then drawed for and each lot made equal by cash or other way amongst my sons then at my wifes death an equal division amongst all my children by a sail of public acction imvitruss. I hereunto sid my hand and fixt my seal December 22nd 1820.
